#### Rafael Campos

- Won the 2024 Butterfield Bermuda Championship just seven days removed from the birth of he and his wife's first child, Paola
- Became the second Puerto Rico native to win on the PGA TOUR and first since Chi Chi Rodriguez (eight wins between 1963-1979)
- Entered the 2024 Butterfield Bermuda Championship at No. 147 in the FedExCup Fall standings with 13 missed cuts in his previous 15 starts; has missed 10 cuts in 12 starts heading into this week's event; best finish this season: T34/Mexico Open at VidantaWorld
- Fourth appearance at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship (T18/2019, MC/2020, Won/2024)
- With 21 putts in a third-round 62 in 2024, tied the record for the fewest putts in a round in tournament history
- Best finish by a defending champion at this event: T12/Brian Gay/2021
- Winner of The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at The Abaco Club in 2019 on the Korn Ferry Tour

#### Tyler Watts

- Lefthanded high-school senior from Huntsville, Alabama makes second PGA TOUR start after finishing T53 in the 2025 Procore Championship amongst a field that included 10 U.S. Ryder Cup Team members
- Verbally committed to the University of Tennessee
- Earned a spot in the Butterfield Bermuda Championship as the top performer in the 2025 Men's Elite Amateur Cup, a collective series of seven of the top amateur events contested throughout the summer
- Owns an impressive amateur resume as the youngest to win the 2023 Alabama State Amateur Championship (15), runner-up in the 2024 U.S. Junior Amateur and youngest in tournament history to win the 2025 Sunnehana Amateur (17), setting a tournament scoring record in the process (19-under 261)
- Was named to the 2025 AJGA Rolex Junior All-America First Team and represented the United States at the 2024 Junior Presidents Cup (1-1-1 record)

#### Sahith Theegala

- Winner of the 2023 Procore Championship seeks second PGA TOUR victory in his second appearance at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship (74<sup>th</sup>/2022)
- Looking for his first top-10 finish this season after recording nine top-10s in 2024, which culminated in him finishing No. 3 in the FedExCup standings
- Best finish this season: T17/The Genesis Invitational
- Has finished T27 in his last two starts at the Baycurrent Classic and Bank of Utah Championship

#### **Butterfield Bermuda Championship notes**

- The Butterfield Bermuda Championship is being played for the seventh time with three past champions in the field: **Seamus Power** (2022), **Camilo Villegas** (2023), **Rafael Campos** (2024)
- Each of the six past champions were three or more strokes behind after the opening round en route to victory
- At No. 42 in the Official World Golf Ranking, recent winner of the Bank of Utah Championship **Michael Brennan** is the highest-ranked player in the field; finished T59 in his first start as a PGA TOUR member at last week's World Wide Technology Championship
- Nine-time PGA TOUR winner **Matt Kuchar** makes his first appearance at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship; seeks first victory since the 2019 Sony Open in Hawaii; made 14 cuts in 16 starts this season with one top-10 finish (T5/John Deere Classic); moved to No. 110 in the FedExCup Fall standings after posting his second-highest finish of the season at last week's World Wide Technology Championship (T11)
- With 28 birdies in his 2022 Butterfield Bermuda Championship win, **Seamus Power** holds the tournament record for most birdies in the event; Power is the only player in tournament history to make three birdies in a single tournament at the par-3 16<sup>th</sup> hole (rounds 1-3), the signature hole at Port Royal Golf Course (2022)
- Before his runner-up finish at the 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge, **Matti Schmid's** best result on TOUR came at the 2023 Butterfield Bermuda Championship (3<sup>rd</sup>)
- Vince Whaley, who has the most consecutive rounds of par or better this season (32), owns three top-10 results in four appearances at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship (T5/2024, T8/2023, T7/2021, MC/2020); sits No. 86 in the FedExCup Fall standings

#### Additional player notes

- All players who received unrestricted sponsor exemptions earned their way into the field via a range of opportunities offered by the Butterfield Bermuda Championship:

  - Oscar Couilleau, a 2026 Arizona State commit, won the 2025 Monroe Invitational (14-under 266) to earn a sponsor exemption; lefthander from France makes his PGA TOUR debut
  - Cayman Islands native Justin Hastings won the 2025 Latin America Amateur Championship; makes his eighth PGA TOUR start and second as a professional (T26/2025 Procore Championship)
  - Chase Johnson finished runner-up to Kevin Hall in the 2024 APGA Bermuda Championship at Port Royal Golf Course; Johnson accepted the spot in the field after Hall declined as he will represent the USA at the Deaf Olympics this week
  - Henry Smart won the 2025 Goslings Bermuda Open last month to earn a spot in the field; 36-year-old
     Englishman shot 70-67-71 at Port Royal Golf Course to win by two and make his first PGA TOUR appearance
  - Division II Lee University senior **Drew Zielinski** makes his PGA TOUR debut as a sponsor exemption after winning the Fripp Island Bermuda Invite; in October, Zielinski finished with three consecutive birdies to shoot a final-round 66 at Ocean Point Golf Links in South Carolina following opening rounds of 65-76 to win by two over teammate Bennett McNabb with a score of 207 (-9); Lee University also won the team title by 18 strokes

#### **Organizational Momentum**

- **Biltmore Championship in Asheville to debut in 2026:** The PGA TOUR, Biltmore Estate and Explore Asheville announced on Monday, Nov. 7 a new PGA TOUR tournament, the Biltmore Championship in Asheville, N.C., in conjunction with a media event at Biltmore Estate. Set to debut in 2026 during the FedExCup Fall, Biltmore Estate and Explore Asheville will serve as co-title sponsors of Asheville's first PGA TOUR event in more than 80 years, with the inaugural tournament set for Sept. 17-20, 2026, at The Cliffs at Walnut Cove.
- Final week for DP World Tour Top 10: With the DP World Tour's season finale this week at the DP World Tour Championship in Dubai, the top 10 players in the final Race to Dubai Rankings who are not otherwise exempt will earn PGA TOUR membership for the 2026 season.

#### **Tournament Focus**

- Destination Bermuda: Set to be played for the seventh time, the Butterfield Bermuda
   Championship is an opportunity showcase the unique scenery and culture of Bermuda to
   the world while producing significant economic impact in the local community. Charitable
   donations have surpassed \$5.3 million, and the event continues to partner with 60+ local
   vendors to help bring the tournament to life.
- **Bermuda Tourism Authority:** On October 14, Bermuda Tourism Authority announced a multi-year extension to continue as title sponsor of the Butterfield Bermuda Championship.

- Bermudians in the Field: Each year, Bermudian golfers are given the opportunity to qualify

  Championship.
  - 17-year-old amateur Oliver Betschart qualified for his second Butterfield Bermuda Championship and first since 2023, where he became the youngest player to compete in a PGA TOUR event since 2014 at the age of 15 years, 3 months, 8 days.
  - 42-year-old amateur Will Haddrell was the medalist at the qualifier and will make his tournament debut.
  - Recently-turned professional Kenny Leseur also qualified for the first time since
     2019. Leseur was 15 years, 9 months, 22 days when he made his tournament debut.

#### **Player Priorities**

- Rafael Campos: Entered the 2024 Butterfield Bermuda Championship at No. 147 in the
  FedExCup Fall standings and in need of a runner-up finish in either of his final two starts of
  the season to retain PGA TOUR membership. Claimed his first career PGA TOUR victory
  seven days removed from the birth of his first child and became the second player from
  Puerto Rico to win on TOUR. Had missed 13 of 15 cuts on TOUR entering the week.
- Sahith Theegala: In search of his first top-10 finish in his 22<sup>nd</sup> start in a season marked by injury (best finish: T17/The Genesis Invitational). Has finished T27 in his last two starts at the Baycurrent Classic and Bank of Utah Championship.
- Michael Brennan: Highest-ranked player in the field at No. 42 in the Official World Golf Ranking. Won the Bank of Utah Championship as a sponsor exemption to earn PGA TOUR membership and finished T59 in his first start as a member at last week's World Wide Technology Championship.

Earned a spot in the Butterfield Bermuda Championship as the top performer in the 2025 Men's Elite Amateur Cup, a collective series of seven of the top amateur events contested throughout the summer.

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR University Class of 2024 (No. 12), PGA TOUR Americas (2024, 2025)

- Making his second start as a PGA TOUR member and fifth career start on TOUR.
- Won the 2025 Bank of Utah Championship, becoming the 14th first-time winner on TOUR this season and the first sponsor exemption to win since Nick Dunlap at the 2024 American Express.
- Currently No. 40 in the Official World Golf Ranking and the highest-ranked player in the field.
- Finished No. 1 in the 2025 PGA TOUR Americas Fortinet Cup with three wins and 12 top-10 finishes (2025 wins: BioSteel Championship, CRMC Championship presented by Northern Pacific Center, ATB Classic).
- As a rookie, finished No. 18 in the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas Fortinet Cup with six top-25s and five top-10s in 10 starts (best finish: T3/Fortinet Cup Championship).
- After four seasons at Wake Forest University (2020-24), earned PGA TOUR Americas membership for 2024 after finishing No. 12 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2024.
- Tied for third alongside Curtis Strange in Wake Forest program history with eight individual titles, trailing only Bill Haas (10) and Gary Hallberg (9).

#### **Rafael Campos**

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Latinoamérica (2012-2015), Korn Ferry Tour (2016-2019, 2022-23)

- Defending champion of the Butterfield Bermuda Championship, where he earned his first PGA TOUR title in his 80th career start. Became the second player from Puerto Rico to win on the PGA TOUR, following World Golf Hall of Fame member Chi Chi Rodriguez (eight wins).
- Stands No. 192 in the FedExCup Fall standings, having missed 20 cuts in 29 starts this season.
- Puerto Rican and 2020 Olympian who regained PGA TOUR membership via the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour season, which awarded cards to the top 30 players on the points list. Previously earned PGA TOUR status after the 2019 Korn Ferry Tour season and competed on TOUR during the 2019-20 and 2020-21 seasons.
- Represented Puerto Rico in the 2020 and 2024 Olympic Games.
- Became the first Puerto Rican to win on the Korn Ferry Tour with his victory at the 2019 Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at the Abaco Club.
- Made 56 career starts on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica.
- Played collegiately at Virginia Commonwealth University from 2006–2010.

#### **Blades Brown** (Sponsor Exemption)

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: Korn Ferry Tour (2025)

- Making his eighth career PGA TOUR start and seventh start of the 2025 season; has made three cuts in seven career TOUR starts (T26/2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic; T34/2025 Mexico Open at VidantaWorld; T37/2025 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic).
- Earned a spot in this week's field as the 2024 AJGA Rolex Junior Player of the Year.

- Holds exempt membership on the Korn Ferry Tour for the 2026 season after finishing No. 68 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List (top 75 retain exempt status), despite beginning the season with no status.
- Earned Special Temporary Membership on the Korn Ferry Tour this season following a T7 finish at the 2025 Utah Championship presented by Zions Bank and Intermountain Health, surpassing the required 237.718 points threshold (equivalent to the No. 100 finisher on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List).
- His T2 finish at the 2025 Veritex Bank Championship marked the highest finish by a player under the age of 18 in Korn Ferry Tour history.
- Became the first player in Korn Ferry Tour history to make three cuts before turning 18; previously, the only
  player with multiple made cuts before age 18 was Si Woo Kim (two in 2013).
- Shared stroke play medalist honors (tied with Sampson Zheng and Jackson Buchanan) at the 2023 U.S. Amateur Championship at Cherry Hills Country Club, becoming the youngest stroke play medalist in event history at 16 years old.

#### **Justin Hastings** (Sponsor Exemption)

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR University Class of 2025 (No. 13), PGA TOUR Americas (2025)

- Making his eighth career PGA TOUR start this week via sponsor exemption; posted his career-best TOUR finish earlier this season with a T13 at the 2025 Mexico Open at VidantaWorld.
- Making his second FedExCup Fall start of the season after competing via sponsor exemption at the 2025 Procore Championship, where he finished T26.
- Played four seasons at San Diego State University (2021–25), recording the best career scoring average by an Aztec since 1993-94 (71.11), surpassing Xander Schauffele's 71.50.
- Finished No. 13 in the 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking, earning exempt membership on PGA TOUR Americas for the North America Swing and an exemption into Second Stage of the 2025 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry (Dec. 2-5, 2025).
- Made one Korn Ferry Tour start as a sponsor exemption (MC/2024 NV5 Invitational) and made three cuts in six starts on PGA TOUR Americas this season.
- Won the 2025 Latin America Amateur Championship in Buenos Aires at 16-under 272, earning exemptions into the 2025 Masters Tournament (MC), U.S. Open (T55) and The Open Championship (MC).
- Named the 2024-25 Mountain West Men's Golfer of the Year and a two-time All-Mountain West selection (2022-23, 2023-24); recorded four collegiate wins at San Diego State.
- Plays from Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands.

#### Tyler Watts (a) (Sponsor Exemption)

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: n/a

- Making his second career PGA TOUR start as a sponsor exemption after competing in the 2025 Procore Championship, where he finished T53.
- Earned a spot in the Butterfield Bermuda Championship as the top performer in the 2025 Men's Elite Amateur Cup, a collective series of seven top amateur events contested throughout the summer.
- Became the youngest winner of the Sunnehanna Amateur the first of seven events in the Elite Amateur Golf Series – at age 17, and set the tournament's 72-hole scoring record at 19-under 261. Past champions include Collin Morikawa, Rickie Fowler, Webb Simpson, and Lucas Glover.
- Was named to the 2025 AJGA Rolex Junior All-America First Team and represented the United States at the 2024 Junior Presidents Cup (1-1-1 record).
- In his second year as a member of the U.S. National Team; at the Sahalee Players Championship in September, finished T4 individually and led the USNDP to a fourth-place finish among 12 college teams.
- High school senior from Huntsville, Alabama, and a University of Tennessee commit.

#### **Chase Johnson** (Sponsor Exemption)

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Latinoamérica (2019), Korn Ferry Tour (2020), PGA TOUR Americas (2025)

- Making his 10th career PGA TOUR start this week and second appearance at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship, having previously played the event via sponsor exemption in 2023 (MC).
- Finished as the top performer in the APGA's 2025 World Wide Technology Player Development Program, earning the program's top bonus prize of \$7,500 to help offset touring expenses.
- Two-time APGA Player of the Year (2023, 2024) who received the Charlie Sifford Memorial Exemption into the 2024 Genesis Invitational, awarded by tournament host Tiger Woods.
- In addition to competing on the APGA Tour in 2025, played in all six Segment I events on PGA TOUR Americas, with a season-best finish of T19 at the Inter Rapidísimo Golf Championship.
- Played 32 Korn Ferry Tour events during the 2020-21 combined season after open qualifying into The King & Bear Classic at World Golf Village, where a T54 finish earned enough points to reshuffle and gain entry into The Ascendant presented by Blue, where he earned his career-best finish (2nd).
- Played one season on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica in 2019, making five cuts in 11 starts and recording one top-25.

#### Samuel Anderson (Open Qualifier)

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Latinoamerica (2022, 2023), PGA TOUR Americas (2024), Korn Ferry Tour (2025)

- Making his PGA TOUR debut this week at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship via open qualifying.
- In 26 Korn Ferry Tour starts this season, made 15 cuts and posted two top-10 finishes to place No. 72 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, retaining exempt membership for the 2026 season.
- Played his first full Korn Ferry Tour season this year after earning status by winning medalist honors at Second Stage of 2024 PGA TOUR Q-School.
- After two seasons on PGA TOUR Latinoamérica (2022, 2023), earned PGA TOUR Americas status for 2024 via a No. 2 finish in the 2023 Dev Series, and finished No. 15 in the 2024 Fortinet Cup Championship.
- Played four collegiate seasons at the University of Wisconsin (2017-21).

#### **Hunter Wolcott** (Open Qualifier)

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Americas (2024, 2025)

- Open qualifier making his PGA TOUR debut at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship.
- Finished No. 11 four points and one spot shy of earning Korn Ferry Tour membership for the 2026 season in the 2025 Fortinet Cup standings on PGA TOUR Americas. His 2025 season included his first TOUR-sanctioned victory at the Diners Club Peru Open, along with two additional top-10 finishes.
- Earned his first membership on a PGA TOUR-sanctioned tour in 2024 after advancing through PGA TOUR Americas mid-season Q-School.
- Played five collegiate seasons at the University of Tennessee (2016-22), recording nine career top-10s, including a win at the 2019 Hayt Invitational.

#### Jake Peacock (Open Qualifier)

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR University Class of 2025 (No. 19), PGA TOUR Americas (2025)

- 22-year-old open qualifier making his PGA TOUR debut at the Butterfield Bermuda Championship in his first season as a professional.
- In 10 PGA TOUR Americas starts this season, recorded two top-10 finishes and finished No. 65 in the Fortinet Cup standings, earning exempt membership for the 2026 season (top 80 retain status).
- Finished No. 19 in the 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking, earning PGA TOUR Americas status for the North America Swing and an exemption into Second Stage of PGA TOUR Q-School.
- Played three seasons at the University of South Florida (2022-25) after beginning his collegiate career at Western Carolina; won five collegiate titles.



# PGA TOUR COMPETITIONS OVERVIEW OF CHANGES FOR 2026

**EXEMPT STATUS** Exempt status for 2026 changes from top 125 to top 100 on the prior season's FedExCup Points List.

Players finishing between Nos. 101-150 will have conditional status and be broken into three different categories on the Priority Ranking: 101-110, 111-125 and 126-150. These three categories will have varying levels of access to Full-Field Events.

**FIELD SIZES** Beginning in 2026, the maximum number of players in a Full-Field Event will be 144 players\*, down from 156. Due to circumstances such as limited daylight, some events will have field sizes of 120 or 132.

\*The American Express, played on three courses, and the Genesis Scottish Open, co-sanctioned with the DP World Tour, maintain a field size of 156.

THE PLAYERS Championship field size will be 120 beginning in 2026.

These reductions in field sizes will have a positive impact on Speed of Play through a better flow of play on the golf course.

**SPONSOR EXEMPTIONS** Sponsor exemptions restricted to players in the DP World Tour/Korn Ferry Tour/Q-School category as well as those restricted to PGA TOUR members have been removed and reallocated to the next eligible members on the Priority Ranking.

**NOTE:** There are no changes to unrestricted sponsor exemptions, which are typically a standard of four.

**OPEN QUALIFYING** Open Qualifying spots have been eliminated for Full-Field Events with fields of 120 and reduced to two for fields of 132. Fields of 144, which make up the majority of Full-Field Events, maintain four Open Qualifying spots. There are no changes to Open Qualifying for Opposite Events and the FedExCup Fall, which maintain four spots.

#### FedExCup Fall Storylines

The 2025 Butterfield Bermuda Championship is the sixth event of the FedExCup Fall, a group of seven tournaments played after the TOUR Championship that finalizes eligibility for the 2026 PGA TOUR Season.

The top 50 players in the FedExCup standings through the TOUR Championship are locked in their positions while No. 51 and beyond carry their FedExCup points over.

**Aon Next 10** (players 51-60) through the FedExCup Fall will qualify for two Signature Events in 2025: AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational.

Winners of events during the FedExCup Fall receive a two-year PGA TOUR exemption, OWGR points and spots in THE PLAYERS Championship, RBC Heritage and PGA Championship in 2026

#### What's at Stake in the FedExCup Fall:

- Aon Next 10: Players in the Aon Next 10 through the RSM Classic will be eligible for the two west coast Signature Events (AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am and The Genesis Invitational)
- The Top 100: Will be fully-exempt for the 2026 PGA TOUR season
- 101-150: Earn conditional status on PGA TOUR next season
- In each of the last two season 10 of the 20 players to finish inside in Aon Next 10 qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs the following season
- In each of the last two seasons, five of the 20 players to finish inside in Aon Next 10 finished inside the top 50 of the FedExCup Standings the following season and five of players qualified for the TOUR Championship the following season
- 75% With four weeks left in the FedExCup Fall season, historically 75% of the players in the Aon Next 10 at this point finish the fall season in the final Aon Next 10, increasing by 15% from three weeks prior when the percentage was 60%.

### Michael Brennan, Rafael Campos, Sahith Theegala

- **87.50** Michael Brennan has a Driving Accuracy of 87.50%, the highest of any player in the 2025 FedExCup Fall season. Brennan also leads the PGA TOUR in average Strokes Gained: Off the Tee (+1.90) in the Fall. Brennan became a first time PGA TOUR winner in 2025, the third first time winner this season who was under the age of 24 when securing their win.
- **58.82** Rafael Campos is looking to become the first back-to-back winner of this event, securing his first career PGA TOUR win here in 2024. Campos's win made him the fourth International winner of this event. Campos has a Made Cut Percentage of 58.82% when playing international events, 29.87% higher than when playing events in the United States.
- **7.68** Sahith Theegala has a Made Putt PCT > 25' of 7.68% tied for the fourth highest of any player since 2024. Theegala has 81 Total Hole Outs since 2022, the third most of any player on the PGA TOUR in that span.

### Rico Hoey, Victor Perez, Danny Walker

- Going back to last season, Rico Hoey is 86-under par on Par 5's in FedEx Cup Fall events, the best of any player. Hoey has improved his approach game moving up 75 positions in Strokes Gained from Last Season. Hoey and Scottie Scheffler are the only two players ranked inside the Top 10 in both SG: Off-the-Tee and SG: Approach-the-Green.
- Victor Perez ranks inside the Top 10 in Greens in Regulation from locations Other than the Fairway and in Proximity to the Hole from the Rough (left and right). He and Nick Hardy are the only two players to rank in the Top 10 across all four of these categories. Perez has also performed better in international events than in the United States, making over 20% more cuts, recording three additional Top 10 finishes, and two more Top 5 finishes.
- **12.46** Danny Walker has made 12.46% of putts from beyond 20 feet this season, putting him on pace for the fifth-highest make percentage in a single season on the PGA TOUR since 2004. He is also averaging 82' 5" of Putts Made Per Round, the second-highest of any player on TOUR this season.
