[00:00:26] >> The PGA Tour proudly presents the season long race for the FedExCup. And now, coverage of the 3M Open. Seventh edition of this event here. A critical late season tournament on the PGA tour. That's the 35th of 36 regular season events. So pressure is on for those players with their backs against the wall in hopes of qualifying for the start of the FedExCup playoffs. In two weeks' time, only 70 will make it to Memphis for the first leg of the playoffs. Eighty two degrees right now, very little wind for the players to contend with. Optimum scoring conditions today. I'm John Swantek. Great to have your company. Twotime DP World Tour champion Andrew Coltart is alongside. Two-time PGA Tour winner Matt Every is here as well. Inci Mehmet is on the ground for us this week, patrolling the fairways of TPC Twin Cities. We are in Blaine, Minnesota, the midwestern part of the United States. It is the Minneapolis-Saint Paul Twin Cities area, what they call it, the 16th largest metropolitan area in the United States. About 3.7 million people call it home. Minnesota, known as the Land of 10,000 Lakes. And it seems like there might be a couple dozen right here on the property. Two hundred ninety one balls in the water here a year ago, more than any course on the PGA Tour. Matt, if it's tame and the wind is laying down, you know you've played there a handful of times, they'll tear this place apart.

A good player, Olesen, former Ryder Cupper, of course, trying to find his feet over here. Get a little bit closer to it. Mitchell. Let's see, he's got one of those putters. Very easy for the toe to wrap over the heel, but goodness me, the sweet swinging, Mitchell finding the bottom of the cup once more.

We welcome you to TPC Twin Cities in Blaine, Minnesota. Just about 15 miles or so outside the downtown metroplex area of Minneapolis-Saint Paul, 86 degrees on day two. A little bit warmer than it was in yesterday's opening round with the winds potentially shifting coming from the opposite direction. Blowing out of the south, southwest today. Off to the 5th we go.

[00:09:12] >> Here's Tom Kim over on the bunker on the right hand side here. Just one shy of the cut mark. He can't ill afford any mistakes. Oh, that will get it done. You lucky, lucky boy.

[00:09:26] >> Sadly it's not quite been the day for Tony Finau. Couple of double bogeys on the scorecard. Not a great front line either. He's still trying but thankfully a bit of a smile on his face. This is kind of hooking right to left to start off with and flattens out in that second half.

Just at the end it tried to creep off the right and from this angle it is a slightly straighter one. I reckon no more than outside that right edge, to be honest. It was a superb second shot and some finish this would be.

this weekend, he should be in the playoffs. I think he's got enough cushion but this guy said -- There we go, 70 today for Fowler.

[00:12:09] >> Thorbjorn Olesen takes the outright lead after a 66, but smooth swinging. Jake Knapp right on his heels just one shot back. The third round is next. The second to last tournament of the PGA Tour regular season. We welcome you back to TPC Twin Cities in Blaine, Minnesota, the American Midwest. About 15 miles from the downtown metropolitan area of Minneapolis-Saint Paul. They call it the Land of 10,000 Lakes in this part of the country. And the water is well represented here in this Arnold Palmer design hosting this PGA Tour stop for the seventh year. Very similar weather conditions and patterns to what we've seen first couple of days. Scoring has been exceptional. I'm John Swantek. So good to have your company. Andrew Coltart, Matt Every alongside Inci Mehmet will be on the ground for us walking with the final pairing of the day here. Seventy five professionals and one amateur made the cut at 5-under par from a field of 153 to start the week. Minneapolis-Saint Paul metropolitan area, the 16th largest in the United States, where roughly 3.7 million folks call home. And we're about 15 miles outside the downtown area out here in the suburbs of Blaine, Minnesota. And this Arnold Palmer design dating back to 2019. PGA Tour Champions played this golf course for many years, but it was 40 years between PGA Tour events until the advent of this tournament in 2019. Par 71 plays 7,400 yards and change. And we have got a 59 watch going on Saturday here at the 3M Open. Thorbjorn Olesen was the overnight leader.

[00:14:10] He's in the final pairing of the day along with Jake Knapp. But, guys, the story of the day being written by Kurt Kitayama. This was moments ago at 16.

Just about 40 minutes or so away from the final pairing of the day that Inci will be walking with Olesen and Knapp. Yeah, look. I mean, these last two holes, Kurt's face in relatively easy pin on 17 all the way in the back water. Won't be in play. Obviously, he's got his good stuff today, so we'll see what he does there. But 18, a very reachable par-5 if you just find the fairway. Really got to like his chances there at making a birdie. Who knows, maybe even we'll, maybe we could even see a 58.

[00:18:36] >> That was a really good look here for Chris at the second, 200 through two off and running downhill. Going to work a little to his left. We've seen those hands kind of creep up high. Keep the heel off the ground as much as he can. Well, that thing is hugging the ground and it is working. OK, let's just, I mean, let's call what it is. It is history. I mean, 59's history in the game of golf. It is. You have a chance at history here, but you're also two in the lead. Decent line, the primary cut. And it looks like we're laying up here. Take our chances with a wedge.

[00:19:31] >> And it absolutely taken that on. No problem at all.

[00:19:34] >> Right, at 224, we're looking at 220 carry. I mean pretty much every guy in the field's got that with an iron out here.

[00:22:15] >> There it is. Phenomenal round, 25 putts to get it around at 60 strokes. Kurt Kitayama is one of the co-owners of the course record and he is the owner of the lead by three. So Gotterup chance to get to 14-under within three of this man. Kurt Kitayama.

[00:22:44] >> Friendly handshake with the opener. He's up at the seventh. Had to dig that one out. And you hold one of those early in the round, maybe you get a sense that it could be a special day.

He would settle for 60 and the clubhouse lead.

[00:23:44] >> Ben Silverman, 97 again. Pin over there on that right hand side. It's funny, isn't it? The old days before you saw these tracks that players with. Oh no, he's going to try and fade this one into that right hand pin.

[00:24:04] >> Birdies have been piling up at the opening two holes on the golf course. There's another at the second for Kanaya, getting him to 13-under.

[00:24:16] >> All right, over to four, Bhatia from the center of the green. This is makeable and work a little to his left. Touch them all.

[00:24:50] >> Right pin at seven. Again, just back on that top shelf. Right there. That is absolutely fabulous.

[00:29:57] >> Oh, isn't this clever? Really well worked out still right there though. Back at the 18th, William Mouw just trying to dump that one out of the green. About all you can do if you want to get it in there close.

[00:30:14] >> Tell you what, that's pretty good mount right there. No one has reached 18 under just yet, but now they have Akshay Bhatia with his nose in front. Sixty three.

[00:31:05] >> Olesen to follow. Matt with a birdie here at 14.

We will crown a tournament champion at day's end and also have a clearer picture about the FedExCup playoffs, which are just two weeks away with only 70 men headed for Memphis to start the playoffs. It is cooking here in the American Midwest, 90 degrees right now. Maybe the winds will kick up and be a real factor for the first time this week. It's been great to have your company all week long. I'm John Swantek. So much fun being alongside Andrew Coltart. Matt Every as well. Inci Mehmet on the ground for she'll walk the fairways with Akshay Bhatia and Thorbjorn Olesen, the final two of the day. Ten players bottled up within two shots of the lead and the final three pairings of the day, all gunning for the victory. Sam Stevens will play alongside Jake Knapp. Both of those players tied for third. Takumi Kanaya coming off at 65 yesterday. Kurt Kitayama shot 60, his career

low round to put himself into the next here. And then the final two of the day. Akshay Bhatia, 23-year-old, seeking his third victory on the PGA Tour. And Thorbjorn Olesen trying to become the first player from Denmark to win on the PGA Tour. That is what is up for grabs today. Five hundred FedExCup points, 1.5 million US dollars to the champion, entry into the century, the Players Championship, next year's Masters, next year's PGA Championship as well, and fully exempt status on the PGA Tour for two full seasons. It is out there today, a lot to play for. All kinds of storylines bubbling up. And that's the way the first page of the leaderboard is stacking up here. And William Mouw, young player who just won a few weeks ago on the PGA Tour, is out early having birdied his opening hole to get to 16-under par.
