Welcome, golf fans, to the 79th playing of the Charles Schwab Challenge, Fort Worth, Texas in the South Central United States. That's where we are for the 24th regular season event of the PGA Tour season. Ned Michaels alongside James Nitties and Henni Zuel as we take a look at some of the storylines here. Opening round in Texas, 37 international players in the field. Fourteen times international players have hoisted the hardware so far this season on the PGA Tour, including the youngest, Karl Vilips, in the most experience in Ryan Fox. James, let's take a look at some of the earlier highlights from the day. Here's Joel Dahmen at the 13th.

[00:01:47] >> Only 186 yards today. One skipping through but there is a backstop there, and this gave it a shake. Straight in.

[00:02:01] >> There will healthy beverages.

[00:02:04] >> The most chilled of responses.

[00:02:07] >> And Jordan Spieth, nobody has earned more dollars in this tournament than Jordan Spieth. And, Henni, that was great.

[00:02:15] >> Isn't it always creative from Jordan Smith? It's a pleasure to watch. You never quite know what he's going to come up with, but you know it'll be something.

[00:02:22] >> And our leader, John Pak, 26-year-old, was a phenom coming out of the university system. But everybody looking up at Scottie Scheffler, the World number 1, who is on a heater looking for three consecutive wins. James.

[00:02:42] >> Boy, Scottie's holding it from off the green. He is a very dangerous man, especially from that far.

[00:02:50] >> John Pak looking for his first Top 10 of his career. Five birdies and an eagle, six fairways and 12 greens. And the peloton lining up behind him. Sixty-three, his lowest round on the PGA Tour.

[00:03:21] >> What a putt.

[00:03:36] >> Just 119. Yeah, I know they firm the greens, but this wind direction into out of the left, Scottie likes to wipe across it and just hit a leaky left to right. So, if he comes up short of this flag, only 1 yard from 119. You know, it's dangerous. That shouldn't be an issue. He's pretty good with the wedge, if you haven't noticed.

[00:04:10] >> At the 11th, Si Woo, long putter, split finger. And that goes down. So, after the double bogey at the 9th. Now, to Scottie.

[00:04:41] >> Kris Ventura for birdie. But look at the clouds in the background there, James.

[00:05:50] >> Griffin moves to 4-under par, his third birdie on the back nine. John Pak opens with 63 to take a three-shot lead over a group tied for second. Pak seeking his first career PGA Tour victory. The second round is next.

Welcome everyone to the 79th playing of the Charles Schwab Challenge. Ned Michaels, alongside James Nitties, Henni Zuel and Wayne Radar Riley down on the golf course for us. Fort Worth, Texas in the South Central United States, that's where we are for the 24th event in the regular season. Just 12 tournaments remain before we hit the playoffs. The clock is ticking, and so is the World number 1. Looking for three consecutive wins. Here at the 6th, his second shot yesterday. It was a little bit sporadic. He started with an eagle and a birdie, but gave up a couple coming home. And, James, how about Rickie Fowler today?

[00:07:38] >> And our current leader in a man, James, who you pegged a couple of weeks ago to keep an eye on. And sure enough, right at the top, Ben Griffin

[00:07:51] >> The 29-year-old, 66 yesterday, 63 today. Five Top 10s of this season, including that win in New Orleans with Andrew Novak. Take a look at the leaderboard. Matti Schmid, it was the putter, Henni, that we, again, addressed. If he could find one that worked, he might light it up. And here he is.

Six-under currently through 11, lining it up, trying to follow in the footsteps of Ben Griffin, who we all know the prowess of his putter, Matti Schmid, nine birdies on the back nine this week. He's 7-under on holes 10 to 18. Leads the field in strokes gain putting. And Harry Hall, couple of nice rounds from the big man. Matthew Wallace, new caddie relationship.

Henni said Ryder Cup as well. You got Olesen. He's another guy that's just outside the European possible selection to find his way into the Ryder Cup this year.

[00:11:01] >> That's Pak, and that's the ninth hole.

[00:11:04] >> Got loads of green to work with. Go on, run it up.

[00:11:17] >> Second hole in a row that we've seen Ryo playing from the fairway bunkers.

[00:11:24] >> Yeah. The key is to pick it clean, and contact sounded beautiful there. Just showing up in that result.

[00:12:33] >> Tracking. Tracking, tracking, tracking. Yes, sir. We were talking about the putter and the woes of the putter, but bogey-free on the back nine. Looking good.

[00:13:24] >> Remember that final round back in 20 23, the Cognizant Classic? He made 204 feet of putts in the final round alone. Needs birdies coming to the clubhouse. This would be a good one to get.

[00:13:53] >> And pardon me, I shortchanged him one. He was 1-over, not 2-over. Back to even now.

[00:14:19] >> This would suit up nicely for him, this hole location. Back left. And he delivers.

[00:14:27] >> Up to the green now with McIntyre's birdie try.

[00:14:35] >> Nicely done.

[00:14:43] >> Mackenzie Hughes must find one birdie in these last two, begging for it to go. I'll go on.

[00:14:51] >> Go on, go on, go on, go on.

[00:14:55] >> No, you didn't. Doesn't look like a whole lot here.

[00:15:14] >> Well, you just saw Spieth miss it to the right side. So, as we said, Kirk missed it on that left side from behind here. So, it's much straighter than these players are feeling. So can he take that information that he just saw and capitalize.

[00:15:38] >> With a birdie at the last, Fleetwood moves to 6-under par. Griffin and Schmid share the lead at 11-under, while Tommy Fleetwood is tied seventh, five shots back. The third round is next.

[00:16:04] >> The Charles Schwab Challenge. It was some 72 years ago today, May 24, 1953, that Ben Hogan fired a final round 67, went on to win by five shots, and for the fourth time hoisted, the hardware here at Colonial Country Club. It was also in that same season where the great Ben Hogan won the Triple Crown. He had come in, he had won his two prior events, the Masters and the Panamerican Open. Three consecutive wins, and he went on later that season, the victories at the United States Open, as well as the Open Championships. Scottie Scheffler is trying to fashion a similar legendary season, and he's making a move here on Saturday at the Charles Schwab Challenge. So glad to have your company. Ned Michaels, James Nitties here in the booth, alongside Henni Zuel and Wayne Radar Riley down on the fairways for us. And James, all kinds of storylines are coming at us fast and furious. We'll start with the leaders, Matti Schmid and Ben Griffin.

[00:17:10] >> Yeah, not a lot of experience at the top of the leaderboard. Obviously, Ben Griffin getting his first PGA Tour victory a couple weeks ago. And Matti Schmid rounding into form. The German hits it a long way off the tee. See he's putted great this week. And usually, that's a recipe for him to be at the top of the leaderboard, as we have seen. So, plenty of stories, including this man, Scottie Scheffler, the hottest man on the course.

[00:17:32] >> He barely made the cut. The cut came at even par. Scottie Scheffler, 1-over yesterday, but different ambitions today. Birdies on 1, and 2, 6, another at the 9th. And Henni here at the 10th from 161 yards.

[00:17:51] >> This is the yardage that we've been seeing him struggling. That's what we're used to seeing from Scottie Scheffler with the wedge with the 9-iron in hand, knocking it down, hitting it in close. So it's good to see him back to his best with both that and this club.

[00:18:03] >> He was 5-under through his first 10 holes. This for eagle, James, at 11.

[00:18:08] >> Well, he made that 17-footer we just saw. This was just under 15 feet. Once again, like Henni said, if he is putting well, he's very difficult guy to beat.

[00:18:19] >> Was 7-under through his first 11 holes. Did make a bogey at 12. And then, over at the 13, this was just a moment ago.

[00:18:28] >> Yeah, that front pin is something we haven't seen so far this week, but nicely judged.

[00:18:37] >> Seven fairways, nine greens, and 16 putts. It all adds up to a 6-under so far today, and he finds himself inside the Top 10.

[00:18:52] >> It's just the intimidation factor of Scottie Scheffler being on the leaderboard, where guys like Matti Schmid, Ben Griffin like, OK, here he comes again. Like I need to post as well. So a little outside pressure on them seeing that name.

[00:19:12] >> Opened with back to back birdies and a couple of nice 6 and 8 footers, did Madtti Schmid. This one all the way across the green at the 3rd.

[00:19:39] >> Sixteen. Back right hole location today. Hasn't been moving it great from left to right last couple holes, but back on track. It was never going to take long for Scheffler.

[00:19:53] >> Up to the green now with Scheffler's birdie chance.

[00:19:57] >> To get to 7-under. He's back.

[00:20:01] >> He never left. Barely made the cut just by one shot.

[00:20:12] >> Now, Pak. This is beautiful. He really has scrambled well over these opening few holes.

[00:20:24] >> Seventeenth with Scheffler.

[00:20:27] >> One-five-six, is he brave enough to hit it between the left-hand bunker and the flagstick with the wind out of the left?

[00:20:51] >> You hate to drop one after three birdies in a row.

[00:20:59] >> Oh, yes, what a save for Schmid.

[00:21:02] >> Wow.

[00:21:02] >> How good is he on the greens right now?

[00:21:12] >> Really should make it. We'll expect to. I expect him to.

[00:21:29] >> Never in doubt, Scottie Scheffler. The 7th, Emiliano.

[00:21:50] >> Absolute beauty that, wasn't it?

[00:21:53][Applause] Same.

[00:22:01] >> That round could have been anything from Scottie Scheffler, especially after the birdie eagle at the turn.

[00:22:21] >> Scottie Scheffler weren't sure if he was going to make the cut, James. He did. He just snuck in after a Friday 1-over par. He was 1-under to start the third round. And he did what you're supposed to do at the 1st, made a birdie.

[00:22:33] >> It's all about getting off to that quick start. Birdie at 1st, birdie at the 2nd. This was his second at the 2nd. It's a par 4, folks, by the way, 372 yards. And then, Henni, at the 6.

[00:22:56] >> Yeah, this is lovely. We were eagerly awaiting to see what the wedge play would be like today. And he didn't disappoint us.

[00:23:05] >> Right about here, you started thinking, well, he is the number 1 player in the world. Maybe, just maybe, he could do something special. And as soon as this shot landed, we thought, OK, let's get settled in. Let's watch the best do it.

[00:23:21] >> Yeah. Even his playing partners there on the green are looking back at him going, how did you just do that from there? That's ridiculous. It was ridiculous.

[00:23:32] >> Just perfect pace. That's when he's dangerous. Getting that length of putts to go.

[00:23:39] >> Made the turn at 4-under. And then, his approach at the 10.

[00:23:45] >> Yes, just what we're used to seeing from him. Normal service has been resumed. Rounds 1 and 2, we didn't, missing out to the left-hand side. And this is sort of what you expect, to just to shrug of your shoulders going, yeah, that's Scottie being Scottie.

[00:23:59] >> Five-under through 10. And then, this one for eagle. Seven-under through his first 11 holes was Scottie Scheffler. It ended 64, 6-under par, a couple of drop shots at 12 and 13, and then another at the 18th.

[00:24:23] >> Isn't this course perfect for his game? Accurate off the tee. Great mid iron player. Look out.

[00:24:32] >> Have we got an ace?

[00:24:34] >> Thought about it. Looking on the way past. Bob. Rolling one in. Pouring one in. Lovely, lovely pace.

[00:24:56] >> Griffin for birdie.

[00:25:06] >> Yes, sir. That is huge, especially from the double bogey. bogey. He's been trying to work his way back.

[00:26:04] >> If there's a man who's due to have one go down, it's Akshay Bhatia. He has just burned increased edges all day long.

[00:26:13] >> And he's still right there. He's only five shots back. Gets this to go, turn it into four, possibly pick up one or two coming home. And he's playing good enough. He just can't convert from this length.

[00:26:50] >> Rickie for birdie. Good opportunity. Nicely done in execution. Back up into the wind.

[00:27:12] >> Ben Griffin sits atop the leaderboard with Matti Schmid. Griffin looking for his second win of the season, while Schmid is looking for his first on the PGA Tour. The final round is next.

[00:28:14] >> Sixty-six years ago this month, the great Ben Hogan claimed his fifth victory at Colonial Country Club, and the last of his legendary 64 PGA Tour titles. His legacy still looms large, especially here in Texas, as we welcome you in, golf fans, to the 79th playing of the Charles Schwab Challenge. Fort Worth, Texas, in the South Central part of the United States, that where we are. Just 12 events remain in the regular season on the PGA Tour. The pressure is ratcheting up. Sense of urgency, you can feel it across the entire golf course. Ned Michaels and James Nitties, alongside Henny Zuel and Wayne Radar Riley down on the fairways for us as we approach what promises to be a wild and windy Sunday here in the Lone Star State. The storylines, well, there are plenty of them. Ben Griffin, 13-under with a win, looking to become just the fourth multiple winner this season. Of course, it would be his first individual title, the winner in New Orleans with Andrew Novak. And Scottie Scheffler, as we catch up with the live action yesterday, He had it rolling. Seven-under through 11.

[00:29:43] >> Beautiful touch there from Scottie. Birdie to open the account. Straight off the bat on the 1st.

[00:29:52] >> So that's where it stands. Matti Schmid and Ben Griffin. Can the young German, looking for his first victory on the PGA Tour, his first professional victory of note. He was two times a European Amateur champion. Played his collegiate golf at Louisville, in Kentucky, here in the United States. Somewhat unheralded, but he comes in playing well. Two Top 10s in his past three events. The putter's been running hot, Henni.

[00:30:16] >> It has indeed. Wasn't it through five holes yesterday that he had one putt on each green? It was unreal. I am so fascinated to see how he handles the Sunday pressure, because yesterday, yes, he was in the final group, but a lot of the fans were with some Scottie up ahead. He was going neck and neck with Ben Griffin. Bit of a shaky finish, but did ultimately come out on top. And so, I'm looking forward to seeing how he starts off today.

[00:30:40] >> One of the hallmarks of this event and of this golf course, especially after the redesign just a couple of seasons ago, in the morning, you can do some scoring. A little bit softer, the greens more receptive, a more benign, benevolent golf course. In the afternoon, after it's baked out in the Texas winds in the heavy heat of the sun, the golf course gets some fire in its belly. And we saw it as the leaders were coming to the clubhouse yesterday afternoon.

[00:31:06] >> It really does. And twofold. One, it puts so much more pressure on from the tee because you know you have to hit the fairway in order to access some of these tucked away Sunday pins. And two, going to see a lot of players have a long chat with their caddies about where the wind is as we progress into this final round.

[00:31:26] >> We saw it yesterday. Ben Griffin, Matti Schmid, they both birdied the first couple of holes. Matter of fact, for Schmid, it was the first three holes.

[00:31:38] >> Now, up to the green for Griffin's eagle try at the 1st.

[00:31:45] >> Forty-six as welcome in Wayne Radar Riley. He'll be with this group the rest of the way.

[00:31:51] >> Down the hill. It doesn't want to move a whole heap. It must want to go a little from right to left towards that front of the green. Good start that.

[00:32:02] >> Yesterday afternoon, the winds picked up, the golf course was ornery.

[00:32:13] >> Yeah, it's a little -- It's windy and it's very hot once more. And this wind's up earlier than it has been the previous three days. So it's going to be tough to make birdies out here with the pin placements they plant out there on a Sunday.

[00:32:36] >> Bud Cauley all the way across the green at 5th.

[00:32:42] >> Hurry, hurry. Yeah. How good do those ones feel?

[00:32:51] >> Nearly at the clubhead. It's hard to get a lot of momentum, a lot of power.

[00:33:00] >> I hope he hits it close for you, Henni. Look at this.

[00:33:05] >> OK, it was all worth it. I take it all back. Take it all back. What do I know?

[00:33:15] >> The par 5, our first look at the 11th. That's Vince Whaley. He was one of those players who drove the second green earlier today. A chance for another eagle.

[00:33:25] >> Yeah. It's one of the longest putts you're going to find on the golf course. Go on.

[00:33:42] >> Tommy.

[00:33:43] >> For birdie off his right-hand side. Come on. There we go. Tommy gets up to tied third, 9-under, blemish free. He's a man who knows how to handle the wind. He could be our player that breaks out of that pack.

[00:34:03] >> Left to right and quick at the hole.

[00:34:06] >> Go on, go on. Yeah. Rickie needed something after a couple of drop shots. And what a bounce back on the 5th as well. Making the fans very happy indeed.

[00:34:27] >> Going to have to land this short.

[00:34:31] >> Scottish bump.

[00:34:33] >> Perfect.

[00:34:39] >> Up to the green with Griffin's par save. He'll surrender one. Back to 15-under.

[00:34:54] >> Well, we are going to flop it about halfway, let it run out, just like that. Come on. Come, come, come. Yeah. Tommy Fleetwood makes it into double digits. Ben Griffin just dropped one.

[00:44:42] >> Yeah. Well, I can't believe he's -- Even if he's thinking about bumping it, I can't see that. He'll be taking this upstairs. So easy to leave it short. Still in the Bermuda. And easier to knock this 20 pass down the hill, past the flag position.

[00:45:22] >> At 18. Can Scheffler finish with a birdie? Not to be.

[00:45:37] >> Inside right. That's all I got. Can he do it again? Can he save another par? Not to be.

[00:46:02] >> This is - It doesn't want to move a lot down this hill. It's really quick. He'd like this length up the hill, not down. But he really should make it.

[00:46:18] >> Can he overcome the nerves? Right in the heart.

[00:46:22] >> Didn't shy away. Confident stroke.

[00:46:24] >> As we're working our way down to the final two holes, Tommy Fleetwood made an improbable birdie on the last. Finds himself in a tie for fourth. A 68 for Tommy today.

[00:46:52] >> Now, he's taking them.

[00:50:33] >> The shot of his life. He hasn't been able to get it inside 10 feet from around the greens today. He struggled.

[00:50:41] >> Matti Schmid. Watch it again. It was magic.

[00:50:45] >> And destiny. I think that hit Ben Griffin's marker as well as it went.

[00:51:07] >> Well, take a breath. Take a minute to collect yourself. If you're Ben Griffin, you saw the wry smile that he flashed towards Matti Schmid after he improbably holed it out for birdie at the final frame. For the win.

[00:51:37] >> He's got it. The 29-year-old from North Carolina and the Southeast of the United States, who now lives in St. Simons Island, is a winner all by himself. The second time he's gone to victory lane this season. And so hard to imagine, 4 years ago he was out of the game. He had taken a job as a loan officer, wasn't even thinking about playing on the PGA Tour. And now, look where he is. In the FedExCup standings, he is fifth. Guts all day long from Ben Griffin until the very last stroke. And he puts his name next to the greats, Ben Hogan and Trevino.
