[00:00:36] >> James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. PGA Tour Champions. Back in Florida. The Old Course at Broken Sound for many years has hosted the PGA Tour Champions. Notable winners on this venue, par 72, playing over 7,000 yards. In great shape for this inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. So let's take a look at the format. Seventy-eight PGA Tour Champions players, three World Golf Hall of Famers, 54 holes of stroke play, normal. But then, we add the football legends. Two man best ball teaming up with PGA Tour Champions players. They'll use handicap for those guys. Friday and Saturday only. Championship will be decided on Saturday for the NFL Legend. And we've got some great Super Bowl champion. Terrell Davis won an MVP with the Denver Broncos. Ronde Barber won a Super Bowl with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Now, an outstanding broadcaster. DeMarcus Ware led the NFL in sacks twice. Did it with the Cowboys, did it with the Broncos. Greatest show on turf, Marshall Faulk, Super Bowl champion with the St. Louis Rams in the field here this week. And one of the greatest of all times, Lawrence Taylor of the New York Giants. Breeze picking up a little bit. We take you over to the 12th. And Billy Andrade is on the tee and ready to go.

[00:02:08] >> Good par 3 right here, Bob. Two hundred and seven hundred yards, hole location today in the back right.

[00:02:15] >> That is a wonderful play there from Billy Andrade. Billy Andrade was in contention at the Chubb Classic in Naples, Florida.

[00:02:23] >> Retief Goosen for his birdie.

[00:02:25] >> Birdie at the tough 13th.

[00:02:36] >> Billy Andrade now for his birdie.

[00:03:06] >> Not much to this, Bob. Pretty straight. See a little bit of grain here and there. I think the greens are rolling awfully nice. Beautiful birdie there at the 12th.

[00:03:23] >> Let's go over to 10. And John McGinnes, Dwight Freeney coming into this par 5 with an iron.

[00:03:29] >> How about a 9-iron? He hit it more than his playing weight off the tee. At least 310 yards.

[00:03:38] >> He's going to have that for an eagle, net double eagle.

[00:03:43] >> John, Miguel Angel Jimenez has earned almost a million dollars through the first five events this year. He's got two wins, finished tied for second at Hualalai, tied for third last week in Rancho Mirage at Mission Hills, is playing with a confidence. He'd gone 2.5 years without a win, but he's got that swagger back, doesn't he?

[00:04:04] >> He certainly does. And it's fun to see who has better swagger than he does. And I bet he's upgraded his Rioja.

[00:04:28] >> Long putt, swinging right to left the whole way.

[00:04:32] >> How about it?

[00:04:39] >> Paul Goydos playing his second at the 11th here at the inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. All the players you're seeing today in our TV window, all starting their day at the 10th.

[00:04:51] >> Dangerous little hole location here, Bob, in that front right. There's a little slope right there. But well done there for Paul.

[00:04:58] >> And, John, unlike when you're playing with your buddies, and Freeney got home in two, his eagle putt just missed, you don't get to rake this or scoop it up and say, good, got to make it.

[00:05:09] >> No. But I do believe that he plays in some games that they make him putt those.

[00:05:15] >> That didn't look as good as the result. But it's four.

[00:05:20] >> Four for a three for Dwight Freeney. That's like getting a sack in the first hole.

[00:05:27] >> David Duval playing his second into 13. David, 1-under.

[00:05:35] >> Right over top of the flagstick. Very nice.

[00:05:40] >> Paul Goydos for his birdie.

[00:05:42] >> Nice wedge shot in here for Paul.

[00:05:47] >> Good birdie for Paul. David Duval, we saw his tee shot. A second shot in the 13, this for birdie.

[00:05:55] >> Yeah. Right over top of the flagstick there, Bob. Now, down the slope it goes. And made a nice comeback par putt on 12. Follows it up with a nice birdie putt there at 13.

[00:06:08] >> John, Petrovic's third at 11.

[00:06:11] >> Came up short with a wedge as well.

[00:06:13] >> That will take --

[00:06:14] >> Sometimes, you hit it right where you're supposed to.

[00:06:18] >> Yes, that'll take care of business. Petro golf birdie at 11, his second hole today.

[00:06:26] >> Marshall Faulk for his birdie at 16. He's even.

[00:06:35] >> There you go, Marshall. Didn't pick up the game until he was in the hall of fame. That was 2010.

[00:06:41] >> Let's go over to 16, Parnell Dickinson.

[00:06:48] >> Awkward long bunker shot of about 40 yards. And not awkward for Parnell. What a golf shot that was.

[00:06:57] >> Boo Weekley's second at 16.

[00:06:59] >> Yeah. Good tee shot here on the par 5. Second shot, playing downwind out of the left. And what a marvelous golf shot there for Boo.

[00:07:13] >> Dickinson for his birdie at 16.

[00:07:16] >> After that wonderful long bunker shot, takes advantage of it. And how about that up and down there.

[00:07:23] >> It's more we're talking about here, John. Boo Weekley has this for eagle at 16.

[00:07:28] >> Yeah. Tremendous approach after a nice tee shot. Just 3 feet for eagle. Not much to this. This is part of the game that doesn't really cooperate too often for Boo. If it does, he will be a force out here.

[00:07:56] >> So Boo Weekley makes an eagle at 16. That gets him back to even again. He started his day on the 10th. Now, Tim Petrovic.

[00:08:23] >> He's going to need a solid strike here. We've seen a number of balls end up in the penalty area. And he got it right there, John. What a nice shot.

[00:08:38] >> Well done for TD, Terrell Davis. Birdie at 16, gets back to 1-under.

[00:08:48] >> Tim Petrovic for birdie at 14. And John, this would be like stealing one against the field.

[00:08:54] >> Yeah, he needs it too. Quickly down the hill.

[00:08:58] >> There you go. Toughest hole of the day. That's the first birdie made at 14.

[00:09:09] >> So, using a handicap system with the Pro Football Hall of Famer, Steve Largent, 4-under through 9. Ronde Barber, Dwight Freeney at 3-under. Aiken Ayodele, Danny Kanell at 2-under. Marshall Faulk, Roger Wehrli, Terrell Davis, Jimmie Giles. and Brian Kelly all in red figures at 1-under. Meanwhile, PGA Tour Champions leaderboard, you could see how difficult this golf course is playing with the winds blowing, John Cook. Normally, 2-under is not leading on a Friday.

[00:09:35] >> Yeah, that's fine for sure. The golf course is playing really difficult. Wind is up, greens are firm. It just gets tougher and tougher as the week goes on.

[00:09:51] >> Second round coverage of the inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. So much history for the PGA Tour Champions in Boca Raton, Florida, and 17th time that the Old Course at Broken Sound has hosted the PGA Tour Champions for the inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. Winds gusting at about 24 miles per hour, certainly affected the scoring in Day 1. Seen some better scores here in Day 2, but the wind is still a factor. Take a look at the format for this inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. Seventy-eight PGA Tour Champions, 54 holes of stroke play, 26 football legends, a whole bunch of Hall of Famers, two man best ball with PGA Tour Champions players. That will be decided today.

[00:10:52] >> Darren Clarke, who won on this property 2020, shot 17-sunder. Back to back birdies.

[00:11:01] >> John, what does Miguel have left?

[00:11:03] >> Well, 190. Just bombed it off the tee.

[00:11:14] >> From inside 200 yards, par 5. You really want to try to get one close. You know it's going to release on the green. So to get it close, Cookie, you've got to risk carrying it just over the water. He's going to try to ride a draw from the right-hand side over to it.

[00:11:31] >> Tough to hold the green, hitting a running draw, but he does a great job there, John. What a golf shot there for Jimenez.

[00:11:39] >> So, John, tell me a little bit about the game and what's impressed you as far as Dwight Freeney's concerned.

[00:11:45] >> This guy has the heart of a gambler. I don't know if his recreational golf involves his wallet, but it should because he has some X's. He's not going to finish some holes, but he makes a lot of birdies for a guy that's, what is he, a 10 handicap?

[00:12:02] >> Birdied this hole yesterday right out of the block for the shot.

[00:12:05] >> And this is for another one of those. He didn't like that stroke. Oh, he was out of that as soon as he made contact with it. OK.

[00:12:25] >> All right, John, Miguel has a good look at eagle. Again, that wind is blowing, but is this a right to lefter that you got to factor the wind in?

[00:12:37] >> I think so. I think this one's short enough though that I think he -- you still have to get it out there on the lip. Just a beautiful 7-iron in here.

[00:13:04] >> There's no doubt that wind kind of held it from making that left hand turn. And Miguel will let you know about it.

[00:13:18] >> It's about as grumpy a guy can be after making back to back birdies, isn't it?

[00:13:24] >> He's going to walk off the green with a birdie and he's annoyed.

[00:13:28] >> Darren Clarke, his second in the 13.

[00:13:30] >> Good tee shot down the middle of the fairway. Hole location today in the back left. Cannot miss left here. Beautiful golf shot there for Clarkey.

[00:13:47] >> Been a great ambassador as well.

[00:13:50] >> Take it out to the 11th. And John, that does not look like a great clean golf ball for Miguel Angel Jimenez.

[00:13:58] >> No. And it's strange because the tee shot was -- it was sort of missed, a little low. But I guess it was off the hill and spinny. Hundred and twenty-five yards. Wind out of the right. But I mean, this could go anywhere.

[00:14:21] >> Yeah, these mud balls are crazy. They have minds of their own. He kind of likes it, though. How about that shot?

[00:14:30] >> OK.

[00:14:31] >> Yeah.

[00:14:31] >> Let's go over to the par-4 2nd, 11th hole of the day for Angel Cabrera. Jeff Sluman has joined this group. Cabrera uses that ridge perfectly.

[00:14:43] >> Look at Cabrera's shot here. About 4 feet from the hole, from the right rough, 175 yards. What a great shot.

[00:14:52] >> Angel Cabrera, two-time major champion, won the Masters, the US Open, lost in a playoff in the 2013 Masters to Adam Scott.

[00:15:02] >> How close he was to having a third major?

[00:15:17] >> Just poured that one right in the center.

[00:15:21] >> Darren Clarke had a nice one in the 13 for his birdie. And Darren pours that in.

[00:15:30] >> Cabrera has this for a share of the lead, Jeff Sluman. And it's a kind of unique situation. That's got to be a little weird, right?

[00:15:36] >> We're not used to playing in foursomes, that's for sure, Bob. And Cabrera, we just saw tapped that birdie in. Now, Hall of Famer Tim Brown has a putt for birdie. And he's getting a shot on this hole. So this is for a net eagle.

[00:15:55] >> Turn right. Oh, he had it right in the jaws.

[00:16:12] >> Ronde Barber for par. He's at 9-under, playing with Billy Andrade.

[00:16:19] >> Fast that putt is. At his respect.

[00:16:29] >> Tim Brown for par. Net birdie to widen his lead. Came out of that one. He's not going to lose any ground getting a shot here.

[00:17:03] >> Birdie for Retief Goosen. So that gets him to 4-under, 3-under on his round today.

[00:17:11] >> All business right now. When you've got it on cruise control, I wouldn't be surprised to see him stuff another one right here. Or drown.

[00:17:36] >> Over at 18, former quarterback Danny Kanell for birdie. Getting a shot.

[00:17:44] >> That's a net eagle. High five from Tom Lehman.

[00:17:47] >> Little 32.

[00:17:50] >> This is the third shot from Miguel Angel Jimenez. So his tee shot at 14 went into the water, the penalty area. He's electing to play it from the tee. The drop zones 111 yards back there. Trying to hit the same shot. Have that now for bogey.

[00:18:10] >> This is the second for Tim Brown, who has the lead at 13-under at 18.

[00:18:16] >> Front hole location today. Hands it out there just to the right. Safety first. And that's really nicely done.

[00:18:22] >> Back out the 14. John, why do you think Jimenez did not go to the drop area?

[00:18:27] >> I think it was a mistake. I do. He may not have been aware of the fact that it was available to him, although that seems hard to believe. But I think he hit that third shot out of frustration from the tee. And you just saw how difficult this putt was.

[00:18:44] >> Yeah. This is not --

[00:18:46] >> This needs to go.

[00:18:48] >> Just creeping over that little slope there. And, oh, that's -- John, that's good 12 feet now for his double.

[00:19:01] >> Ronde Barber for birdie at 16. Slides away. Good effort.

[00:19:09] >> Jimenez would love a double here, John.

[00:19:12] >> Yeah. We thought the par putt on the last hole was big. Downhill, moving right to left.

[00:19:21] >> So Jimenez is going to make a triple bogey six.

[00:19:27] >> Cabrera's got a heck of a round going. He's 4-under today and made a couple of eagles. And Jeff, he's got a chance to add to that total and take the outright lead right here.

[00:19:36] >> It's going to be a little right to left speedy. I just love his body language. John, you've seen him before. He looks like a cat prowling right now and he's -- Beautifully made.

[00:19:48] >> Yeah, that was a well-played hole. One of the tougher holes on the golf course today, the fifth toughest on the golf course, and made that one look easy.

[00:19:56] >> Tim Brown for birdie at 18.

[00:20:02] >> It was a little careful. Did I really leave myself that?

[00:20:07] >> That.

[00:20:08] >> Third for Darren Clarke at 16. Obviously, a little trouble off the tee. Plenty of length to get there in two. And stops that nicely. So Darren Clarke will have that for his birdie.

[00:20:22] >> Tim Brown for his par now at 18. Again, 13-under. Gets a stroke here, so he'll finish it 14-under for the Hall of Famer. Darren Clarke for his birdie. And he does. He missed a lot of those putts yesterday.

[00:20:56] >> Angel Cabrera playing his third shot at the par-5 6th.

[00:21:01] >> Nice layup there for Angel Cabrera. But, oh my, that ball, stuck that in the ground, but got a fortunate break, Bob, down that slope. Easy now because there's a fall off over there.

[00:21:13] >> This is the third for Ronde Barber at 18. Long right of the green, down the hill. And that is very classy.

[00:21:25] >> Cabrera chose to layup, and then kind of chunked his pitch shot. But, Jeff, when things are going your way, they're going your way. And now, he's got a good look at birdie.

[00:21:37] >> He's put it in a beautiful spot to make birdie. It's uphill. Should be going a little left to right. I can't see him missing this the way his day's gone so far. Boy's making it look easy, Bob.

[00:21:50] >> Two in a row. This is Colin Montgomerie playing his second into 17.

[00:21:59] >> Monte would like this hole location in that right side, in that little saddle, down that slope and --

[00:22:06] >> Whoa, go in.

[00:22:07] >> How about it?

[00:22:08] >> How about that? An eagle two for Colin Montgomerie at the par-4 17th. Darren Clarke for par at 18.

[00:22:17] >> Tough finishing hole here. Clarkey, can he get one go down?

[00:22:38] >> Disappointing 70 for Darren Clarke. Over at 17, Jimenez playing his second, John.

[00:22:48] >> One-forty-five, downwind, flag over on the right-hand side in the little bowl. See if he can give himself another good chance.

[00:23:10] >> Pro Football Hall of Famer, Roger Wehrli, for par. Boom.

[00:23:18] >> Roger is teamed up with Colin Montgomerie.

[00:23:20] >> And Tim Brown at 14-under, playing with Tim O'Neal today. Looks like he's going to be the winner of the inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational.

[00:23:32] >> Miguel. Yeah, it'll be Miguel.

[00:23:34] >> John, did you notice that putt on the last hole kind of catching the heel a little bit?

[00:23:39] >> I did indeed. I think that this one, because has some right to left in, it may be a little bit easier. I think the straight ones are the ones that work a little the other way, the ones that he really has trouble with. See if this is a better stroke.

[00:24:11] >> The third time's a charm. Makes a birdie at 17, now five off the lead.

[00:24:25] >> And now, Slu, this becomes a huge putt here. I mean, Cabrera is 6-under today. He leads by two. He's missed some chances to open the lead up to three or maybe even four. And the last thing he needs to do right now is kind of let the fives back in if he doesn't make this.

[00:24:42] >> Exactly. He's taking his time, which is the right thing to do. Kind of sneaks it in that left edge there, Bob. But it went in and that's all that really matters.

[00:24:55] >> That's a great --

[00:24:55] >> Beautiful round of golf that I saw today from Cabrera.

[00:24:59] >> Great way to end the day, making a nice little tricky 4 footer.

[00:25:03] >> Angel Cabrera with a 66 today in the wind, trying to win for the first time on the PGA Tour Champions. A two-time major champion will go into Sunday's final round with a two shot lead over Alex Cejka. The Old Course of Broken Sound has been attacked with the wind wreaking havoc on the field. But the NFL guys had a lot of fun. And how about Tim Brown getting the win? Tim Petrovic's been great battling all day long. It's going to be a fun Sunday.

[00:25:43] >> Final round coverage of the inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. And for the 17th time, the Old Course at Broken Sound playing host to the PGA Tour Champions in this inaugural James Hardie Part Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational. Yesterday, the legends and Hall of Famers finished up with Tim Brown, the winner. Today, we will crown a champion. Will it be Angel Cabrera, the two-time major champion, trying to win for the first time on the PGA Tour Champions? Windier today than it's been the first two days. So the players will have to deal with that. Two-time major champion, Angel Cabrera, started the day with a two shot lead, even on his round. playing the par-5 10th. This was his third shot, and he knocks it below the hole to about 3 feet. And Cabrera then would just roll in this putt for birdie to get him to 11-under par. And he's got a three shot lead. Try to win for the first time for the 55-year-old on the PGA Tour Champions.

[00:26:54] >> Let's go over to 13. So Goosen in the bunker playing his third, Jeff.

[00:26:59] >> Yeah, he hung it up. He may have had a bad lie because of the iron that he hit in. Was coming in from the clouds. But --

[00:27:07] >> The inaugural James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational, and Hall of Famer Tim Brown. Won a wide receiver with the Raiders, rolls in that par putt at 18 for birdie. And Tim Brown, who played with Tim O'Neal, finished at 14-under after shooting a 63. Beat Nat Moore, the former Dolphin, by four. The Bus, Jerome Bettis, by four. Steve Largent, Ronde Barber, DeMarcus Ware, John Randle, Dwight Freeney, all at 9-under par.

[00:27:44] >> Goosen with a bogey.

[00:27:47] >> Joe Durant playing the second to last group, misses his par putt. So Joe is 2-under on his round today.

[00:28:01] >> Yeah, that was his first bogey of the day too.

[00:28:09] >> Cejka on the tee at 14.

[00:28:19] >> Ball striking's been good.

[00:28:32] >> Joe Durant curls that in.

[00:28:35] >> Nice little bounce back birdie there for Joe.

[00:28:39] >> We take you out to the par-3 14th.

[00:29:00] >> Cabrera has some options on type of shot he wants to play, where Cejka doesn't. Really difficult bunker shot here for Cejka.

[00:29:11] >> Alex is on the -- He's on the downslope. There's no way to get it anywhere near the hole. He may be playing out to the left a little bit.

[00:29:52] >> Cejka right now three off the lead of Angel Cabrera, who's also short sighted. And then, K.J. Choi, who's three back. Now, Cabrera is going to go. Did I see Fran Quinn, the former player now PGA Tour Champions rules official out there, John?

[00:30:17] >> Yeah. He's just following along. He set up the back nine this week. And that is as good a shot as Alex could have hit from there.

[00:30:41] >> Retief Goosen playing his third at 16. Jeff, going with putter.

[00:30:46] >> He's going with the putter off the green. The hard part is going to be getting into the hole. It's uphill, into the grain, and into the wind.

[00:30:55] >> So Cejka will have a putt for par after that really nice bunker shot to stay at 8-under.

[00:31:08] >> Well, he's missed a few birdie putts from this length. Probably make the par putt just because it's golf.

[00:31:16] >> Big putt here for Alex Cejka. He cannot -- he'll start running out of holes if this doesn't go in.

[00:31:23] >> I think he has to make this, and make at least three birdies on the way in.

[00:31:39] >> Oh, boy, that was a nice putt. Was on that high line, John and just missed on the right. So Cejka is going to give one back.

[00:31:51] >> Middle of the green.

[00:31:52] >> Final group at 15. K.J. Choi first to play.

[00:31:57] >> One-ninety-seven. He's way over here left. He's got to skirt these oak trees that are between he and the green. Get some hybrids, folks. Get some hybrids.

[00:32:20] >> I'll tell you what, he is so proficient with that. Like you said, bouquet of hybrids in his bag.

[00:32:27] >> Back at the James Hardie Invitational. John MaGinnes, he's going with putter here at 15.

[00:32:36] >> You have to hit this so hard to get it up that hill. So hard to control. And --

[00:32:44] >> That was pretty well done. Safety first there, John.

[00:32:47] >> Lots of things could have happened there.

[00:32:49] >> Yeah, safety first.

[00:32:53] >> Retief Goosen got to make this to have any chance.

[00:32:57] >> Got to hit it with some pace. And he does. Right in the center. Nice two putt from the front of the green there for Retief. And he keeps his name in this storybook.

[00:33:05] >> Now, back over to 15, K.J. Choi.

[00:33:35] >> There's one.

[00:33:36] >> K.J. Choi's fourth birdie of the day. He's 3-under, and now, trails by two. And Cabrera still has a par putt here at 15. Now, Angel Cabrera has this putt for par to remain at 11-under.

[00:34:03] >> Outside the hole on the right. Not one you can jam. It's slightly downhill. To feed it in there and he knew it as soon as he hit it. Game on, folks.

[00:34:17] >> K.J. Choi with the birdie at 15. Cabrera is going to make a bogey and the three shot lead will be down to one. And Cabrera even on his round today. And now, his lead is just one.

[00:34:49] >> Now, we take you over to 17. And, Jeff, what's Retief have left?

[00:34:53] >> He's got it straight down the wind, Bob, 99 yards. He got relief from a drainage cover. And he's probably got to fly at about 92 yards. Pins right on the front right. And hopefully, I haven't seen many of them but one hopping, stopping.

[00:35:19] >> Third easiest hole today.

[00:35:20] >> It's on a pretty easy pin position. Yeah, I can see why.

[00:35:33] >> There you go.

[00:35:34] >> And he did it perfectly.

[00:35:35] >> Goosen will have that to get to 9-under.

[00:35:45] >> Thomas Bjorn for birdie at 18. Nice shot in there. Right behind the hole. You don't see that very often here at the 18th.

[00:35:53] >> How about Thomas Bjorn's day? He doesn't make the birdie there, but he shoots a bogey-free 68.

[00:36:06] >> Pays some bills on Sunday.

[00:36:08] >> Yeah. He's the only player to shoot bogey-free today.

[00:36:13] >> Now, K.J. Choi, who's just a shot back, playing his second, John.

[00:36:19] >> Two-twenty-five. There's a little tough to grasp right behind the ball. Doesn't sound like it affected it at all, though.

[00:36:28] >> Yeah. Just comes up --

[00:36:32] >> Not landed in the grass, but that's rolling back into the bunker.

[00:36:35] >> Yeah.

[00:36:51] >> Short birdie putt for Retief Goosen at 17. And this gets him to 9-under. Back to back birdies.

[00:36:57] >> Just wiggled it in that right edge, but back to back birdies.

[00:37:05] >> So K.J. Choi coming off of birdie at the left last, and he hit one tight here at 16.

[00:37:29] >> You almost get it close. You have to try to land it into that upslope to get it to stop. It's a short window, and he went ahead and flew it all the way up to the hole. This is going to come back.

[00:38:00] >> Retief Goosen, third shot at 18.

[00:38:11] >> Rolling up there. Bob, he used the hybrid, and I think it was a pretty darn good play.

[00:38:16] >> But now, K.J. Choi has a putt for birdie to tie Cabrera.

[00:38:49] >> K.J. Choi for a share of the lead.

[00:38:58] >> Well, it's a great finish. Reachable par 5, a short par 4, and a long par 4 opportunity and challenge.

[00:39:10] >> K.J. coming off a nice birdie back at the tough 15th.

[00:39:13] >> I don't like how much time he's taking here.

[00:39:17] >> A little unsettled.

[00:46:29] >> Angel Cabrera, we talked about his story at the beginning of the show, as K.J. Choi made a heck of a run today, starting the day four shots back. Obviously, he had all kinds of trouble with the law. Started playing competitive golf again about 2 years ago, finished tied for fifth at the Senior Open Championship at Carnoustie. Only got into the field this week when Mark Hensby was forced to withdraw. And now, Angel Cabrera has an opportunity. Punch his ticket to the PGA Tour Championship, full status for the rest of this year, a trip to Hualalai, and full status for next year. And he's talked so much about how emotional this has all been for him, coming back from where he's been in a dark place. And this is a guy that's won two majors, won the US Open at Oakmont, won the Masters, lost in a playoff at the Masters in 2013 to Adam Scott. His only other win on the PGA Tour came at the Greenbrier in 2014, 10 years, 9 months, or 3,927 days since his last PGA Tour win. Played in Argentina last week. Finished tied for 35th there. But he got that invite to the Masters as a past Masters champion. He's heading there tonight. But he may be heading there tonight as a winner on the PGA Tour Champions for the first time.

[00:47:51] >> Yeah. With a trophy, you know, under his arm as he gets to Augusta. But be really interested to hear him --

[00:47:58] >> If he ever thought he would be here again from where he has been in the in the last few years, like he said, he's been working really hard. He's been competitive. We've seen glimpses of the old Angel Cabrera earlier in the year and late last year. So to battle back and maybe settle with a W.

[00:48:20] >> Mr. MaGinnes, K.J. Choi has a putt for birdie for a share of the lead.

[00:48:25] >> He does have a putt for birdie. It's not an easy putt. There's a brow coming off the back of this green that's going to send this putt to the right. It's going to break quite a bit from left to right. This is one, under ordinary circumstances, you're very pleased to two putt. These are not ordinary circumstances. And he knows where Angel is. This has to go in. You can aim it out there toward Alex's mark. Might actually be a good target for him.

[00:49:30] >> Not what K.J. was looking for there. Just misjudged the run out. Now, Angel with two putts to win.

[00:49:43] >> He's 55 years of age. Could become the 13th win by a player from Argentina on the PGA Tour Champions. Eduardo Romero won five times, Vicente Fernandez, four times, Roberto De Vincenzo, two times, and Ricardo Gonzalez. Now, Cabrera, two putts for the win.

[00:50:09] >> And not much in it. Right up the hill.

[00:50:16] >> Cozies it up close. He got in when Mark Hensby withdrew. And now, Angel Cabrera is going to win on the PGA Tour Champions for the first time. And the emotion that has to be running through him. And that's Angel Monguzzi, the caddie for K.J. Choi and one of Angel Cabrera's dearest friends. He's got his son on the bag. Can't imagine what's going through his mind right now.
