Reaches it and does even better. Knocks it in for a double eagle 2. The third albatross of the year on the PGA Tour Champions. Steven Alker knows how to pick a partner. Hall of Famer Bernhard Langer rolls in this putt for birdie at the 8th. That gets that team to 3-under par. Tournament host, Steve Stricker, teamed up with his brother-in-law, Mario Tiziani. His second at the par-3 8th. Steve, always with a great short game, knocks that in for a birdie to get the team to 3-under par. Maybe an unlikely pairing, Ernie Els and Tim Herron. Els for eagle at the 7th. And this would get the team to 5-under par. Justin Leonard, who has a win this year, along with Jerry Kelly, rolls this putt in for birdie at the 10th. And that we get the team to 6-under par. We mentioned Angel Cabrera has teamed up with Ricardo Gonzalez. Here's Gonzalez's third at the par-5 11th. A little pace, flat stick in the way, and that goes in for eagle. That gets them to 6-under par. Darren Clarke teamed up with Thomas Bjorn, his second at the par-3 14th. Little pitch and run, and holding speed. Clarke and Bjorn get to 8-under par. All here in Round 1. Playing best ball on this first round Friday. Jaidee and Jones shots 62 today.

[00:02:44] They're in at 9-under. Clarke and Bjorn at nine 9-. Good scores out on the golf course, with the weather conditions perfect in Madison. The PGA Tour Champions proudly present the season-long race for the Charles Schwab Cup. Today from Madison, Wisconsin, it's first round coverage of the American Family Insurance Championship. This is the ninth playing of the American Family Insurance Championship. New venue though. TPC Wisconsin redesigned by Steve Stricker. This original layout opened in 1963. Par 71, just over 7,000 thousand yards. The wind, not a big factor right now. Ideal weather conditions, and we're seeing that in the scores out on the golf course. Bob Papa along with Peter Jacobsen. So glad you could join us. John Cook handling commentary on the ground. He is with the group of Ernie Els, Tim Herron, and the team of Jimenez and Olazabal. Bernhard Langer has this putt for par at the 14th. Alker has a par putt as well.

That eagle that Ernie made back there at the 7th, he headed in there about 6 feet for eagle. So I gave him that. He's got three other birdies. Little left of the flag. Dangerous hole location here on that front right. Anything hits to the right could go in the penalty area.

[00:04:52] >> Let's go over to 17, par 3. Mark Hensby teamed up with Richard Green for birdie.

But this is Bjorn's bid for birdie. And he says, Darren, pick up your coin. That gets them to 10-under in the outright lead.

A new venue, TPC Wisconsin. A new format. Team competition here in Year number 9. And today, they're playing a scramble. Steve Stricker and his brother-in-law, Mario Tiziani, shot 7-under yesterday in best ball. And right now, they are 14-under par. And they have this putt for birdie to post 22-under. John Cook is with this group.

Got to like the look of this putt, Peter.

Steve Flesch partnered with Paul Goydos for birdie to get to 20-under. And Steve Flesch knocks that in.

Thomas Bjorn and Darren Clarke shot 12-under to have the overnight lead. And there is another one that goes in.

[00:17:44] >> Tim Herron giving a fist pump. Darren Clarke, part of that team with Thomas Bjorn. After Bjorn's eagle putt just missed at 11, Clarke gets that last roll. And that's in for three. That got them to 19-under par. Tiziani made the birdie putt at 13, and then, again, here at 15.

[00:18:06] >> Yeah, this was Mario's approach. And he makes the putt. That gets them to 20-under. And then, here at 16, the reachable par 4. He's got another chance for birdie. And this takes him to 21.

For now, they have a two shot lead here in Round 2 of the American Family Insurance Championship. As we go over to 17. And David Duval teamed up with Matt Gogel, couple of former broadcasters. And Duval pours that in. So that gets them to 18-under. Steve Flesch was supposed to team up with Colin Montgomerie. He withdrew. Paul Goydos stepped in. And this for yet another birdie. And Flesch pours that in. So he makes birdies at 17 and 18. They shoot 57 today. Langer for birdie. He's first to go for he and Team Alker to get to 19-under. And this to shoot 57 for the team.

Ninth playing the American Family Insurance Championship. Team competition for the first time. Darren Clarke and Thomas Bjorn started the day with a three shot lead. They actually bogeyed the first hole. But then, they got things back in order. They made a birdie at the 2nd, a birdie at the 4th. And then, how about this shot by Darren Clarke at the 5th?

Alex Cejka and Soren Kjeldsen started the day nine back. This was Cejka's second at the par-4 16th. Knocked it in for eagle. They'd birdie 18, finish at 28-under after shooting 59. But Darren Clarke with a birdie at the 10th. And they have been the best team all week.

And Thomas Bjorn here at 12. Just off the edge of the green. He's done this a few times this week. So this team is in command.

[00:29:03] >> It's interesting. Mario walked over and asked Steve if he had a play, which he does. He's in the penalty area, but the ball is sitting up. He has to shoot way out to the right. Cannot go with the flag. Mario knows what he needs to do. He needs to stack one right here.

Hundred and forty-four yards. Big pitching wedge or a comfortable nine. Wind out of the right.

[00:29:34] >> Yeah. Just got a little out of sorts about middle of the round. He's hit a lot of shots like that.

[00:32:22] >> It didn't rain a whole lot. It was more of a dusting. I can ask a tour official. I'll have that info in a minute. But it was -- It didn't rain much. Just kind of wetted things down and moved through pretty quick.

[00:32:34] >> That missed birdie putt certainly, I would think, makes this par putt for Bjorn a little less stressful.

[00:32:49] >> He's been so good with this putter. Finished second, tied for second at the Senior PGA a couple weeks ago. He's been hot with this club.

[00:33:07] >> He's going to say, thanks, partner.

[00:33:11] >> Bjorn is ninth in the Schwab Cup standing. So he's having a good year.

[00:33:16] >> Yeah. So Darren will probably knock it right on the green at 16 and make an eagle. Speaking of 16, Steve Flesch and Paul Goydos, both players have birdie putz. Steve Flesch has won four times on the PGA Tour Champions. His last win in 2023 at the Stifel Charity Classic. Also won at Pebble Beach. Won twice at TPC Sugarloaf and the Mitsubishi Electric Classic.

[00:33:56] >> The team of Flesch and Goydos had to count a bogey on Friday. Fleschy made three birdies. Paul made five on Friday, first round.

[00:34:09] >> Meanwhile, Paul Goydos has won five times. But his last win came in 2017 in Minnesota at the 3M, which is now a PGA Tour event.

[00:34:31] >> Remember, this isn't a -- you know, it's a team event, but it's a counter as far as the money's concerned. And this could be a big boost to both players as far as Schwab

Cup standings are concerned. Ernie Els is in fourth position in the Schwab Cup standings. Of course, won the season opener at the Mitsubishi Electric Championship at Hualalai. Solo second at the Mitsubishi Electric Classic. And he's had numerous chances to win this year. Playing in the final group, hasn't been able to pick up that second win.

And they're going to finish most likely with a birdie at 27-under. Final group up near the green at 16. Four pitch shots coming up here.

Followed that up with birdies at 8 and 9. But then, they made five straight pars. It's just not going to get it done when you're starting four back starting the final round.
