Chad Campbell off to a fast start, 5 under through his opening seven. Brett Quigley, Billy Andre, Thongchai Jaidee at 4-under par. Miguel Angel Jimenez, who leads the Schwab Cup standings currently at 2-under par with Retief Goosen and Angel Cabrera. A lot of work left for his par, Cookie.

Little left to right slider, down grain, towards the right, and nice outgoing nine holes -- eight holes so far for Ernie.

They have just blown the horn, 1:03 Eastern, 12:03 Central time, as thunderstorms are starting to move in. Listen, when you're at this time of year, in May, early May, and you're in The Woodlands outside of Houston, weather has traditionally been a factor. We take a look at the radar and storms just popping up everywhere. We thought we might be clear through it. They moved the tee times up a couple hours. They blew the horn at 12:03 local time, 1:03 Eastern with storms coming through The Woodlands, Texas. They got the players on the golf course. They were about ready to resume, and then another storm popped up. Fortunately, we haven't had heavy rain, but there's thunder and lightning in the area. 4 under leads the way. Hopefully they can get round one completed at some point today here at The Woodlands for the 22nd playing of the Insperity Invitational. Always a special day, on this Saturday, at the Insperity Invitational. [Inaudible] Saturday, big crowds on hand, as always here at The Woodlands. Round number two, plus the greats of golf, all taking center stage. Woodlands Country Club, the tournament course, host of the PGA Tour for many years, and 17th year now hosting the PGA Tour of Champions. Yes, Jack Nicklaus is in the house, and we will see Jack in action today as part of Team Majors. Gary Player, Tom Kite, Hall of Famers playing this week, Nancy Lopez and the great Annika Sorenstam. Larry Nelson and Sir Nick Faldo, Nick Faldo playing for the first time. Julie Inkster always brings her A game. Lee Trevino giving lessons as he plays.

They share the lead heading into the final round of the Insperity Invitational. Miguel Angel Jimenez, Y.E. Yang just shot back. Stewart Cink leads that group, but two shots back Angel Cabrera, Steve Allan, winners already this year, will be 3 shots back. Good day today for Boo Weekley, who shot 66. Doug Barron and Stephen Alker, Alker a two-time champion, shot 4-under par today. How about Scott Parel, to 7-under par 65 today? Gorgeous weather conditions, The Woodlands, Texas, for the 22nd edition of the Insperity Invitational, the ninth of 28 on the PGA Tour of Champions schedule. Mike Weir, Retief Goosen started the day with a share of the lead at 9 under. Mike Weir is 1 under on his round today. He's at 10 under. Miguel Angel Jimenez 1 under. Retief Goosen, all pars through his opening set of holes. He remains just a shot back. Stewart Cink, 2 under. There's some scores out there. Cameron Percy, 7 under with a couple holes to play. Ernie Els, who made two 8s yesterday, 6 under today. Now over to 7, and Weir playing his second.

And Stewart Cink would love to add 500 more dollars to that till. Stewart Cink gets to 10 under. Miguel Angel Jimenez playing his 3rd at 13. Miguel hasn't made a birdie since the par-5 6th, a shot off the lead.

Now, Retief Goosen at 14.

Justin Leonard, his first win at the Chubb Classic. Cologuard Classic went to Stephen Alker. Jimenez won again at the Hope Classic, Newport Beach. Steve Allan, the Gallery Classic for his first win. Angel Cabrera in Boca, for the James Hardie Pro Football Hall of Fame Invitational, his first win. Jerry Kelly, he won for the 13th time, winning the Mitsubishi Electric. Jimenez trying to do what Stewart Cink just did, get up and down from this bunker to save his par.

The guys getting shuttled out to the tee at 18, where the playoff will begin between Retief Goosen and Stewart Cink.

[00:40:58] >> Not many birdies on 18 today, just two, as you've pointed out. So, this-- We could be back and forth on this hole a few times. This hole location today is not the traditional Sunday pin. We saw that yesterday, way back and far to the right. Here's our rules official, the great--

Really, just need to land it around that front-left part of the green. It'll get all the way down to the hole. Obviously, he cannot miss it to the right. He's been flushing it though. Since that tee shot he hit at the par-3 8th, he has aptly put on a stripe show since then. Just hasn't made any punts.

[00:44:25] >> He birdied this hole yesterday in the second round. So, Stewart's played it even all week, and Retief has 1 under, so slight advantage there. Who knows?

Cologuard Classic. Hasn't been able to get across the finish line with win number two, but he is in position right now as Goosen has hit a second shot into the penalty area, into the water. And Cink is in there pretty tight for birdie.

[00:46:58] >> And I'm not sure how much of the penalty area Retief's ball carried. So, they're going to have to figure out where he's going to drop and play his fourth.

[00:47:10] >> Stewart will turn 52 later this month, 21st of May. And he said he's going to focus on the PGA Tour of Champions full time, not try to bounce back and forth between the regular tour and this tour. Currently came into this week 7th in the Schwab Cup standings. John, did you see the point where Goosen's ball crossed into the penalty area?

So, he's playing some confident golf right now.
