Neal Shipley

- One of two recipients of the Champions' Choice selections into the Charles Schwab Challenge (other: Blades Brown)
- Winner of the 2025 LECOM Suncoast Classic is currently No. 5 on the Korn Ferry Tour Points List
- Finished T47 at the Valspar Championship in his only start on TOUR this season
- Has one top-10 finish in 11 career PGA TOUR starts: 2024 ISCO Championship (T6)
- Low amateur at the 2024 Masters Tournament and U.S. Open, the first to do so in the same season since Viktor Hovland in 2019

David Ford

- Will make his professional debut after recently finishing his senior season at the University of North Carolina, where he set UNC single-season records for wins (5), stroke average (68.78) and rounds in the 60s (25), among others
- Received a sponsor exemption for winning the 2024 Ben Hogan Collegiate Invitational, held at Colonial Country Club
- Projected to finish No. 1 in the PGA TOUR University Ranking and earn PGA TOUR membership, which will be official after the NCAA Championship concludes on May 28
- Finalist for the Ben Hogan and Fred Haskins National Player of the Year awards
- Will make his fourth PGA TOUR start: 2023 ISCO Championship (T58), 2023 RSM Classic (MC), 2024 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard (MC)

Davis Riley

- Seeks to join Ben Hogan (1946-47, 1952-53) as the only back-to-back winners of the Charles Schwab Challenge
- Finished T2 at last week's PGA Championship for his best finish in eight major championship starts (previous: T13/2022 PGA Championship)
- PGA TOUR wins (2): 2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans (with Nick Hardy), 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge
- Will make his fourth start at the Charles Schwab Challenge (T4/2022, MC/2023, 1st/2024)
- With a personal-best 72-hole score of 266, won in 2024 by five strokes over Scottie Scheffler and Keegan Bradley
- No. 42 in the FedExCup with three top-10 finishes in 15 starts (T6/Puerto Rico Open, 7th/Valspar Championship, T2/PGA Championship)

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1, reigning FedExCup champion and 15-time PGA TOUR winner in search of third victory of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship)
- Making sixth start at the Charles Schwab Challenge, with three straight top-three finishes (T2/2024, T3/2023, 2nd/2022)
- Third-round 63 marked his low score in 18 career rounds at Colonial Country Club
- Carried a three-stroke lead into the final round at the PGA Championship and won by five over Harris English, Davis Riley and Bryson DeChambeau; marked his 15th PGA TOUR win in his 140th start

- At the age of 28 years, 10 months, 27 days, joined Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods as the only players in the modern era to win 15 times, including three major championships, before the age of 29
- Now has three major championship victories in 23 starts (2022, 2024 Masters Tournament, 2025 PGA Championship), becoming the 48th player with three or more major victories
- 15th player to win the Masters Tournament and PGA Championship during career (previous: Rory McIlroy)
- Became the 65th player with 15 or more wins on the PGA TOUR; moves to T59 on the all-time wins list
- Joined Rory McIlroy and Sepp Straka as multiple winners this season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship)
- Wins in back-to-back starts for the fourth time
 - 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Masters Tournament
 - 2024 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship
 - 2024 Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage
 - 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship
- Last player to win three consecutive starts on TOUR: Dustin Johnson (2017 Genesis Invitational, 2017 WGC-Mexico Championship, 2017 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play)
- Fourth consecutive season with multiple wins (2022/4; 2023/2; 2024/7; 2025/2)
- Collects 750 points and moves from No. 4 to No. 1 in the FedExCup standings
- Tied the lowest 72-hole score in PGA TOUR history with his 253 total at TPC Craig Ranch en route to a wire-to-wire victory by eight strokes, the largest margin of victory on TOUR this season
- Will play his 500th round on the PGA TOUR during the first round

Jordan Spieth

- 2016 Charles Schwab Challenge is one of 13 PGA TOUR victories; seeks his first TOUR title since the 2022 RBC Heritage
- Missed the cut at the PGA Championship in bid to become the seventh player to win the Career Grand Slam
- 13th start of the season, with three top 10-finishes (T4/WM Phoenix Open, T9/Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, 4th/THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson); playing in the final year of his Tournament Winners exemption
- Will make his 13th start at the Charles Schwab Challenge, with eight top-10 finishes, including a win in 2016 and three runner-up finishes (2015, 2017, 2021); eight top-10 finishes is four more than any other player at the Charles Schwab Challenge since 2013

Charles Schwab Challenge notes:

- The PGA TOUR makes its fourth and final stop in the Lone Star State during the 2025 PGA TOUR Season, returning to Colonial Country Club for the 79th time since 1946, the longest-running host venue for a non-major on TOUR
- In addition to the Tartan Jacket and a spot on the Wall of Champions near the first tee, the champion of the Charles Schwab Challenge drives away in a one-of-a-kind prize car, a tournament tradition that began with Charles Schwab's title sponsorship in 2019; this year's prize car is a 1992 Schwab Defender
- Field headlined by 20 of the top 50 players in the Official World Golf Ranking, headlined by World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler, No. 7 Hideki Matsuyama, No. 11 Maverick McNealy and No. 14 Tommy Fleetwood
- Additional field features:
 - Nine players who finished inside the top 10 at last week's PGA Championship at Quail Hollow Club: **Scottie Scheffler**/Won, **Harris English**/T2, **Davis Riley**/T2, **Jhonattan Vegas**/T5, **J.T. Poston**/T5, **Ben Griffin**/T8, **Ryan Gerard**/T8, **Joe Highsmith**/T8, **Si Woo Kim**/T8
 - Three of the top 10 in the FedExCup standings, led by No. 1 Scottie Scheffler, who moved from No. 4 to No. 1 with his victory at the PGA Championship; others: Andrew Novak (No. 5) and Harris English (No. 10)
 - 10 past champions (11 wins): Daniel Berger (2020), Olin Browne (1999), David Frost (1997), Emiliano Grillo (2023), Chris Kirk (2015), Kevin Kisner (2017), Corey Pavin (1985, 1996), Davis Riley (2024), Jordan Spieth (2016)
 - Three past FedExCup champions: Brandt Snedeker (2012), Jordan Spieth (2015), Scottie Scheffler (2024)

- Colonial will continue to challenge players with its difficult three-hole stretch of Nos. 3-5 dubbed the "Horrible Horseshoe" by legendary late golf writer and Texas native Dan Jenkins.

2025 Charles Schwab Challenge Message Document

1. **A Texas Tradition:** The Charles Schwab Challenge marks the fourth and final stop in Texas during the 2025 PGA TOUR Season, returning to Colonial Country Club for its 79th anniversary, the longest-running host venue for a non-major on TOUR. Colonial Country Club is in its second year since undergoing a full-scale renovation led by Gil Hanse and Jim Wagner, with the course featuring a more natural and classic presentation while staying true to its original design and vision. Ben Hogan, winner of 64 PGA TOUR titles (fourth all time), is deeply ingrained in the history of the event, having captured the Charles Schwab Challenge on five occasions – including the inaugural event in 1946 – and spending most of his life in Ft. Worth.
2. **Field:** World No. 1 and last week's PGA Championship winner **Scottie Scheffler** makes his sixth career start at the Charles Schwab Challenge where he's finished inside the top three in the last three years (T2/2024, T3/2023, 2nd/2022). Scheffer, who enters the week with wins in his last two starts on TOUR (PGA Championship, THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson), is one of nine players in this week's field that finished inside the top 10 at the PGA Championship: **Scottie Scheffler**/Won, **Harris English**/T2, **Davis Riley**/T2, **Jhonattan Vegas**/T5, **J.T. Poston**/T5, **Ben Griffin**/T8, **Ryan Gerard**/T8, **Joe Highsmith**/T8, **Si Woo Kim**/T8. Other field highlights:
 - **Davis Riley:** With his T2 at the PGA Championship, this week's defending champion posted his best finish in eight career major championship appearances and his third top-10 finish on TOUR since his win at Colonial in 2024 (T6/2025 Puerto Rico Open, 7th/2025 Valspar Championship).
 - **Jordan Spieth:** Making his 13th tournament appearance, the 2016 champion has eight top-10 finishes at Colonial including four inside the top five (one win and three runner-ups), the most of any player since 2013. Spieth missed the cut at last week's PGA Championship in his ninth attempt to complete the Career Grand Slam.
 - **David Ford:** The former University of North Carolina standout will make his professional debut as a sponsor exemption after claiming the 2024 Ben Hogan Collegiate Invitational at Colonial. Ford is projected to finish No. 1 in the PGA TOUR University Ranking at the conclusion of the stroke-play portion of the NCAA Championship (May 26), making him eligible for PGA TOUR membership. Any FedExCup points he receives this week as a non-member will become official upon accepting membership.
3. **Prize Car:** In addition to the tartan plaid jacket and a spot on the Wall of Champions near the first tee, the champion of the Charles Schwab Challenge drives away in a one-of-a-kind prize car, a tournament tradition that began with Charles Schwab's title sponsorship in 2019. This year's prize car is a custom 1992 Schwab Defender, commemorating the year Schwab launched Mutual Fund OneSource. By introducing the first "mutual fund supermarket" in the industry, Schwab created an easier way for clients to diversify their portfolios. Defending champion Davis Riley received a 1975 Schwab Stingray.
4. **Remembering Grayson:** With the Charles Schwab Challenge marking the one-year anniversary since two-time PGA TOUR winner Grayson Murray's passing, the newly formed Grayson Murray Foundation will announce its first contribution of \$20,000 to the Ben Hogan Foundation during a ceremony on Tuesday at Colonial Country Club. As part of the ceremony, the Charles Schwab Challenge will also announce a \$10,000 donation to the Grayson Murray Foundation. The Grayson Murray Foundation was founded to raise awareness of mental health and addiction challenges faced by individuals from all walks of life, while advancing innovative services and research. Its partnership with the Ben Hogan Foundation will provide support for kids who have lost parents to suicide. With May being Mental

Health Awareness Month, the tournament will also distribute green pins to pay tribute to Murray and his legacy.

5. **First Tee Week:** The Charles Schwab Challenge aligns with “First Tee Week,” the youth development organization’s national campaign to raise awareness and celebrate the impact of its coaches. This year’s theme is “Dear Coach,” highlighting the unsung heroes of youth development who help kids build confidence, resilience and character. First Tee will host a fireside chat on Wednesday at the Charles Schwab Challenge to discuss the importance of coaches and the stories that have shaped First Tee ambassadors and alumni.
 - a. ***Confidentially***, on Friday, May 23, CBS Sports broadcaster Jim Nantz will be announced as the third Honorary Chair in First Tee’s history, following in the footsteps of President George W. Bush (2011-2024) and President George H.W. Bush (1997-2010). As Honorary Chair, Nantz will help promote First Tee's purpose and expand its reach to empower even more young people.
6. **Memorial Day weekend:** Held in its traditional position on the PGA TOUR schedule over Memorial Day weekend, the Charles Schwab Challenge will continue to place an emphasis on military support through several activations including a golf clinic through the On Course Foundation on Tuesday, a military home giveaway, military care packages, and a moment of silence and prayer during Sunday’s final round.

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: Korn Ferry Tour (2019-2021)

- Making his 117th PGA TOUR start and first individual title defense at the 2025 Charles Schwab Challenge.
- Earned his first PGA TOUR victory at the 2023 Zurich Classic of New Orleans with partner Nick Hardy. Earned his second TOUR title (his first as an individual) at the 2024 Charles Schwab Challenge.
- Began his rookie season on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2019 without status. Successfully Monday qualified into four events and received a sponsor exemption, which propelled him to Special Temporary Membership. One of Riley's two victories came at TPC San Antonio's Oaks Course, host of the PGA TOUR's Valero Texas Open.

David Ford

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: Currently No. 1 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2025; his college career at North Carolina is complete and the PGA TOUR University Ranking will be finalized May 26

- Will make his fourth career PGA TOUR start and first as a professional (non-member).
- Earned an exemption into the Charles Schwab Challenge by winning the Ben Hogan Collegiate Invitational at Colonial Country Club in October 2024, the first of five individual titles during his senior season at UNC. Carded rounds of 69-65-67 – 201 to win by three over Auburn's Brendan Valdes, currently No. 2 in PGA TOUR University.
- University of North Carolina career ended May 14 when the Tar Heels failed to advance from the NCAA Urbana Regional; Ford finished T11 individually and North Carolina finished sixth, one position away from qualifying for the NCAA Championship.
- Currently ranked No. 1 in PGA TOUR University; his PGA TOUR University record is complete, and the Charles Schwab Challenge will not be added to his record.
 - Ford is mathematically assured to finish No. 1 when the ranking is finalized after the conclusion of stroke play at the NCAA Championship (May 23-26; Omni La Costa Resort & Spa; Carlsbad, California).
 - The No. 1 player in the final PGA TOUR University Ranking will earn PGA TOUR membership for the remainder of the 2025 season and for 2026; the first event in which Ford may compete as a member is the RBC Canadian Open, June 5-8.
- One of three finalists for the Ben Hogan Award (to be presented on May 19) and one of 10 finalists for the Haskins Award presented by Stifel (voting concludes May 26).

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Canada (2021), Korn Ferry Tour (2022-24); with a win at the 2024 Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron, earned immediate PGA TOUR membership via the [Three-Victory Promotion](#)

- In his PGA Championship debut, Gerard finished T8 at Quail Hollow and moved up to No. 33 in the FedExCup points list.
- Returning to the PGA TOUR for the 2025 season following a top 30 finish (No. 12) on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List. Graduated to the PGA TOUR via the Korn Ferry Tour for the first time, doing so off the strength of his first Korn Ferry Tour title at the 2024 BMW Charity Pro-Am just outside Greenville, South Carolina.
- Earned Special Temporary Membership on the PGA TOUR during the 2022-23 season. Open qualified for the 2023 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, gaining entry to the event via a 5-for-3 playoff Tuesday morning. Finished solo fourth that week at PGA National Resort and followed it with a T11 at the Puerto Rico Open a week later. Secured Special Temporary Membership after the 2023 Valero Texas Open.
- Good friends with fellow University of North Carolina alum Ben Griffin. Gerard grew up playing junior golf against Griffin, and the two lived in the same apartment complex during Griffin's hiatus from golf in 2021. The two also spent a lot of time together when Gerard was a PGA TOUR rookie with Special Temporary Membership in 2023.

Ben Griffin

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Canada (2018-19), Korn Ferry Tour (2022)

- Won his first career TOUR title at the Zurich Classic of New Orleans with teammate Andrew Novak.
- Earned his first PGA TOUR card via the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour season after recording three runner-up finishes.
- Took a break from playing professional golf in April 2021. He accepted a job in property management and earned a license/transitioned into working as a mortgage loan officer in his hometown of Chapel Hill, North Carolina.
- Making his 14th start on TOUR this season. Has made 10 cuts, with three top-10s this season which included back-to-back T4 finishes at the Mexico Open at Vidantaworld and the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches.
- Won two U.S. Kids Golf Teen World Golf Championships at Pinehurst, winning the Boys 14 title in 2010 and the Boys 15-18 crown in 2011. The 2010 field included PGA TOUR winner Sam Burns, who finished T9. Griffin beat PGA TOUR member Will Gordon by a stroke to take the 2011 title.
- Won the 2013 AJGA Rolex Tournament of Champions over a field which included Doug Ghim (T4), Sam Burns (6th), Zecheng Dou (7th), Carl Yuan (9th), Scottie Scheffler (T10), and Cameron Champ (T15), in addition to earning a spot on the 2013 AJGA Rolex Junior All-America First Team with Scheffler and Collin Morikawa.
- Played four seasons at University of North Carolina (2014-18), earning All-America Honorable Mentions in 2015 and 2017 after winning three individual tournament titles.

Mac Meissner

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Canada (2021), Korn Ferry Tour (2022, 2023)

- Carded the eighth sub-60 round in Korn Ferry Tour history with a 12-under 59 in the second round of the 2023 LECOM Suncoast Classic at Lakewood National Golf Club in Lakewood Ranch, Florida. Meissner closed his round (which began on the back nine) with a birdie-eagle finish to post the 59.
- Finished No. 8 in the inaugural PGA TOUR University Class of 2021 after four seasons at Southern Methodist University (2017-21); his performance benefits included Forme Tour membership for the remainder of the 2021 season. Meissner won his third start on the circuit, becoming the first PGA TOUR University alum to win a professional event, and finished No. 5 on its Order of Merit to earn Korn Ferry Tour membership for 2022. [NOTE: the Forme Tour was a one-season variation created in place of PGA TOUR Canada, which had its 2020 and 2021 seasons canceled amid the COVID-19 pandemic.]
- Finished No. 20 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, earning his first PGA TOUR card (top 30 from Points List) in what was his second consecutive season on the Korn Ferry Tour.
- Finished No. 106 in the FedExCup Fall as a rookie in 2024 to retain his TOUR card for the 2025 season; currently sits 147th in the FedExCup.
- Born in Charleston, South Carolina and graduated from Alamo Heights High School in San Antonio. Currently resides in Dallas, where he attended Southern Methodist University.
- Played four seasons at Southern Methodist University (2017-21), winning twice individually, earning two All-America honors (third-team in 2019, second-team in 2020), and garnering the 2018-19 American Athletic Conference Golfer of the Year award. Meissner's two wins included medalist honors at the 2019 American Athletic Conference Championship.

Joe Highsmith

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Canada (2022), Korn Ferry Tour (2023)

- Earned his first PGA TOUR title at the 2025 Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches, where he became the first winner who made the cut on the number since 2016 (Brandt Snedeker/Farmers Insurance Open). Closed with back-to-back 64s on the weekend at the PGA National Resort (Champion Course), which marked the lowest final 36-hole score (128) in tournament history.
- Became the first player on record (since 1983) to make three holes-in-one in a single season in PGA TOUR history when he aced the 12th hole in the second round of the 2024 Wyndham Championship.
- Earned PGA TOUR membership for the first time via the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour season, which awarded TOUR cards to the top 30 players on the final Korn Ferry Tour Points List. Highsmith stood 56th on the Points List with six events remaining in the season, and he proceeded to post four finishes of T11 or better across those six

events, including finishes of T2 (Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship in Columbus, Ohio) and T3 (Korn Ferry Tour Championship) in the season's final two events en route to a No. 18 finish on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List.

- Finished No. 10 in the 2022 PGA TOUR University Ranking following a decorated, championship-winning career at Pepperdine University. Highsmith's PGA TOUR University performance benefits included PGA TOUR Canada membership for the 2022 season – which saw him record five top-10s in eight starts to finish No. 9 on the Order of Merit and earn Korn Ferry Tour membership.

Blades Brown

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: n/a

- Making seventh career PGA TOUR start, and his sixth start of the 2025 TOUR season; he has three made cuts in five career TOUR starts (T26/2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic; T34/2025 Mexico Open at VidantaWorld; T37/2025 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic). In the field via past Charles Schwab Challenge Champion selection.
- Recorded three made cuts in four Korn Ferry Tour starts this season, including a T2 at the 2025 Veritex Bank Championship; he needs another 52.551 points (roughly a solo-16th finish or higher) to earn Special Temporary Membership for the remainder of the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour season.
- His T2 finish at the 2025 Veritex Bank Championship marked the highest finish by a player under the age of 18 in Korn Ferry Tour history.
- Became the first player in Korn Ferry Tour history to record three made cuts prior to turning 18 years old; the only player to previously record multiple made cuts on Tour prior to turning 18 was Si Woo Kim (two in 2013).
- Finished T26 as an amateur at the 2024 ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, accomplishing the feat less than two weeks prior to his 17th birthday.

Neal Shipley

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Americas (2024), Korn Ferry Tour member (2025)

- Making his second PGA TOUR start of the 2025 season as a Charles Schwab Challenge past-champion selection.
- Stands No. 5 on the 2025 Korn Ferry Tour Points List after claiming his first win as a professional at the LECOM Suncoast Classic.
- Recorded eight made cuts in 10 starts on TOUR in 2024 (eight as a professional/two as an amateur), three of which he converted into top-25s, including a T6 at the 2024 ISCO Championship.
- Finished No. 20 in the 2024 PGA TOUR Americas Fortinet Cup standings in just five starts.
- Earned low amateur honors at the 2024 Masters Tournament and U.S. Open, becoming the first player since Viktor Hovland in 2019 to achieve the feat at both major championships in the same year.
- Played three seasons at James Madison University (2019-22), followed by two seasons at Ohio State University (2022-24); he graduated from James Madison with a degree in quantitative finance, and earned a master's degree in data analytics at Ohio State.

- Entered the 2023 season with conditional status on the Korn Ferry Tour and finished No. 37 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn fully exempt status for the 2024 season.
- Finished No. 9 in the 2022 PGA TOUR University Ranking and played the 2022 season on PGA TOUR Canada.
- Played four seasons at University of Mississippi (2018-22), amassing five career wins and earning two All-Southeastern Conference First Team honors.

OVERVIEW

Signature Events are limited-field events comprised of the top PGA TOUR players from the previous season's FedExCup as well as trending players from the current season who play their way in via the Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5. These eligibility pathways deliver compelling storylines and added consequence at Full-Field Events while impacting the season-long race for the FedExCup.

AON NEXT 10 and AON SWING 5

The Aon Next 10 and Aon Swing 5 are eligibility pathways for players, not already qualified, to play their way into Signature Events via the FedExCup standings.

- **Aon Next 10:** Top 10 available players, not otherwise exempt, from FedExCup standings. The Aon Next 10 will always fill to 10 players.
- **Aon Swing 5:** Top five available players, not otherwise exempt, who earn the most FedExCup points from events leading up to each Signature Event. The Aon Swing 5 will always fill to five players.

STORYLINES

The Memorial Tournament presented by Workday is the seventh of eight Signature Events in the 2025 PGA TOUR Season. The Aon Next 10 is made up of the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings through the Charles Schwab Challenge that did not finish in the top 50 of the 2024 FedExCup standings, while the Aon Swing 5 is made up of the five players (not already exempt) earning the most combined FedExCup points in the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic and Charles Schwab Challenge.

LAST WEEK ON TOUR: PGA Championship

Scottie Scheffler earned his third major championship title and the 15th win of his PGA TOUR career. **Harris English** finished T2, his best finish in 33 career major championship starts, and climbed from 24th to 10th in the FedExCup standings and now sits No. 2 in the Aon Next 10.

PLAYERS TO WATCH: Charles Schwab Challenge

Mackenzie Hughes and **Harry Higgs** sit inside the Aon Swing 5 standings after finishing T2 in the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic. Ryan Fox (not in the field) defeated Hughes and Higgs with a birdie-3 on the first playoff hole.

Hughes, a two-time PGA TOUR winner, has one top-10 finish (T8/2019) in five starts at the Charles Schwab Challenge. He enters this week with three top-10s in his last five starts (10th/Texas Children's Houston Open, T3/RBC Heritage, P2/ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic).

Higgs, a Dallas resident and SMU alum, is making his fifth career start in the Charles Schwab Challenge (best finish: T38/2020) and is bidding to earn his first start in a Signature Event this season.

Daniel Berger, No. 5 in the Aon Next 10, won the 2020 Charles Schwab Challenge, defeating Collin Morikawa in a playoff to earn his third PGA TOUR title.

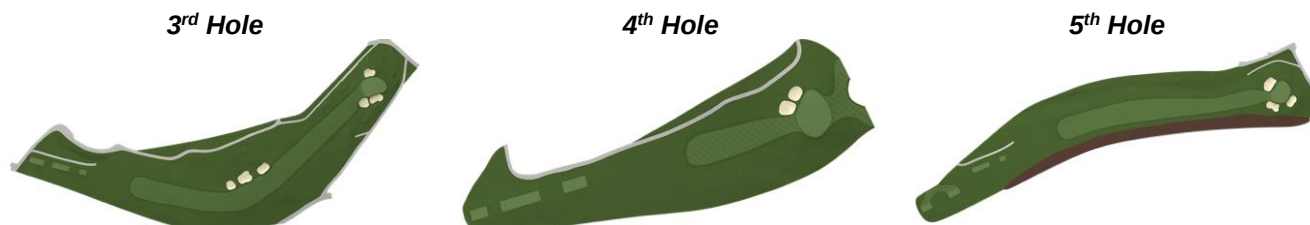
