Keegan Bradley

- U.S. Ryder Cup Captain is making his fourth start at the Wyndham Championship (T46/2016, T42/2017, T22/2024)
- Has five top-10 finishes in 17 starts this season, winning the Travelers Championship for his eighth PGA TOUR victory
- Victories in back-to-back-to-back seasons for the first time on TOUR
- No. 10 in the FedExCup standings

Rickie Fowler

- Making his fourth start at the Wyndham Championship (T22/2016, MC/2021, MC/2022)
- Finished T7 at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday for his lone top-10 finish in 18 starts this season
- Top-20 finishes in two of his last three starts: John Deere Classic (T18), The Open Championship (T14), 3M Open (T28)
- Last of his six PGA TOUR wins came at the 2023 Rocket Classic
- No. 61 in the FedExCup standings

Ryan Gerard

- First-Year Member making his second start at the Wyndham Championship (MC/2023)
- Finished 12th in the 2024 Korn Ferry Tour Points List to earn his PGA TOUR card for 2025
- Has nine top-25 finishes in 23 starts this season, led by his first TOUR win in his most recent start at the Barracuda Championship and a runner-up finish at the Valero Texas Open
- Finished T8 at the PGA Championship at Quail Hollow Club in Charlotte
- One of 11 first-time winners this season is currently No. 29 in the FedExCup standings
- Raleigh, North Carolina native played five seasons at the University of North Carolina (2017-22), winning once individually and garnering 2022 All-America Second Team and All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors

Ben Griffin

- One of six multiple winners this season (Zurich Classic of New Orleans, Charles Schwab Challenge)
- Has eight top-10 finishes in 24 starts this season, including four consecutive (T8/PGA Championship, 1st/Charles Schwab Challenge, 2nd/the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday, T10/U.S. Open)
- Making his fourth start at the Wyndham Championship, with top-10 finishes in 2022 (4th) and 2024 (T7)
- Born and raised in Chapel Hill, North Carolina and played four seasons at the University of North Carolina (2014-18), where he won three individual tournament titles
- No. 7 in the FedExCup standings

Jackson Koivun

- No. 1-ranked player in the World Amateur Golf Ranking competing on a sponsor exemption
- Rising Auburn University junior became the third player to earn TOUR status through PGA TOUR University Accelerated (joining Vanderbilt's Gordon Sargent and Florida State's Luke Clanton) and will be eligible to take up PGA TOUR membership at the conclusion of his collegiate career
- First college player to sweep the Fred Haskins, Ben Hogan, Jack Nicklaus and Phil Mickelson national awards in the same season (2024)
- Making his eighth PGA TOUR start and sixth this season; has top-15 finishes in his last two starts (T11/John Deere Classic, T6/ISCO Championship)
- Making his debut appearance at the Wyndham Championship

Adam Scott

- Making his seventh start at the Wyndham Championship, with top-10 finishes in 2021 (T2) and 2023 (T7)
- Has five top-25 finishes in 16 starts this season (best: T12/U.S. Open); last top-10 in a standard stroke-play event came at the 2024 BMW Championship (T2)
- No. 85 in the FedExCup standings; needs a 2-way T3 finish or better to move inside the top 70
- Finished inside the top 30 in the 2024 FedExCup standings and is exempt on TOUR thru 2026

Jordan Spieth

- 13-time PGA TOUR winner in search of his first victory since the 2022 RBC Heritage
- Making his fifth start at the Wyndham Championship, with one top-10 finish (2nd/2013)
- Has four top-10 finishes in 17 starts this season, including THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson (4th) and WM Phoenix Open (T4)
- 2015 FedExCup Champion enters the week No. 50 in the FedExCup standings

Bubble Notes

- Following the Wyndham Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings will advance to the FedEx St. Jude Championship; every player ranked from Nos. 60-80 in the FedExCup standings are in the field: Tony Finau (No. 60), Rickie Fowler (No. 61), Davis Riley (No. 62), Kevin Yu (No. 63), Erik van Rooyen (No. 64), Nico Echavarria (No. 65), Emiliano Grillo (No. 66), Cam Davis (No. 67), Patrick Rodgers (No. 68), Byeong Hun An (No. 69), Matti Schmid (No. 70), Nicolai Højgaard (No. 71), Keith Mitchell (No. 72), Chris Kirk (No. 73), Christiaan Bezuidenhout (No. 74), Gary Woodland (No. 75), Kevin Roy (No. 76), Alex Smalley (No. 77), Davis Thompson (No. 78), Eric Cole (No. 79), William Mouw (No. 80)

Wyndham Championship notes

- Since the inception of the FedExCup in 2007, the Wyndham Championship has played host to the FedExCup Regular Season finale (since 2008 at Sedgefield Country Club)
- This year marks the 86th annual Wyndham Championship, having been included on the PGA TOUR schedule since 1938 (the seventh-longest running TOUR event excluding the majors)
- The Wyndham Championship winner will receive 500 FedExCup points, a two-year exemption on the PGA TOUR and \$1,476,000; the winner will also be exempt for The Sentry, THE PLAYERS Championship, Masters Tournament and PGA Championship in 2026
- The Wyndham Championship boasts its strongest field in the FedExCup era (since 2007), with 21 of the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking and 22 of the top 50 in the current FedExCup standings.
- **Aaron Rai** is seeking to become the first player to successfully defend at the event since Sam Snead in 1956
- **Kurt Kitayama**, winner of last week's 3M Open, seeks to become the first to win back-to-back tournaments since Scottie Scheffler (2024 Masters Tournament, RBC Heritage)
- **David Ford**, the No. 1 player in 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking and University of North Carolina product, will make his Wyndham Championship debut as a sponsor exemption. Ford won the AJGA's 2020 Sedgefield Invitational at Sedgefield Country Club.
- Additional field highlights:

- The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 will share a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1-ranked player earning \$8 million
- Two players in the field, **Ben Griffin** (No. 7) and **Keegan Bradley** (No. 10) will look to solidify their position in the top 10, while three players in the field can play their way into the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10:
 - **Hideki Matsuyama** (No. 23): Win
 - **Robert MacIntyre** (No. 15): Solo 2nd or better
 - **Andrew Novak** (No. 12): 5-way T3 or better

Message Document: 2025 Wyndham Championship

Organizational Momentum

- **Brian Rolapp:** Brian Rolapp [officially assumed his role as CEO](#) on Monday, July 28. He joins the PGA TOUR after spending more than two decades with the National Football League, where he helped reshape how fans experience live sports and most recently served as the league's Chief Media and Business Officer.
 - Rolapp, who was officially announced as CEO on June 17, is here to help the PGA TOUR move faster, think bigger and deliver more for fans, players and partners.
 - Since being announced, Rolapp has joined player meetings at the Travelers Championship and Rocket Classic and began visiting one-on-one with players. He also participated in the Sun Valley Conference (his interview with CNBC's Squawk Box is available [here](#)), has spent time with leadership from our three domestic media partners, CBS' David Berson, NBC's Mark Lazarus and ESPN's Jimmy Pitaro, and joined recent meetings with the TOUR management team.
 - While we still have significant work to do, his hire is further proof that the TOUR is on the right track. Commissioner Jay Monahan, who formed the search committee to find Rolapp and endorsed his choice, will remain in the Commissioner role through the end of his current contract (EOY 2026) and will immediately begin transitioning his day-to-day responsibilities to Rolapp while maintaining his ongoing Board responsibilities. The management team reports to Rolapp going forward, and he reports to both Boards of Directors.
- **Rapid Rounds:** The PGA TOUR and its media partners last week announced *Rapid Rounds*, the latest enhancement to stem from the TOUR's Fan Forward initiative. The [press release](#) accompanied [this story](#) in *Sports Business Journal* detailing the TOUR's 2025 media enhancements and the ongoing support of its media partners – CBS Sports, ESPN, Golf Channel and NBC.
 - *Rapid Rounds* is an easy new way for fans to catch up on every shot from the biggest names on CBS, Golf Channel and NBC telecasts plus Featured Group/Marquee Group players on PGA TOUR LIVE on ESPN+ (note: our partners have agreed to this as a 2025 test).
 - Fan Forward research told us that seeing more highlights and round recaps was the single-largest category of fan preference among six content enhancement options (44% of casual fans / 42% of core fans). The project was also of particular interest to the PGA TOUR's Fans, Tournaments and Sponsors Player Advisory Council Subcommittee.

Tournament Focus

- As the final event of the FedExCup Regular Season, the Wyndham Championship once again plays a critical role in shaping the top 70 in the FedExCup standings, with those players advancing to the following week's FedEx St. Jude Championship.
- Founded in 1938 as the Greater Greensboro Open, the Wyndham Championship is North Carolina's oldest professional golf event and one of the longest running tournaments on the PGA TOUR. Now entering its 86th edition, the event is important in North Carolina's community pride with the historic Donald Ross-designed Sedgefield Country Club serving as the backdrop for the dramatic conclusion to the PGA TOUR's Regular Season.
- As relief efforts continue in parts of Western North Carolina following the devastation caused by Hurricane Helene last September, the Wyndham Championship is expanding its charitable footprint to support the Donald Ross-designed Asheville Municipal Golf Course, which lost its front nine due to the hurricane's raging flood waters. Funds will also be directed to support First Tee – Central Carolina, which conducts programming at the course. To keep the Asheville Municipal Golf Course – which opened in 1927 – in operation as it rebuilds its lost nine holes, the Wyndham Championship will raise funds through several avenues during tournament week, including a 50/50 Raffle, 5K race and donation opportunities at the Pro-Am Pairings Party.
- Title sponsor Wyndham Rewards helps create a unique "Summer Vacation" atmosphere that comes to life through its on-site experience and several of its fan venues, including Club Wyndham Beach, located in its traditional "beachside" location near the 15th green for Wyndham Rewards Members. In addition to first-place prize funds, the winner of the Wyndham Championship also receives 1 million Wyndham Rewards points, which is enough for approximately four months of hotel stays.

Competitions Storylines

- As the final event of the Regular Season, the Wyndham Championship will determine the 70 players who advance to the FedEx St. Jude Championship. Along with a berth in the FedEx St. Jude Championship, the top 70 players in the FedExCup standings through the Wyndham Championship will be fully exempt for all Full-Field Events and THE PLAYERS Championship in 2026. - The Wyndham Championship will also determine the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10. The Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10 is a season-long competition that rewards the top 10 players in the FedExCup standings through the end of the Regular Season by sharing a \$40 million bonus, with the No. 1 player receiving \$8 million.

- The Wyndham Championship boasts its strongest field in the FedExCup era (since 2007), with 21 of the top 50 in the Official World Golf Ranking and 22 of the top 50 in the current FedExCup standings.

Player Priorities

- **Keegan Bradley:** U.S. Ryder Cup Captain is No. 10 in the FedExCup, one of two players in the field ranked inside the top 10 in the FedExCup (Ben Griffin/No. 7); looking to secure his position inside the Comcast Business TOUR TOP 10
- **Jordan Spieth:** Enters the week at No. 50 in the FedExCup with sights set on a strong finish to secure his position inside the top 50 and become exempt into all Signature Events in 2026.
- **Adam Scott:** At No. 85 in the FedExCup, needs at least a 2-way T3 finish or better to move inside the top 70; seeking his first top-10 finish of the season (best: T12/U.S. Open)
- **David Ford:** The University of North Carolina product and No. 1-ranked player in the 2025 PGA TOUR University Ranking received a sponsor exemption to compete in his home state. Ford won the 2020 AJGA Invitational at Sedgefield Country Club and now makes his PGA TOUR debut on the same course.
- **Ben Griffin:** Another UNC alum, Griffin has built a consistent presence on TOUR and is looking to continue his rise with two wins already this season. The Chapel Hill native adds to the strong North Carolina storyline at Wyndham.
- **Ryan Gerard:** A former Tar Heel and Raleigh native, Gerard's season has been one of momentum. At No. 29 in the FedExCup standings, the First-Year Member collected his first career PGA TOUR victory in his most recent start at the Barracuda Championship.
- **Webb Simpson:** A fan favorite and Wyndham ambassador. Simpson has a deeply rooted history at Sedgefield that includes winning in 2011. The North Carolina native is approaching his 17th career start at the Wyndham and continues to attract fans to the tournament.
