[00:00:26] >> The PGA Tour is proud to bring you the season-long race for the FedExCup. Now, coverage of the 2025 ISCO Championship.

[00:00:42] >> From the Commonwealth of Kentucky, played for the first time at Hurstbourne Country Club in Louisville. It's moved around this great state and will continue to in the years to come. Normal conditions for July with temperatures in the high 80s. With great veterans of the game, Rob Lee and Dame Laura Davies, I'm Taylor Zarzour. Billy Ray Brown and Tripp Isenhour will be on the course for us all afternoon.

[00:01:18] >> Let's take a look at some early highlights here, Rob, beginning with Paul Peterson bunkered at the 11th.

[00:01:28] >> Look like he might struggle. Not really. What a start. What a way to keep going. Short game skills. Lovely.

[00:01:35] >> A 67 for the American. The German, Thomas Rosenmuller, Laura.

[00:01:42] >> Little birdie down the hill, left to right, and just enough on it.

[00:01:46] >> Sixty-five for the man from Germany. Everyone is chasing Chan Kim. This a long birdie putt at the 15th.

[00:01:55] >> He had a day. He had a day. Seven-under par at this stage. And if you're going to shoot what he shot, putts like this have to go in.

[00:02:06] >> Calls Arizona home, originally from South Korea. This for birdie at 17.

[00:02:11] >> Yeah, little bit up the hill, left to right again. And as Rob just said, you make your fair share on a day like today.

[00:02:19] >> Well, 9-under is the course record. He had a chance for birdie at the last. This would have been the tournament record, tying the tournament record with a 60.

[00:02:28] >> He leaves it short. But it is the course record at Hurstbourne Country Club with a 61.

[00:02:41] >> And just a little while ago, Cameron Champ at the bunker at the drivable 12th.

[00:02:51] >> Down the hill, little bit of sand. Chunk and run and pick it out for two. That changes his outlook on Day 1, Cameron Champ. Little better late. Needs to be.

[00:03:01] >> Get him to 4-under. He did just make bogey at the 13th and drop back to 3-under. Currently tied for eighth with the man that finished second last week, Emiliano Grillo. And others, everyone chasing Kim, whose lead is four at the moment. Lowest score in the course belongs to the American, Peter Malnati.

[00:03:20] >> Here's Gordon Sargent. After great play a couple of years ago in college, it secured his playing privileges on the PGA Tour. A 67 for the man that just recently turned

pro, Josh Teater, one of the hosts in Kentucky, shoot 68. We were talking about this 10th edition of the tournament. He was over in Lexington for many years and has moved over to the world famous horse track, Churchill Downs, just a couple of miles down the street in Louisville. And it is truly a world class field. It's great what the PGA Tour and the DP World Tour are doing, Laura, as they're sharing playing privileges in a few tournaments. In fact, two tournaments this week.

[00:03:58] >> Yeah, it's great. It just gives these guys a chance to come over here. And if they get hot on this given week, it can really progress their careers. So it's really nice to see.

[00:04:11] >> So go back to the 9th.

[00:04:12] >> Koivun, can he dial one in? Fabulous. There's a birdie for him.

[00:04:19] >> Koivun gets to 2-under as we head to the 10th. Suber playing his third from the bunker.

[00:04:25] >> This is strict. And that was Suber. Superb from Suber.

[00:04:36] >> Eagle.

[00:04:44] >> S.H. Kim here. This looks a little bit downhill. We've seen it from the other angle. Fair bit of right to left. Turn, turn, turn, and in. There you go. You don't have to hit it close after all. Very good.

[00:05:05] >> Patton Kizzire has found the fairway at 16. He's level par. That's all right. Just sneak a couple before the turn. Well, there's one. By far the best wedge shot we've seen.

[00:05:24] >> Kizzire gets to 1-under.

[00:05:29] >> Fisk, he's found the fairway at the 12th. Just a little stab forward with a lob wedge. And there's signs that these greens are becoming very firm. Last hour or so. That's a wonderful shot.

[00:05:47] >> Fisk gets to 4-under par as we look high above Hurstbourne Country Club.

[00:05:51] >> S.H. Kim, his second to this 15th. Probably around about the 145 mark, you'd have thought. And he's turned it, just visually, this hole's got them. That front pins making them all very wary.

[00:06:04] >> S.H. Kim. He's a little bit rattled because it was all going so smoothly. Now, he's starting to give back some shots to the course. It's going to break to his right. Great looking putt. How about that? There's no way he's standing over that putt thinking, I'll try and knock this in. I'll try and hit a nice putt and get it close, and walks off with a birdie. He was disgusted with his second. Pulled it 20 yards left and writes down the three on the card. Back to minus-4.

[00:06:42] >> We've seen an awful lot of Lanto Griffin today, but this is the 9th green. And a putt to square things up. Oh, yeah. Heard the noise. The best noise in the world.

[00:06:57] >> Nice to do that on your final hole. All square with the links.

[00:07:10] >> Let's take a look at the leaderboard, with Kim at the top after a 9-under 61.

[00:07:18] >> All these guys that we've watched this afternoon will be out early tomorrow morning in, you would think, somewhat softer conditions.

[00:07:28] >> Yeah, without a doubt. They're going to be thinking, right, I want to do -- They're obviously, well say obviously, they're probably not going to shoot 61, but they'll be thinking 64, 65s, well in their grasp.

[00:07:39] >> This is like old school golf because the greens deteriorate during the afternoon. You come out in the morning, you got the best chance of shooting a low score. That's what it used to be like. Nowadays, the agronomy is so amazing that you can go out in the afternoon without fear. It's very rare you see a bit of chew like this.

[00:07:55] >> Big differences.

[00:07:55] >> Yeah, it's very rare.

[00:08:00] >> First time ever at Hurstbourne Country Club on the PGA Tour in Louisville for the ISCO Championship. Expect similar conditions again tomorrow. Look forward to.

[00:08:10] >> Yeah, it should be good. Looking forward to seeing all these birdies again.

[00:08:14] >> Looking forward to tomorrow, Rob. Get to see some of the best in the game tomorrow afternoon.

[00:08:18] >> Yeah. And I'm looking forward to watching Shinkwin and Ayora's progress tomorrow because they played in the other half of the draw. We will catch them on Friday.

[00:08:29] >> Round 2 is next.

[00:08:38] >> Played for the first time at Hurstbourne Country Club in Louisville, Kentucky. The Commonwealth of Kentucky has been hosting this tournament each year. Was in Lexington for many years, and now has moved over to this hot portion of the state. Temperatures north of 90 degrees Fahrenheit with little wind.

[00:09:01] >> Got a great crew here this week. Rob Lee is one all over the world. Laura Davies is one of the greatest of all time. I'm Taylor Zarzour. Billy Ray Brown and Tripp Isenhour are on the course for us. And Dame Laura Davies, let's take a look at some of the highlights from earlier today. This is Rico Hoey playing his second into the 15th.

[00:09:22] >> Yup, tough hole yesterday, the 15th. Not easy to get it in close to that front pin. But to the back pin today, you'll see a lot more shots like that.

[00:09:32] >> Hoey is currently at 5-under. He's tied for fifth. Here's Cameron Champ putting for birdie at the 9th, Rob.

[00:09:38] >> Yeah, good to see him with a bit of form with that club that's not always behaving itself as well as he would like. Two good days for Cameron Champ. Poised for the weekend.

[00:09:47] >> Four-under, and currently four off the lead. Kris Ventura for birdie at 13. Pours that one in. Ventura now is 6-under par.

[00:10:00] >> One of the top players, at least from a career standpoint in the field this week. His four-time PGA Tour winner. Kevin Kisner.

[00:10:09] >> Tremendous performance really. No form whatsoever coming into this event, but this course sort of suits someone who can find fairways and find greens. And that is Kiz when he's playing his best.

[00:10:18] >> He's tied for fifth at 5-under par. Paul Peterson putting for birdie at 11.

[00:10:23] >> Yup. You've got to putt well around here because it's not easy to hit all the greens. The fairways are tight. And that was a beautiful effort.

[00:10:30] >> Peterson is out there. We'll get to watch Paul this afternoon. And watch out for Beau Hossler. Off to a great start in this second round. That of birdie at the 5th. And then just a little while ago, Hossler playing this for his third into the 7th.

[00:10:50] >> Yeah, chip and run all the way up the green. We've got a lot more back pins today than we had yesterday, and I think they'll be easier with the fast greens. And that is just perfect touch.

[00:10:59] >> And Hossler now is 7-under, just one shot off the lead. Chan Kim's lead was four after Thursday. It's now just one. Ventura with the best round of the day this morning, a 64. Kentucky's own Josh Teater right there in the mix at 5-under par. Great bounce back by Skinns today. Gordon Sargent just turned professional. He's 4-under through 7.

[00:11:30] >> Head to the 10th.

[00:11:32] >> And that is a bonus. A Brun bonus at 10. All these players are going to make a birdie on.

[00:11:41] >> Julien Brun now 1-under par, and a smile.

[00:11:45] >> Let's go to Chan Kim at 4. All accounts, he's driven it to here. And that's fiery. What a break that is. Oh, stop it. That is going off the back of the green.

[00:12:04][ Applause ]

[00:12:09] >> Sure is.

[00:12:10] >> From what we saw, that's an eagle two.

[00:12:13] >> You know, sometimes, it's just your week. And he was struggling, let's be honest.

[00:12:18] >> At the 14th with Silverman now playing his second from the rough.

[00:12:29] >> One hundred fifty-nine yards. That'll move him back to even par.

[00:12:53] >> Silverman going the right way of late at even par. He could do with a birdie here. And I would suggest that's exactly what he's done. Brilliant pitch.

[00:13:03] >> Silverman gets to 1-under.

[00:13:04] >> Now, Hubbard, this is a decent chance. He hasn't got to worry about pace. Down the hill. Just to get give himself a bit of leeway, and in. Cracker. And he's got the gallery behind him as well.

[00:13:17] >> And they're not drinking Mountain Dew, are they?

[00:13:21] >> No. Yeah.

[00:13:22] >> Maybe a bit of Moonshine. Who knows?

[00:13:25] >> It's Friday afternoon at the ISCO.

[00:13:28] >> At the 15th with Brown playing his second from the fairway. That's left for birdie.

[00:13:50] >> Hamish, he hit it in closer for this group. In she goes. So he's going along very nicely indeed. Look at that. Nice card. Five birdies. Just the one bogey.

[00:14:10] >> No problems for Springer. That's a birdie. So he's minus-4. Amongst the best here this week so far over the first two rounds, Hayden Springer.

[00:14:18] >> At the 8th with our leader now, Kim playing his third from the rough.

[00:14:28] >> Kim, so fast. This is only just got to get on the green. It'll tiptoe. Played that unbelievably well. Get in.

[00:14:42] >> Oh, my goodness.

[00:14:43] >> How about that? Absolutely ludicrous. He's had two brucy bonuses today. One was that the chippy was going to miss the green with. It hit the pin and went in. That one shy with the second. Unbelievably difficult chip shot, and he holes it.

[00:14:58] >> When he came to the third hole, he trailed by one.

[00:15:01] >> When he teed off on 10, he led by four. Got to 3, trailed by one. Now, he's going to 9 and leads by four again.

[00:15:10] >> Two miracles.

[00:15:11] >> Very much so. But sometimes, you need that. Just -- I mean, it's still got a huge weekend ahead of him.

[00:15:18] >> At the last, it's Purcell.

[00:15:27] >> Par to make it through. Easy. Yeah, well done.

[00:15:30] >> Well done. So fiery.

[00:15:31] >> That's a scary shot with a wedge.

[00:15:35] >> Beautiful look at the clubhouse as we head back to 18 with Purcell putting for birdie.

[00:15:46] >> Big putt at the last there. Ensuring a cut made this week. Conor Purcell to make birdie at the last to get in.

[00:16:07] >> Thornberry.

[00:16:08] >> Can he reach? Get there in. That gets him to 3-under par. He's thrown his hat in the ring.

[00:16:16] >> Braden also was a terrific amateur player.

[00:16:23] >> At 18, Gordon.

[00:16:26] >> Seen a couple of players make this putt. And there's another.

[00:16:36] >> Now, tied for 15th through 36 holes in the ISCO Championship.

[00:16:46] >> And Chandler for birdie. In she goes.

[00:16:54] >> That's a much more friendly pin position than the one they had yesterday.

[00:16:58] >> At the 17th with Ayora putting for birdie.

[00:17:07] >> Go on, tumble in. Yes. Well done. Did he ever need that?

[00:17:20] >> Like Hamish Brown, he's now even par.

[00:17:24] >> That's last second shot to this back pin. We've seen lots of birdies this afternoon. There's been 39 birdies on this hole. Not surprising. They've got a shot. Well, you might well see the 40th in a minute.

[00:17:40] >> At the 16th with Chandler putting for birdie.

[00:17:46] >> To 2-under par.

[00:18:03] >> This is, you know, for the normal run of tournaments, this is quite rare that there's this much jeopardy in the closing holes.

[00:18:11] >> OK. Del Solar remains at even or, excuse me, gets to even with that birdie.

[00:18:20] >> Let's go back to the 16th. Lengthening shadows. And this is Cone's birdie attempt. Excellent. Really good. Just keep the wolves at bay with that.

[00:18:40] >> Yup.

[00:18:40] >> Challenging conditions, Laura, through 36 holes.

[00:18:43] >> Yeah, very, very difficult. All the holes that you'd be having to go, a lot of dog legs out there. Hard to keep it in the fairway. And as soon as you miss the fairway around

here, you're going to miss the green. And then, we've seen all sorts of chaos around the greens.

[00:18:58] >> Chasers tomorrow try to apply the pressure to Chan Kim.

[00:19:03] >> You know, what is pressure with the scoring like it is? What score is pressure? Sixty-eight, 2-under is a really good knock if you're anywhere near the lead, or 6-under par, 5-under par.

[00:19:13] >> Well, 6 or 7-under could lead at the end of tomorrow.

[00:19:15] >> Yeah, easily.

[00:19:15] >> I'm not saying anything against Chan. He's doing what he's got to do. But it's not easy on this course to have that big lead. It can disappear in a jiffy.

[00:19:22] >> Yeah, I agree 100%.

[00:19:25] >> Going into the week, I did not have the ISCO Championship being more challenging in relation to par than the Genesis Scottish Open. But here we are through 36 holes. Looking forward to being with you tomorrow afternoon for the third round.

[00:19:42] >> Round 3 is next.

[00:19:51] >> From the great state of Kentucky in the United States of America, played in Louisville for the first time at Hurstbourne Country Club. Eighty-eight degrees. We did have some storms to deal with earlier today. That delayed play by an hour and 36 minutes. And there's another one on its way. It should be in the Louisville area in the next couple of hours. Chan Kim carried a five shot lead into the third round. He tees off in 25 minutes, playing with Vince Whaley, Kris Ventura, and Thomas Rosenmueller right before him. And look at the amateur, Jackson Koivun, 4-under through 10 holes on his round. Tied for fifth at 5-under par in total.

[00:20:48] >> At the 2nd with Peterson playing his second from the fairway.

[00:20:51] >> And that is a very nice approach. And that shows that a bit of water has fallen on the golf course because, yesterday, that would have bounced through the back of the green.

[00:21:04] >> Conor Purcell putting for birdie. Purcell knocks that in through 16 holes. It's a good round, at least a good second side going for Purcell with two holes remaining.

[00:21:17] >> This is Peterson after a lovely approach at the 2nd. And that's three very nice shots early doors. So quickly skips along to minus-6. Tied for second. Ideal start.

[00:21:34] >> At the 8th with Koivun putting for birdie. He gets to 5-under. At the 13th now. Scott Piercy, his tee shot at the par 3.

[00:21:51] >> Can he get one in there close? Yeah, he's landed it beautifully. Really good stuff that from Piercy.

[00:22:01] >> This is Chad Ramey of the 12th. And pouring that one in. So that's a very nice three. Nice little comeback after being over par through most of his front nine. Now under for the day.

[00:22:20] >> Pretty straightforward putt. This just down the hill. Tiny bit of right to left. Topple it in that front door. A bit like that. Well done. Really well played hole for Scott. Balances the books.

[00:22:32] >> Let's go forward to 14.

[00:22:35] >> Yeah, this is Ben Kohles for a birdie who's over par. He gets half that if he knocks this in. Got to get there. Go. Well done. Try and get a little bit of a good feeling before he gets to the clubhouse. Maybe pinch one more. Tough day again.

[00:22:56] >> And now, back to the 2nd after a terrific par at the 1st here. Skinns barely in the fairway at 2.

[00:23:04] >> And this is perfect. This is absolutely perfect. What a start.

[00:23:13] >> Skinns gets to 6-under.

[00:23:15] >> Trevor Cone at 7.

[00:23:18] >> Nothing much to this. Yeah, brushes that in. Welcome birdie for him. Gets to 4-under. Bit of a mixed bag.

[00:23:26] >> It's very hard to go bogey-free around this golf course the way it is. You're going to see some blue and red on the cards.

[00:23:33] >> Head to the 8th. Merritt for birdie.

[00:23:41] >> That was never anywhere else. That was so pure. Not many players use a heel shafted putter with a lot of toe swing. Very, very rare out in the tour these days. But he does.

[00:23:52] >> Jackson Koivun.

[00:24:04] >> A lovely tee shot and a lovely pitch. Had half a look in that when it went by.

[00:24:10] >> List at the 8th putting for birdie.

[00:24:17] >> Luke List, easy as you like. That's a day out in the golf course, that is. No mistakes. And 3-under through eight. Lovely drive. Lovely pitch for Koivun, the hot man on the golf course. And for another birdie. Go on. Yeah, that's it. World's number 1 amateur going back to school, so he says.

[00:24:42] >> Up ahead now, Rico Hoey missed the fairway.

[00:24:45] >> He's Mr. Fairway. It's actually a very good line into this pin, running just over 80 yards. And he said it, 80 yards. Great shot.

[00:24:58] >> Gordon at the 7th putting for eagle.



[00:25:06] >> Gordon for eagle, and in. Wow, very nice.

[00:25:11] >> Rico Hoey, terrific shot from the left rough. Hit to perfection. Here's Whaley.

[00:25:34] >> That's OK though. He'll probably, I imagine, putt that one as well.

[00:25:40] >> To 16.

[00:25:44] >> Another tight flag. Front right to the left side. And that looks like it's very good news.

[00:25:54] >> And now, Whaley for birdie. He grabs second alone with that putt. Josh Teater, Lexington, Kentucky native, playing in his home state. Yeah, there you go. He has a bunch of fans out there called Teater's Troops. This is eighth start in this tournament. One on the Korn Ferry Tour earlier this year at the age of 46.

[00:26:28] >> At 13, Marcus Armitage. Yeah, he's had a couple of long putts in the last few holes. It just be trying to judge this one. Just dead weight as he hit it. He has. Well, that is a bonus. He gets back to level par.

[00:26:51] >> Eighth hole. I can drive this. You can't see anything from the tee box of the green. The blind faith over the top of the cuts of trees, and then get a nice bounce. Now, where is this going? It's spectacular.

[00:27:09] >> Springer gets to 6-under from there.

[00:27:11] >> I really don't want to hit this club here. So --

[00:27:16] >> Right here, glove. About six paces behind the pin is the bottom of that slope.

[00:27:25] >> OK.

[00:27:25] >> Yeah, two gloves having a go. This starts out well right. Using that wind. This is coming in. It's a big old bounce. Go on, up you come. Not that big. Sorry, Tommy.

[00:27:46] >> Vince Whaley on the green now, sizing up the scoring opportunity.

[00:27:59] >> It's a very good chance. It's going to move fractionally from his left. Depends how hard he hits it. If he's a dying putter, then could maybe put it as much as a ball outside.

[00:28:19] >> To move to 7-under.

[00:28:25] >> Well done.

[00:28:26] >> Someone's got to seven.

[00:28:42] >> I jinxed him on that tee shot, didn't I? Come on, get it up and down at very least. Or get a two. The tee shot deserved it.

[00:28:54] >> Gainey gets to 3-under par as we go down to the clubhouse for an update on the weather.

[00:28:58] >> I'm here with Chief Referee Orlando Pope. And Orlando, just lay it out for us. Where are we right now?

[00:29:06] >> Right now, we got a little unlucky with the first storm. It was a pop up shower, pop up thunderstorm. So we kind of got unlucky. We had to stop. But now, we have a significant line coming in, and it's going to put us down for a little while. An hour, maybe more than an hour. And the back edge is actually weakening a little bit. But it's coming right down. We have to stop play and get them off the golf course.

[00:29:26] >> What are the contingency plans if you don't get out tonight or if you do going into tomorrow?

[00:29:32] >> So going in tomorrow, if we can get them back out, at least for maybe an hour to get some holes in, or half an hour, whatever holes we can get in, we'll finish Round 3 up early in the morning. And then, the plan is to go off two tees and threes and finish by 7:00 o' clock tomorrow.

[00:29:49] >> It's hard to see anyone putting a run on him. He has to bring them back in with a chance because this golf course is not a course where you're going to make loads of birdies. Even if they do get some rain later on tonight, possibly after they finish their third round or most of their third round, it's going to be very hard to catch him.

[00:30:06] >> You just saw the top ranked amateur player in the game, Jackson Koivun. Just three holes remaining in his third round, and he is currently tied for fourth. Whaley playing with Kim is in second at 7-under. List alone in third right now at 6-under. All these other players you see still have holes remaining, except for Mouw, who's in.

[00:30:26] >> It's in Kim's hands. If he falls today, if he throws some shots back at the golf course, he could bring another 20 players into this. If he continues to do what he's doing, and that is when he gets in trouble, get out of it nicely, he's going to be a hard man to catch.

[00:30:42] >> The final round is next.

[00:31:22] >> Played in the State of Kentucky here in the United States of America for the first time at Hurstbourne Country Club in Louisville, Kentucky. And we have a nice final Sunday here for you after weather was a factor on Saturday. In fact, the third round had to be completed this morning. We're in the final round now. Dame Laura Davies, Rob Lee, Taylor Zarzour with you. Billy Ray Brown and Tripp Isenhour on the course. And we have a special round going right now. William Mouw is red hot on the golf course. Here he is at the 11th.

[00:32:03] >> After a fantastic front nine of being 5-under par, the birdie just kept on coming.

[00:32:08] >> Mouw was outside the Top 30 yesterday. And then, this at 13 gave him the outright lead.

[00:32:15] >> Another perfect putt right in the middle.

[00:32:18] >> Getting out in front of the leaders, started the round tied for 21st, 8-under through his first 16. Can anyone catch him?

[00:32:29] >> And here's the leader, 17 tee. Playing at 221 today. So it's been hard all week. This hole third hardest. That is an absolute stunning shot.

[00:32:54] >> Now, this is makeable. He wants to be careful. It's pretty quick. Looks like he's aiming quite well outside the left lip. I'm not sure he's hit it. Yes, he has. Yes, he has. What a round this is. Nine-under par walking to the 18th tee. That's for the day, 10-under for the tournament. Four shot lead.

[00:33:16] >> He's going to have a shot for 59 at the last. Let's get to the 14th, and Elvira, his birdie attempt. And well played, Manuel. Having a fine tournament.

[00:33:37] >> It's been a struggle for that last group on the course. Two of the three players are 2-over, the other is 4-over. Everyone's chasing William Mouw, who's playing the final hole.

[00:33:48] >> So Mouw began the day at 1-under par. He was seven shots back going into this final round, which would eclipse this by four.

[00:34:01] >> You'll never see these three again, this graphic. They're going to be disappearing.

[00:34:12] >> Everything on form, Laura.

[00:34:15] >> Yeah. It's just -- It's one of those days, isn't? He set out this morning and he's thought, well, let's just try and shoot a nice round of golf. And all of a sudden, he caught fire around the turn, four on the trot, 2, 7, 8, 10, 11. And then, he starts thinking, well, those two twos have just backed him into -- put him into a position now where the others just might not get there.

[00:34:36] >> This is very rare that a guy has got a par at the last with the leaders with half a course to play. And he's probably got par at the last to win. Very rare this.

[00:34:50] >> Yeah. If he pass the last, do you think that's enough turn?

[00:34:52] >> Yeah, I do.

[00:34:52] >> It should be, shouldn't it?

[00:34:53] >> I do, yeah. I do. I don't see anyone playing, you know, getting to 11 from where they are.

[00:35:02] >> Elvira, he's on 6-under. He needs to birdie his way in. And that's a nice start. It's a clever shot.

[00:35:11] >> At the 10th with Peterson playing his second from the fairway at the par 5.

[00:35:20] >> Two-forty-five. It's a 7-wood. It just hangs on. Quite a feature of this golf course, of the raised up fronts and the slope off backs. You see that an awful lot. You don't

get it absolutely spot on. So Mouw's tee shot missed the fairway by 6 inches. This is for a 59.

[00:37:44] >> And of course, that's a new rule in the game, Dame Laura, that you're able to replace it, put it back to where it was without penalty. That's not --

[00:38:40] >> Grandstand finish. Come on. Get there.

[00:38:53] >> It's still a spectacular Sunday for William Mouw, tying the course record with a 61. Will it be enough to win the ISCO Championship?

[00:39:51] >> And what a great day for him.

[00:39:54] >> An accomplished amateur player who played at what many would call university level, and an exceptional level, as we say, college here in the United States of America. His team, Pepperdine, out on the coast of California, won the national championship a few years back. And after that, he has gone through the Korn Ferry Tour, now to the PGA Tour. And he and his wife, Hannah, will stroll arm and arm into the clubhouse.

[00:40:39] >> Peterson, that's the start you want on the second side. Now, three behind.

[00:40:51] >> Let's go ahead to 15. Manuel Elvira, who comes to this hole at 6-under.

[00:41:04] >> Well done indeed. Got better last three.

[00:41:08] >> Keep it going to try to catch William Mow in the ISCO Championship.

[00:41:12] >> This is Whaley from -- Look at the club disappearing in that Kentucky blue grass. Hundred and twenty yard sand wedge at the 14th. And he's one of the players trying to solidify second place for himself. That is going to help. What a shot that is from there. Getting better.

[00:41:31] >> Going to be a quick putt, but a chance to get to seven. Make second place his own.

[00:41:38] >> At 12, it's List in the fairway.

[00:41:43] >> This is the hardest pin on the entire golf course. It's up. And it's four on seven from the left.

[00:41:55] >> That is a really mean pin position. Yeah.

[00:42:00] >> Whaley now. Good opportunity here at 14.

[00:42:03] >> Yeah. Another player getting to 7-under par if he can knock it in.

[00:42:06] >> Well done. Just enough of the right edge. Good back nine.

[00:42:11] >> Still with a chance. But Mouw is in after a Sunday 61.

[00:42:16] >> Luke List down the green at 12. He's trying to recover after having a lackluster front nine. Since then, he's had an eagle at 10, a bogey 11. This is a birdie putt at 12. Inside the Top 10 right now on 4-under. Go. Yes.

[00:42:54] >> Luke List just made another lengthy putt. He had a lengthy eagle putt that he made at the 10th.

[00:43:07] >> Elvira, 124. Find a birdie. One bounce, skip, check by the hole. Pretty much like that. That's a big putt coming up. It might be. It might be to finish second on his own.

Could be. I'm sure he'll be staying on to play the Barracuda next week with a bit of confidence.

[00:43:27] >> Absolutely. On another field where he might be able to fancy himself.

[00:43:31] >> What a putt this is for Manuel Elvira for birdie, posting minus-7. Well done. Bogeyed 17. That would have hurt a lot, but that has given him a lot of cheer. And you never know. He's in the house at 7-under par.

[00:44:07] >> You can hear Emmett Scott, Paul Peterson's caddie, speaking with Paul about what's left here.

[00:44:26] >> Peterson is three behind Mouw with five to play.

[00:44:33] >> They were talking 7-iron here, so it's not a big one.

[00:45:02] >> It sounded like it hit the green to me. It made the sound of a green.

[00:45:14] >> Well, the putter's coming out the back, so he's hit the green. It looks like that's him hole high.

[00:45:21] >> Here's the man with the best chance to catch Mouw.

[00:45:28] >> Up the green from the right-hand side at 14. And he's holed one. He's got one to the hole.

[00:45:36] >> Two in the last four.

[00:45:45] >> Should be a little hurt right there.

[00:45:47] >> We talked about the potential birdie holes coming in, and we've singled out 16. It's a lob wedge, sand wedge in your hand. It's a real chance once you've found the fairway, and he's done that. When you get in the weeds with your wedges, this is when hours and hours and launch with a launch monitor pay dividends that you know exactly how far each of your wedges go. That's disappointing. Gosh, he had a chance there from the middle of the fairway. Gap wedge in your hand, 118 yards. Come on.

[00:46:38] >> On 16 green, Peterson two back.

[00:46:42] >> Well, he's got to give it a run because he's running out of time, isn't he? Seventeen's difficult. No one's birding that hole. Somehow, he's got to try and hole this. Giving it a run. He's holed it.

[00:46:59] >> Now, William can start warming up, because it's a long shot still, but it's a definite shot now.

[00:47:10] >> Sitting up but 00

[00:47:11] >> Yeah, it's kind of sitting up. It's just -- that's kind of one where you don't want to, you know, go really --

[00:47:44] >> Two hundred, 218, and we got 199, 195, 212. I mean, we're splitting hairs if we're trying to hit a --

[00:47:56] >> That was off a tee. Yeah. No, no, it's there.

[00:47:59] >> Something a little sexy.

[00:48:00] >> Yeah.

[00:48:03] >> So Rob, he's going with the little 6-iron instead of the hard seven.

[00:48:08] >> Right there between that European Tour and ISCO.

[00:48:12] >> Exactly. Just on the right side of the European. Because if anything, it's coming up.

[00:48:17] >> Yeah, yeah.

[00:48:18] >> I've not heard them factor anything in for adrenaline here.

[00:48:21] >> Do you know what? The one shot I don't want to hit is a little something.

[00:48:25] >> Yeah.

[00:48:32] >> Right. Swing of your lifetime. Now, is it hooking? It wasn't a little.

[00:48:49] >> It was unlucky. Really, wasn't it? It was a good shot. It's just, it's landed so soft. I can't believe he didn't hit driver off the tee, if I'm honest, especially for a left-hander down here. Easier to cut it around the corner. Softer landing.

[00:49:02] >> On the 18th green with Peterson putting for birdie to force a playoff.

[00:49:24] >> And the putts he's made on this back nine have all been from distance. So ask himself reach into the bag one more time.

[00:49:47] >> Great effort, but not enough. What a magical moment for William Mouw. A record setting Sunday yields his first victory on the PGA Tour. He wins the ISCO Championship.

[00:50:02] >> As you can see, it is a special time in the lives of William and Hannah Mouw, expecting their first child. Married 2 years ago, and now celebrating a victory. And to think he was nine back going into this final round too.

[00:50:18] >> Yeah, he had no price really. I mean, he, you know, he said he get off to a quick start and maybe I see that I've got a chance. But it was 61 in the final round, is way beyond what you think you're going to shoot if you have a good day.

[00:50:34] >> Yeah.

[00:50:35] >> He was seven back to start the round. So still the largest comeback in the final round of the ISCO Championship. They played more than just of the final round. They also completed the third round this morning. Peterson will just have that short putt left. Great effort by Paul.

[00:50:50] >> Wonderful effort because he looked to be at sixes and sevens at one point. Got very close.

[00:50:56] >> A lot of momentum for Paul Peterson with his best ever finish on the PGA Tour at the age of 37.

[00:51:04] >> I think it's a great story, you know, to get out eventually after all those years of trying onto the PGA Tour and come very close to winning or getting into a playoff. And you can never ever knock yourself when you've reached a career high. And so far, that's his best finish.

[00:51:20] >> And another look at that reaction from William Mouw and his wife Hannah there winning the ISCO Championship.

[00:51:28] >> Manuel Elvira ends up third by himself. David Skinns and Vince Whaley tied for fourth. The amateur, Jackson Koivun, finishes in a tie for six. He was a good, really good junior player, but not seen -- perceived to be the best going into his college days. And he has become the number one ranked amateur player. I recently had a chance to visit with him, and I said, what's happened to you in these last 2 years? And he said, I've watched Scottie Scheffler and the amount of attention he pays to every shot. And I've started

treating every shot so much differently. I don't think about the end result, the outcome, the big picture anymore. I just think about each shot. And it is working.

[00:52:13] >> Well, if you're going to follow someone's career, that's not a bad one, is it? The World number 1. And he feels like he's going to be there for some time to come. Rory will challenge him along the way, but his consistency is what makes him great. He hasn't got the superpowers of a Rory, but he's got that superpower in that he makes so few mistakes. And if his game, if Koivun likes the way he plays, that is someone certainly to study.
