Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 and reigning FedExCup Champion seeks to become first back-to-back winner of the FedExCup
- Making first start since earning 17th PGA TOUR victory and TOUR-best fourth win of the season (THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, The Open Championship)
- Four occasions with wins in back-to-back starts:
 - 2025 CJ CUP Byron Nelson, PGA Championship
 - 2024 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard, THE PLAYERS Championship
 - 2024 Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage
 - 2022 WGC-Dell Technologies Match Play, Masters Tournament
- Has finished inside the top 25 in all 16 starts this season, with a season-high 13 top-10 finishes (including 11 straight)
- Only player with top-10s in all four majors of 2025 (4th/Masters Tournament, 1st/PGA Championship, T7/U.S. Open, 1st/The Open Championship)
- Has three seasons with four or more wins (2022/4, 2024/7, 2025/4)
- FedExCup leader earned the top spot in the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 for the third time in four seasons, earning an \$8 million bonus
- Official Money total of \$19,202,883 is currently the second-highest in a single season in PGA TOUR history (\$28,148,691 in 2024 and \$19,138,342 in 2022-23)

Harris English

- Enters the week No. 7 in the FedExCup; one of three players inside the top 10 who did not finish inside the top 50 in the 2024 FedExCup (No. 6 Ben Griffin, No. 8 J.J. Spaun)
- Along with his fifth PGA TOUR victory at the Farmers Insurance Open, has four top-10s in 18 starts this season
- Making first start since finishing runner-up at The Open Championship; both runner-up finishes this season came to World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler at majors (PGA Championship/T2, The Open Championship/2nd)
- First PGA TOUR victory came at the 2013 FedEx St. Jude Classic; held the 54-hole lead at the 2021 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational before finishing solo fourth

Aldrich Potgieter

- At No. 43 in the FedExCup, set to make FedExCup Playoffs debut
- Of the 35 rookies on the PGA TOUR for the 2025 season, only rookie to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- 2025 Rocket Classic champion is one of three rookies to win on the PGA TOUR this season (Karl Vilips/Puerto Rico Open, William Mouw/ISCO Championship)
- Youngest winner on TOUR this season at the age of 20 years, 9 months, 16 days
- Became the ninth player since 1983 to win on TOUR before the age of 21
- One of two South African winners on TOUR this season (Garrick Higgo/Corales Puntacana Championship)
- Leads the TOUR in Driving Distance (327.6) and ranks second in SG: Off-the-Tee (0.686)

Justin Thomas

- 2017 FedExCup Champion will make his 10th FedExCup Playoffs appearance in his 11th season as a member
- No. 5 in the FedExCup has seven top-10s in 17 starts this season, including a win at the RBC Heritage
- Owns 16 victories on the PGA TOUR dating back to the 2015-16 season, third most in that span (Rory McIlroy/18, Scottie Scheffler/17)
- Won the 2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational at TPC Southwind

FedEx St. Jude Championship notes:

- The top 70 players qualified for the FedEx St. Jude Championship with the top 50 advancing to next week's BMW Championship at Caves Valley Golf Club and qualifying for all eight Signature Events in 2026. The first two Playoffs events will award 2,000 FedExCup points to the winner as all players vie to make the top 30 and qualify for the TOUR Championship at East Lake Golf Club in Atlanta where the FedExCup Champion will be crowned.
- The 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship marks the fourth playing of the event at TPC Southwind
- The field includes:
 - Six FedExCup Champions: Scottie Scheffler (2024), Viktor Hovland (2023), Patrick Cantlay (2021), Justin Rose (2018), Justin Thomas (2017), Jordan Spieth (2015)
 - Five past champions of the FedEx St. Jude Championship: Hideki Matsuyama (2024), Lucas Glover (2023), Tony Finau (2021), Jason Day (2015), Adam Scott (2013)
 - Two winners of previous events held at TPC Southwind: Justin Thomas (2020 WGC-FedEx St. Jude Invitational), Harris English (2013 FedEx St. Jude Classic)
- With 4,806 FedExCup points, **Scottie Scheffler** enters the FedExCup Playoffs with a 1,362-point lead over **Rory McIlroy** in the FedExCup standings, and 2,211 points clear of **Sepp Straka** (No. 3)
- **Sepp Straka** is one of six multiple winners on TOUR this season (The American Express, Truist Championship), his first multiple-win season since joining the TOUR in 2019; fell to Will Zalatoris on the third playoff hole at the 2022 FedEx St. Jude Championship
- **Matti Schmid** entered the Wyndham Championship at No. 70 in the FedExCup and remained in his position following a T31 finish, which included birdies on his final three holes at Sedgefield Country Club
- **Xander Schauffele** (No. 42) and **Tony Finau** (No. 60) have qualified for the TOUR Championship in eight consecutive seasons entering the FedExCup Playoffs, the longest active streak on TOUR
- **Tommy Fleetwood** (No. 9) is the highest-ranked player in the FedExCup standings without a victory on the PGA TOUR; has 12 top-25s in 16 starts this season, highlighted by a runner-up finish at the Travelers Championship
- Winner of last week's Wyndham Championship, **Cameron Young** earned his first PGA TOUR title in his 94th start and became the 1,000th unique winner on TOUR; Lucas Glover won the Wyndham Championship and the FedEx St. Jude Championship the following week in 2023
- **Chris Kirk** (T5; from No. 73 to No. 61) is the only player that moved from outside the FedExCup Playoffs bubble at the Wyndham Championship to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs
- **Daniel Berger** returns to the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time since 2021; finished T2 at the 2024 RSM Classic in the last start of his tournament winner's exemption to move from No. 127 to No. 100 in the FedExCup Fall standings and secure TOUR membership for 2025

PGA TOUR season notes

- Entering the FedEx St. Jude Championship, 29 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 through the Wyndham Championship. At No. 6, Ben Griffin is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024. For reference, 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.
- Of the 11 first-time winners in 2025, nine qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs: Thomas Detry (WM Phoenix Open), Brian Campbell (Mexico Open at VidantaWorld), Joe Highsmith (Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches), Min Woo Lee (Texas Children's Houston Open), Ben Griffin/Andrew Novak (Zurich Classic of New Orleans), Ryan Fox (ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic), Aldrich Potgieter (Rocket Classic), Ryan Gerard (Barracuda Championship)
- Of the 16 international victories of the 36 of the FedExCup Regular Season events, 10 players qualified for the FedExCup Playoffs: Hideki Matsuyama/Japan, Nick Taylor/Canada, Sepp Straka/Austria/2, Rory McIlroy/Northern Ireland/3, Thomas Detry/Belgium, Ludvig Åberg/Sweden, Viktor Hovland/Norway, Min Woo Lee/Australia, Ryan Fox/New Zealand/2, Aldrich Potgieter/South Africa

FedExCup and the FedExCup Playoffs

- The 2025 PGA TOUR Season marks the 19th edition of the FedExCup (established in 2007)
- The FedExCup is a season-long points competition which culminates with the FedExCup Playoffs, a series of three events to determine the FedExCup Champion

- The top 70 players in the FedExCup standings are eligible for the FedExCup Playoffs with the three events featuring a progressive cut with fields of 70 (FedEx St. Jude Championship), 50 (BMW Championship) and 30 (TOUR Championship)
- The FedExCup Bonus Distribution total is \$100 million, with the FedExCup Champion earning \$10 million
 - The top 70 players in the FedExCup standings are fully exempt for all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2026
 - The top 50 players are exempt for all Signature Events in 2026
 - The top 30 players receive a two-year exemption and invitations to majors that traditionally recognize the top 30
- **Top 50 bubble** – Following the FedEx St. Jude Championship, the top 50 players in the FedExCup will advance to the BMW Championship: Tom Hoge (No. 40), Matt Fitzpatrick (No. 41), Xander Schauffele (No. 42), Aldrich Potgieter (No. 43), Harry Hall (No. 44), Akshay Bhatia (No. 45), Si Woo Kim (No. 46), Jake Knapp (No. 47), Jordan Spieth (No. 48), Wyndham Clark (No. 49), Min Woo Lee (No. 50), J.T. Poston (No. 51), Kurt Kitayama (No. 52), Bud Cauley (No. 53), Joe Highsmith (No. 54), Aaron Rai (No. 55), Jhonattan Vegas (No. 56), Max Greyserman (No. 57), Stephan Jaeger (No. 58), Mackenzie Hughes (No. 59), Tony Finau (No. 60)

Organizational Momentum

- **FedExCup Enhancements:** The FedExCup Playoffs are taking the PGA TOUR fan experience to the next level in 2025, with everything from million-dollar giveaways and cutting-edge video games to exclusive on-site meetups with top content creators (view the full list of innovations [here](#)).
- **Reaching Younger Audiences:** The enhancements to this year's FedExCup Playoffs represent a larger shift in the PGA TOUR's growth and engagement with younger audiences. Half of the TOUR's audience across its social channels sits in the 18-34 demographic – including 61% on TikTok – while 41% of the audience that tuned into TGL were in the 18-49 demo, second only to the NBA among sports properties. New gaming updates coming online with the FedExCup Playoffs will further cater to golf's growing youth trend, including properties on 2K25, Roblox and GOLF+.
 - More than 100 million rounds have been played in PGA TOUR 2K25, with 70% of the players aged 13-34; about 65% of Roblox users are under the age of 18, introducing Ultimate Golf Simulator to a brand new audience; more than 679 million shots have been hit thus far this year on GOLF+, where the median user age is 35.
 - The National Golf Foundation reported that there were more on-course youth golfers in 2024 than any year since 2006; this segment has experienced the largest gains of any age group since 2019. Youth golfers (ages 6-17) are up 48% since 2019, while the 18-34 age group continues to rise (up 11% since 2019) as younger players engage with golf in a variety of new ways.
- **1000th PGA TOUR Winner:** With his first career PGA TOUR title at the Wyndham Championship, Cameron Young became the 1000th different winner in PGA TOUR history and the 12th first-time winner during the 2025 season. Having entered the week with seven career runner-up finishes, Young's victory served as a celebration of a long-awaited accomplishment as well as a reminder of how difficult it is to win on the PGA TOUR. The Wyndham Championship has served as the backdrop for several notable first-time TOUR winners in its 86-year history, including Seve Ballesteros (1978), Steve Elkington (1990), Brandt Snedeker (2007) and Webb Simpson (2011).
- **Field announced for Creator Classic at East Lake presented by YouTube:** [Fan-favorite content creators](#) return to golf's main stage in the Creator Classic at East Lake, the final stop in the 2025 Creator Classic Series presented by YouTube.
 - New to this year's TOUR Championship, YouTube will host a YouTube Creator Collective meetup, part of a global event series where YouTube gathers creators to build community. This special edition Creator Collective will bring together more than 50 creators for a curated experience where they will have a front row seat to the Creator Classic at East Lake, space to connect with one another and with teams

from YouTube and the PGA TOUR, and the opportunity to learn how YouTube golf creators are helping to drive the future of the sport alongside the PGA TOUR.

- ***Happy Gilmore 2* scores with fans:** Netflix announced last week that *Happy Gilmore 2*, the sequel to the popular 1990s film starring Adam Sandler, debuted to 46.7 million views, making it the biggest opening U.S. weekend all-time for a Netflix movie.
 - The TOUR's investment in Pro Shop, a co-producer of *Happy Gilmore 2*, reflects a shared commitment to expanding our presence across dynamic platforms that are reshaping how golf is experienced, enjoyed and perceived around the world.

Tournament Focus

- Memphis has been part of the PGA TOUR calendar since 1958, starting with the Memphis Open Invitational held at Colonial Country Club. The FedEx St. Jude Championship continues that tradition at TPC Southwind, which has been the permanent host of PGA TOUR golf in Memphis since 1989. As the first event of the FedExCup Playoffs, the tournament is a point of pride for the city, with the community showing support in many ways—including lighting the Hernando de Soto Bridge in tournament colors. The event also plays a significant role in the local economy, generating more than \$90 million in annual economic impact for the region.
- Paul Young, the Mayor of the City of Memphis, will issue a proclamation declaring Thursday, August 7, 2025, as "FedEx St. Jude Championship Day" in recognition of the tournament's longstanding charitable contributions, positive economic impact and the global exposure it brings to the city. The tournament will celebrate the occasion on-site with special fan appreciation initiatives and activations.
- Impact is at the core of the FedEx St. Jude Championship, supporting the lifesaving mission of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. Since 1970, the tournament has raised over \$80 million, ensuring families never receive a bill from St. Jude for treatment, travel, housing or food.

This year, the tournament proudly brings back several beloved traditions:

- FedEx Purple Eagle Plane Dedication (Wednesday, August 6): FedEx will unveil a plane named after Bailey, a St. Jude patient with a FedEx connection, continuing a 13-year tradition of honoring patients and spotlighting St. Jude's mission.
- Little Loopers: St. Jude patients serve as honorary caddies during Wednesday's Pro-Am presented by First Horizon Bank.
- Honorary Pin Flag Holders: During Sunday's final round, patients will stand greenside on the 18th hole and retrieve the flagstick as the final groups finish play.
- PGA TOUR caddies will wear custom bibs featuring artwork created by St. Jude patients during tournament play.
- The FedEx St. Jude Championship integrates key elements of Memphis culture into the fan experience. Guests can enjoy iconic Memphis barbecue and local culinary offerings, along with curated exhibits featuring authentic memorabilia on loan from Graceland and tributes to music legends such as Elvis Presley and B.B. King.

- Fred Smith, who passed away on June 21, 2025, was a transformative figure in the history of golf in Memphis. As the visionary leader behind FedEx's nearly 40-year partnership with the tournament, he helped elevate it into a world-class championship and a powerful force for good. His commitment led to over \$80 million raised for St. Jude Children's Research Hospital and other Mid-South causes. Fred's legacy will continue to inspire the FedEx St. Jude Championship and the Memphis community for generations to come.

To honor his memory, the tournament will hold a moment of silence on Saturday at 2:59 p.m., followed by the FedEx plane flyover at 3 p.m. Players and caddies will also wear commemorative lapel pins and ribbons in his honor. LED boards throughout the course will display a tribute in his memory during this time.

PGA Tour Commissioner Jay Monahan and CEO Brian Rolapp will be attending Smith's memorial service, which will take place Monday following the tournament.

Competitions Storylines

- Following the conclusion of the 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship, TPC Southwind has undergone its most extensive update in over 20 years. The project encompassed rebuilding and resurfacing all 18 greens complexes and the practice greens along with the resurfacing of all tee boxes.
- Qualifying for the FedEx St. Jude Championship in Memphis carries its own eligibility implications: it secures exemptions into all Full-Field Events and a spot in THE PLAYERS Championship in 2026. Those who finish Nos. 51 and beyond also carry their accumulated points into the FedExCup Fall, which can help them qualify for early 2026 Signature Events through the Aon Next 10.
- The 70 players in Memphis will make their final push toward the FedExCup title as they first seek to be inside the top 50 to advance to next week's BMW Championship. A spot in the BMW Championship offers exemptions into all Signature Events in 2026. Notable players on the 50 bubble include:
 - Jordan Spieth: The 2015 FedExCup champion and 13-time TOUR winner enters the week at No. 48 in the FedExCup in search of his first BMW Championship appearance since 2023.
 - Wyndham Clark: Three-time PGA TOUR winner enters the week at No. 49 in the FedExCup after finishing T12 or better in his last three starts to qualify for the Playoffs, including a T4 at The Open Championship.
 - Tony Finau: At No. 60 in the FedExCup, Finau is looking to extend his streak of eight consecutive TOUR Championship appearances, tied for the longest active streak (Xander Schauffele)
- In 2024, three players moved into the top 50 with their performance at the FedEx St. Jude Championship:

- Viktor Hovland's T2 finish moved him from 57th to 16th, giving him a chance to defend his FedExCup title.
 - Eric Cole's T18 finish moved him from 54th to 46th.
 - Nick Dunlap's T5 finish moved him from 67th to 48th.
- 29 of the top 50 players in the 2024 FedExCup standings are in the top 50 through the Wyndham Championship. At No. 6, Ben Griffin is the highest in the FedExCup standings among players that were outside the top 50 in 2024. For reference, 31 of the top 50 players in the 2023 FedExCup standings finished the 2024 season in the top 50 of the FedExCup standings.

Player Priorities

- **Scottie Scheffler:** World No. 1, reigning FedExCup Champion, and 17-time PGA TOUR winner has four victories on the season, including his most recent start at The Open Championship. Scheffler aims to become the first player in history to successfully defend the FedExCup title.
- **Hideki Matsuyama:** Defending champions is currently ranked No. 21 in the FedExCup standings thanks to his win at the season-opening event at The Sentry
- **Aldrich Potgieter:** The only PGA TOUR rookie to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs, Potgieter's 2025 regular season was highlighted by his first career PGA TOUR title at the Rocket Classic.
- **Matti Schmid:** Matti Schmid finished the regular season at No. 70 in the FedExCup standings, securing his first career appearance in the FedExCup Playoffs thanks to three consecutive birdies to conclude the Wyndham Championship.
- **Chris Kirk:** Six-time PGA TOUR winner enters the week at No. 61 in the FedExCup after being the only player to move inside the top 70 with his T5 finish at the Wyndham Championship.
- **Harris English:** Ranked No. 7 in the FedExCup standings, English returns to TPC Southwind, a course where he's consistently performed well. He captured his first PGA TOUR title there in 2013 and led through three rounds in 2021 before finishing fourth.
- **Xander Schauffele and Tony Finau:** Both have made it to the TOUR Championship eight years in a row, the longest active streak on TOUR. Schauffele sits at No. 41, while Finau, at No. 60 and outside the cut line, will both need strong showings this week in Memphis to keep their streaks alive.

- Captured his first career PGA TOUR victory at last week's Wyndam Championship in his 94th career start on TOUR

 - Monday qualified for the 2020 Pinnacle Bank Championship presented by Woodhouse, where he finished T11 and earned enough points for a spot in the WinCo Foods Portland Open, originally scheduled to be the regular season finale, the following week. Finished T14 in Portland and secured Special Temporary Membership with a T6 at the Albertsons Boise Open presented by Chevron.
- Captured back-to-back Korn Ferry Tour titles in May 2021, AdventHealth Championship and Evans Scholars Invitational presented by First Midwest Bank, en route to earning his TOUR card

Aldrich Potgieter

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: Korn Ferry Tour (2024)

- The only PGA TOUR rookie to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs, entering the week No. 43 in the FedExCup
- Rookie season was highlighted by his first career victory at the Rocke Classic in June, defeating Max Greyserman and Chris Kirk in a playoff
- Along with his victory, he recorded three top 10s with a runner-up finish at the Mexico Open at VidantaWorld, falling to Brian Campbell on the second hole of a sudden-death playoff
- One of three 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduates to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs (Brian Campbell, Ryan Gerard)
- Earned TOUR membership via a top 30 finish (No. 29) on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List; became the second-youngest graduate in Korn Ferry Tour history (20 years, 23 days), with the only Korn Ferry Tour graduate younger than Potgieter being Jason Day (19 years, 11 months, 23 days in 2007)
- At 19 years, 4 months, 11 days, became the youngest winner in Korn Ferry Tour history with his win at the 2024 The Bahamas Great Abaco Classic at the Abaco Club, usurping Jason Day as the youngest winner in Tour history
- Earned membership for the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour season by claiming medalist honors at Second Stage of 2023 PGA TOUR Q-School presented by Korn Ferry

- Won the 2022 Amateur Championship roughly three months before his 18th birthday, which made him the second-youngest winner in the history of the event; the only champion younger than Potgieter at the time was Matteo Manassero, who won the 2009 Amateur Championship at the age of 16

Joe Highsmith

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR University (2022), PGA TOUR Canada (2022), Korn Ferry Tour (2023)

- Second-year PGA TOUR member qualifies for the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time at No. 54 in the FedExCup
- 2025 campaign was highlighted by his first career victory at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches back in March, logging a two-stroke margin of victory over Jacob Bridgeman and J.J. Spaun
- Finished No. 110 in the FedExCup Fall standings as a rookie
- Earned PGA TOUR membership in 2024 via the Korn Ferry Tour 2023 season, which awarded TOUR cards to the top 30 players on the final Korn Ferry Tour Points List. Highsmith stood 56th on the Points List with six events remaining, and he proceeded to post four finishes of T11 or better across those six events. In the season's final two events, finished T2 (Nationwide Children's Hospital Championship) and T3 (Korn Ferry Tour Championship presented by United Leasing & Finance) en route to finishing No. 18 on the Points List.
- Finished No. 10 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2022 following a decorated career at Pepperdine University, where he was a three-time All-West Coast Conference First Team selection and went 3-0 in match play as the Waves won the 2021 NCAA Championship.
- Highsmith's PGA TOUR University performance benefits included PGA TOUR Canada membership for the 2022 season, which saw him record five top-10s in eight starts to finish No. 9 on the Order of Merit, and he earned 2023 Korn Ferry Tour membership through the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour Qualifying Tournament (T24).

Jacob Bridgeman

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR University (2022), Korn Ferry Tour (2022-23)

- Second-year PGA TOUR member making the FedExCup Playoffs for the first time at No. 33 in the FedExCup
- In 24 starts this season, owns seven top 25 finishes and five top-10s, highlighted by a runner-up finish at the Cognizant Classic in The Palm Beaches back in March; did not record a finish higher than T11 (Sanderson Farms Championship) during his rookie campaign
- Finished No. 113 in the 2024 FedExCup Fall standings as a PGA TOUR rookie
- Finished No. 14 on the 2023 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, earning his first PGA TOUR card (top 30 from Points List) in his first full season on Tour
- Finished No. 2 in the PGA TOUR University Class of 2022, only trailing No. 1 Pierceson Coody from University of Texas; performance benefits included exempt membership for remainder of the 2022 Korn Ferry Tour season
- Played four seasons at Clemson University (2018-22), winning five times individually, with the crown jewel being medalist honors at the 2022 Atlantic Coast Conference Championship en route to earning the 2022 ACC Player of the Year award

Brian Campbell

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: Korn Ferry Tour (2016, 2024)

- Qualifies for the FedExCup playoffs for the first time at No. 34 in the FedExCup
- Captured two wins in his return season on TOUR, claiming his first PGA TOUR victory at the Mexico Open at VidantaWorld – defeating Aldrich Potgieter in a sudden-death playoff – and recording his second win via a playoff over Emiliano Grillo at the John Deere Classic
- One of three 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduates to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs (Aldrich Potgieter, Ryan Gerard)
- Finished No. 7 on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List, earning PGA TOUR membership for the 2025 season
- Returned to the Korn Ferry Tour after a No. 180 finish in the FedExCup during the 2016-17 season
- Graduated from the Korn Ferry Tour for the first time in 2016

- Played four seasons at University of Illinois (2011-15), winning four times individually -- including two NCAA Regionals -- and helping the Fighting Illini to team titles at the Big Ten Conference Championship in 2012, 2013, and 2015

Ryan Gerard

Pathway to the PGA TOUR: PGA TOUR Canada (2022), Korn Ferry Tour (2024)

- Making his FedExCup Playoff debut this week at No. 31 in the FedExCup
- Claimed his first PGA TOUR victory last month at the Barracuda Championship
- In 24 starts this season, owns nine top 25s with four top 10s and a runner-up finish to go along with his aforementioned victory
- One of three 2024 Korn Ferry Tour graduates to qualify for the FedExCup Playoffs (Aldrich Potgieter, Brian Campbell)
- After beginning the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour season as a conditional member, earned a return to the PGA TOUR with a No. 12 finish on the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List behind four top 10s, including a victory at the BMW Charity Pro-Am presented by TD SYNEX
- Relegated to the Korn Ferry Tour for the 2024 season after finishing outside the top 150 in the FedExCup Fall

FedEx St. Jude Championship Notes

- The course was built on the site of a former dairy farm and two original grain silos and a windmill remain standing on the course. The two silos on the first and ninth holes inspired the member-only logo at TPC Southwind
- TPC Southwind is a fully certified member of the Audubon Cooperative Sanctuary Program, demonstrating its commitment to environmental stewardship through sustainable golf course management. It was one of the first golf courses in the state of Tennessee to be certified.
- The par-3 11th hole is one of the course's signature holes, featuring an island green that requires a short iron shot, considered by some to be a smaller version of the famous 17th Island Green at TPC Sawgrass.
- TPC Southwind has a course dog, Millie, who both belong to Nick Bisanz, the Director of Golf Course Maintenance Operations.
 - Millie is an 11-year-old Border Collie and had been on the course since she was nine weeks old



TPC Southwind Course Renovation

- TPC Southwind underwent a golf course renovation following the 2024 FedEx St. Jude Championship and will reopen in August for the 2025 event.
- The project included rebuilding and resurfacing all 18 greens complexes and practice greens, resurfacing tee boxes, and upgrading portions of the irrigation system.
 - Work on the greens recaptured square footage to allow for additional hole locations as well as returning the green surrounds to Zeon Zoysia for a firmer, better draining playing surface.
 - Tees were resurfaced with drainage to improve year-round playing conditions.
 - Upgrades made to fairway irrigation to provide single-head control which will allow the TPC Southwind agronomy team to keep areas of the golf course from becoming too wet or too dry.
- The greens were last resurfaced in 2004, when only the top four inches were replaced. This year's resurfacing extended to the sub-surface level, ensuring the greens continue to perform at a premium standard.
- Following the 2025 FedEx St. Jude Championship, the course will reopen for play on August 12.
