Aaron Rai

- 2024 Wyndham Championship winner claimed his second PGA TOUR title, and first major championship, at last month's PGA Championship
- Makes fourth appearance at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (T26/2022, MC/2023, MC/2025)
- Low round at Muirfield Village: 69/R3/2022
- Seeks to become the second player from England to win the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (Justin Rose/2010)

Wyndham Clark

- 2023 U.S. Open champion claimed his fourth PGA TOUR victory at last month's CJ CUP Byron Nelson where he shot a final-round 60 (-11) for a 254 (-30) total to win by three strokes over Si Woo Kim
- One of four players on record to post a final-round 60 or better on the PGA TOUR and go on to win – and the only player to achieve this feat twice: David Duval/1999 American Express (59), Stuart Appleby/2010 Greenbrier Classic (59), Tommy Gainey/2012 RSM Classic (60), Clark/2024 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro-Am (60)* and 2026 CJ CUP Byron Nelson (60): *54 holes due to weather
- Owns one top-25 finish in six appearances at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (T12/2023)
- Owns one sub-70 score in 18 rounds at Muirfield Village (68/R1/2022/finished T37)

Rory McIlroy

- 2026 Masters Tournament winner seeks to become the sixth different player (eight instances) to have won the Memorial Tournament and THE PLAYERS Championship or a major championship in the same season: Raymond Floyd (1982), Curtis Strange (1988), Paul Azinger (1993), Tiger Woods (1999, 2000, 2001), Scottie Scheffler (2024, 2025)
- Making his first start on TOUR since finishing T7 at the PGA Championship
- Most recent player to defend a title on TOUR (2026 Masters Tournament)
- 30 PGA TOUR victories marks the most of any player in the field; one of 10 players in the field with 10 or more PGA TOUR titles
- One of 16 major champions in the field this week
- Has made 11 cuts in 13 starts at this event, with five top-10 finishes (best: T4/2016)

Scottie Scheffler

- World No. 1 and 20-time PGA TOUR winner in search of second victory of the season (The American Express)
- Seeks to win the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday for the third consecutive year; last player on TOUR to win the same tournament in three consecutive years: Steve Stricker (2011 John Deere Classic); last player to win the Memorial Tournament in three consecutive years: Tiger Woods (1999-2001)
- A third victory at the Memorial Tournament (2024, 2025) would see him join Kenny Perry (1991, 2003, 2008) with the second-most in tournament history, behind Tiger Woods (1999, 2000, 2001, 2009, 2012)
- 2024 champion became the fourth winner of the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday to go on to win the FedExCup in the same season (Tiger Woods/2009, Patrick Cantlay/2021, Viktor Hovland/2023)
- Making his sixth career tournament appearance (T22/2020, 3rd/2021, 3rd/2023, Won/2024, Won/2025)
- Has made 75 consecutive cuts, the longest active consecutive cuts made streak on TOUR

Brandt Snedeker

- 2026 Presidents Cup U.S. Team Captain earned his 10th PGA TOUR victory last month at the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, his first TOUR victory since the 2018 Wyndham Championship; qualified this week by virtue of the Aon Swing 5
- Workday ambassador makes 11th appearance at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday
- After failing to advance to the weekend in his first six appearances at this event, has made three cuts in his four most recent starts at Muirfield Village, with T7 last year his best result as a sponsor exemption
- Posted two sub-70 scores in 26 rounds at Muirfield Village (69/R1/2012, 65/R4/2025)
- 45-year-old is one of three winners in their 40s this season (Justin Rose, Gary Woodland)
- Made the second ace of his PGA TOUR career en route to a T28 finish at last week's Charles Schwab Challenge

Additional player notes

- **Justin Thomas** and **Patrick Cantlay** are the only players in the field to have won the Jack Nicklaus Award presented annually to the best golfer in men's college golf (Cantlay/2011, Thomas/2012) and the Jack Nicklaus Award for PGA TOUR Player of the Year (Thomas/2017, Cantlay/2021)
- 2022 U.S. Open champion **Matt Fitzpatrick** owns three victories in 2026, the most of any player this season (Valspar Championship, RBC Heritage, Zurich Classic of New Orleans); Workday ambassador has recorded three top-10s at this event (3rd/2020, T9/2023, T5/2024) despite never posting a better opening-round score of 73 in seven appearances
- Charles Schwab Challenge winner **Russell Henley** claimed his sixth career PGA TOUR victory and first since the 2025 Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard; the World No. 5 has two top-10s in nine starts at Muirfield Village (best: T5/2025)
- **Si Woo Kim** has made 15 cuts in 15 starts this season, including seven top-10 finishes, tied with Scottie Scheffler for most this season; has made nine cuts in 10 appearances at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday (WD/2017) where his best result is 4th in 2023
- **Alex Smalley**, who owns two runner-up results this season (PGA Championship, Zurich Classic of New Orleans), is one of 12 players in the field seeking their first PGA TOUR victory; seven players have made the Memorial Tournament their first PGA TOUR title (most recent: William McGirt/2016)
- Six-time PGA TOUR winner **Rickie Fowler** makes his 17th appearance at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday; in 54 rounds at Muirfield Village, his low 18-hole score is 65, which came in his first career round at this event (R1/2010/finished 2nd)
- **Lucas Glover** makes his 22nd consecutive appearance at the Memorial Tournament, the longest active streak by any player in the field

the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday notes

- This year marks the 50th anniversary of the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday and the fifth year with Workday as the presenting sponsor
- This year's Memorial Tournament Honoree is David Graham, a two-time major champion and 1980 Memorial Tournament winner; additionally, the Captains Club will posthumously honor golf pioneer and early St. Andrews professional Allan Robertson during Wednesday afternoon's ceremony
- Seventh of eight Signature Events during the 2026 PGA TOUR Season; the last 14 Signature Events have been won by a different player (since 2025 Sentry)
- As one of the three player-hosted invitationals, the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday will feature a 36-hole cut to the low 50 players and ties and any player within 10 strokes of the 36-hole lead
- The field includes:
 - Nine of the top 10 in the FedExCup standings
 - Nine of the top 10 in the Official World Golf Ranking
 - Six past winners of the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday: **Justin Rose**/2010, **Matt Kuchar**/2013, **Hideki Matsuyama**/2014, **Patrick Cantlay**/2021, 2019, **Billy Horschel**/2022, **Scottie Scheffler**/2025, 2024
 - Five Jack Nicklaus Award winners as PGA TOUR Player of the Year: **Scottie Scheffler** (2022, 2023, 2024, 2025), **Patrick Cantlay** (2021), **Rory McIlroy** (2012, 2014, 2019), **Justin Thomas** (2017), **Jordan Spieth** (2015)
 - Nine players who finished inside the top 10 in last week's Charles Schwab Challenge: **Russell Henley**/1st, **Eric Cole**/2nd, **Ben Griffin**/T3, **Mac Meissner**/T3, **Alex Smalley**/T3, **Nico Echavarria**/T6, **J.J. Spaun**/T6, **Gary Woodland**/T6, **Ryan Gerard**/T10
 - Four sponsor exemptions restricted to PGA TOUR members: **Tony Finau**, **Billy Horschel**, **Matt Kuchar**, **Patrick Rodgers**
- Players earning spots in the field via the Aon Next 10 (top FedExCup points earners through the Charles Schwab Challenge): **Alex Smalley**, **Min Woo Lee**, **Kristoffer Reitan**, **Nicolai Højgaard**, **Adam Scott**, **Jake Knapp**, **Gary Woodland**, **Aaron Rai**, **Alex Fitzpatrick**, **Nico Echavarria**
- Players earning spots in the field via the Aon Swing 5 (top FedExCup points earners from this season's ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson and Charles Schwab Challenge): **Wyndham Clark**, **Eric Cole**, **Brandt Snedeker**, **Mac Meissner**, **Mark Hubbard**
- One qualifying spot is available for The Open Championship and will go to the leading player (not otherwise exempt) who makes the cut at the Memorial Tournament
- A playoff has decided the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday in six of the last 12 years (most recent: 2023/Viktor Hovland def. Denny McCarthy)
- Muirfield Village Golf Club has hosted the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday annually since the inaugural event in 1976 and has also hosted the 1992 U.S. Amateur, 1987 Ryder Cup, 1998 Solheim Cup, 1986 U.S. Junior Amateur and 2013 Presidents Cup; only course in the United States to host the Ryder Cup, Solheim Cup and Presidents Cup

Aon Next 10 and Swing 5

- The top five players, not otherwise exempt, who earned the most FedExCup points in the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic, THE CJ CUP Byron Nelson and Charles Schwab Challenge qualified for the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday through the Aon Swing 5
- **Eric Cole, Mac Meissner and Mark Hubbard** will each compete in their first Signature Event of the season. Cole and Meissner moved into the Aon Swing 5 following their performance in the Charles Schwab Challenge, with Cole collecting his third career runner-up on TOUR while Meissner's T3 was the fourth top-five finish of his career. Tournament Focus

- **50th Anniversary:** The tournament is celebrating its 50th anniversary in 2026, with Muirfield Village being one of nine venues on the 2026 schedule that has hosted a TOUR event for five or more decades. Roger Maltbie won the first edition of the Memorial Tournament in 1976, with tournament host Jack Nicklaus claiming his first of two titles in 1977 (other: 1984). The tournament continues to reflect its three founding pillars: Honor, Showcase and Benefit. It stands to honor the game's greats, showcase the game's best on a renowned stage for the enjoyment of fans, and benefit charity.
- **Muirfield Village:** What started as land where Jack Nicklaus and his father, Charlie, would hunt has become one of the most revered venues on TOUR. Named in tribute to Muirfield and the Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfers in Scotland where Nicklaus won The Open Championship in 1966, Muirfield Village was the first course to be built with amphitheater viewing for fans and continues to test the PGA TOUR's best on an annual basis.
- **Captains Club:** Founded by Jack Nicklaus, the Captains Club is an international group of champions, administrators and influential individuals who have contributed significantly to the game of golf. This year's honorees are Australian and two-time major champion **David Graham** and early St. Andrews professional **Allan Robertson** (posthumously). The Captains Club Ceremony will take place on Wednesday, June 3 at 1:30 p.m. ET.
- **Past Champions:** In celebration of the tournament's 50th anniversary, several of the event's past champions will be on site during the week:
 - Jack Nicklaus, 1977 & 1984, Host & Founder, Monday – Sunday
 - Roger Maltbie, 1976: Friday broadcast – Roger is planning to wear a throwback replica of his Sunday winning outfit, Wednesday - Sunday
 - Tom Watson, 1979 & 1996, Captains Club Member, Tuesday – Wednesday
 - Hale Irwin, 1983 & 1985, Captains Club Member, Tuesday – Wednesday
 - Paul Azinger, 1993, Captains Club Member, Tuesday – Wednesday
 - Jim Furyk, 2002, Captains Club Member, Tuesday – Wednesday

- **Workday:** Celebrating its fifth year as title sponsor, Workday has become fully ingrained in Jack’s tournament. In addition to its longtime support of Nationwide Children’s Hospital, the tournament benefits Eat. Learn. Play., which was established by NBA superstar Stephen Curry and Ayesha Curry, an entrepreneur, host and New York Times bestselling author. The organization is designed to ensure an equal road to success for all kids, rooted in three of the most vital pillars of a healthy childhood – nutrition, education and physical activity.
 - Workday ambassadors in the field: Matt Fitzpatrick, Matt Kuchar, Justin Rose and Brandt Snedeker.
 - Wednesday’s “Golden Legacy” pro-am includes Workday ambassadors Peyton Manning, Larry Fitzgerald, Amanda Balionis as well as other celebrity guests.

- **Play Yellow:** Sunday at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday is “Play Yellow Sunday.” Play Yellow, a Children’s Miracle Network program, unites the golf community to support children’s healthcare across the U.S. and Canada at over 170 hospitals. Founded through a partnership between Jack and Barbara Nicklaus, Children’s Miracle Network & the PGA TOUR, Play Yellow invites golfers, tournaments and fans to turn their passion for the game into life-changing care.
 - Play Yellow ribbons and one-of-a-kind towels will be available for players and caddies on Sunday. The towel includes artwork drawn by a child, Hayes, treated at Nationwide Children’s Hospital.
 - Play Yellow ambassadors in the field: Rickie Fowler, Chris Gotterup, Harry Hall and Denny McCarthy.

Competitions Storylines

- **Scheffler Goes for Three in a Row:** World No. 1 Scottie Scheffler will look to claim his third consecutive Memorial Tournament title and become the first player since Steve Stricker to win three consecutive titles on TOUR (2009-2011 John Deere Classic). Scheffler would also become the second player to win three in a row at the Memorial Tournament, joining Tiger Woods (1999-2001). A win for Scheffler would make him the third player with three or more titles at Muirfield Village (Tiger Woods/5, Kenny Perry/3).

- **Challenge of Muirfield Village:** Jack Nicklaus’ Muirfield Village has consistently delivered one of the most challenging tests on the PGA TOUR. Since 2023, Muirfield Village has played as either the toughest (2024) or second-toughest (2023, 2025) non-major venue on TOUR.

- **Player-hosted Signature Event:** As one of the three player-hosted invitationals (The Genesis Invitational, Arnold Palmer Invitational presented by Mastercard), the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday features a 36-hole cut (low 50 and ties and any

additional players within 10 strokes of the 36-hole lead) and a 20-percent prize allocation to the winner (\$4 million), up from 18 percent.

- **Aon Swing 5 / Next 10:** Both **Eric Cole** and **Mac Meissner** will each compete in their first Signature Event of the season qualifying for the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday as part of the Aon Swing 5. Cole collected his third career runner-up on TOUR while Meissner's T3 was the fourth top-five finish of his career.
- **Open Qualifying Series:** The Memorial Tournament presented by Workday is the next PGA TOUR event that is part of The Open Qualifying Series (OQS) where one spot will be available into the 154th Open at Royal Birkdale. The top player, not otherwise exempt, who makes the cut at the Memorial Tournament presented by Workday will earn an exemption. In the event of a tie for a qualifying place, the player with the higher ranking in the OWGR at the beginning of the week will earn the spot.

Player Priorities

- **Scottie Scheffler:** Sixth career tournament appearance; finished solo third in back-to-back starts (2021, 2023) before his consecutive titles in 2024 and 2025; seeks to become first player since Tiger Woods (1991-2001) to win the Memorial Tournament in three consecutive years since and the first player since Steve Stricker (2009-2011 John Deere Classic) to win three consecutive titles on TOUR
- **Rory McIlroy:** First start on TOUR since a T7 at the PGA Championship; 14th appearance at Muirfield Village and first since 2024; owns five top-10s including a career-best T4 in 2016
- **Cameron Young:** T25 finish in 2025 marked his best finish in four career tournament appearances; coming off a T26 finish at the PGA Championship in search of his third title of the season
- **Aaron Rai:** First start on TOUR since claiming the PGA Championship; fourth tournament appearance, with a T26 in his tournament debut representing his best finish
- **Matt Fitzpatrick:** Workday ambassador leads the TOUR with three victories this season; has three top-10s in seven previous tournament starts (best: 3rd/2020)
- **Brandt Snedeker:** Workday ambassador claimed the ONEflight Myrtle Beach Classic for his 10th TOUR victory and first since the 2018 Wyndham Championship; finished T7 in last year's event as a sponsor exemption, his first top-10 in 10 appearances at Muirfield Village

1976 The Inaugural

In the opening round of the first Memorial Tournament Muirfield Village Golf Club proved it will be a test with only seven players shooting under par, including the winner Roger Maltbie (71). The third fewest players under par in an opening round at this event all-time. The week continued to play difficult with only four players remaining under par thru 36-holes, including Roger Maltbie (71-71 (-2)), one of six years with four or fewer players under par at the halfway point of the Memorial Tournament.

On the weekend, Maltbie shot a two under 70 for a two-stroke lead entering the Final Round. On Sunday Maltbie shot a 76 (+4) to put himself in the first aggregate playoff of this event, defeating Hale Irwin becoming the first champion at the Memorial Tournament at the age of 24 years old, currently tied for the third youngest player to win this event.

1977-1982 Key Facts

In **1977** Jack Nicklaus captured his 64th career win at the second annual Memorial Tournament. Nicklaus shot even par or better in all four rounds, joining Hubert Green (1977) as the first two players to shoot even par or better in all four rounds at the Memorial Tournament.

In **1980** the Australian David Graham became the first international player to win the Memorial Tournament. Graham ended the week at 8-under par, setting the 72 hole low score by a winner at this event that would not be matched until Jack Nicklaus' 8-under win in 1984.

In **1981** Keith Fergus captured his first PGA TOUR career win, becoming the first player to win their first PGA TOUR event at the Memorial Tournament. Since then there has been six other players (7 total) go on to capture their first career win at the Memorial Tournament (Last: 2016 William McGirt).

In **1982** Raymond Floyd trailed by nine strokes thru 36-holes and was 1-under par thru 36-holes. Floyd went on to shoot 6-under on the weekend to win, marking the largest 36-hole comeback at the Memorial Tournament All-Time.

50th Anniversary of the Memorial Tournament According to ShotLink

1983-1989 Key Facts

In **1983** Hale Irwin secured his victory at the Memorial Tournament after his playoff loss in 1976. Irwin shot (71 / 71 / 70 / 69) becoming the first player to play all four rounds under par at the Memorial Tournament.

In **1984** the 44 year old Jack Nicklaus claimed his 72nd PGA TOUR career win at the Memorial Tournament, becoming the first player to win this event multiple times and to this day is the third oldest player to win the Memorial Tournament at 44 years, 4 months and 6 days.

In **1986** in the third round of the Memorial Tournament, the 28 year old Clarence Rose made a hole in one on the par 3 4th hole becoming the first player to make a hole in one at the Memorial Tournament. From that day until 2005 four other players made an ace on the 4th hole, but it has been 21 years since the last on the 4th hole.

In **1987** Scott Hoch finished the first three rounds for a total of 198 (-18), setting the 54-hole low score at the Memorial Tournament that would not be tied until Jon Rahm in 2021.

1990-1999 Key Facts

In **1990** thru 18-holes Fred Couples held a 4-stroke lead, the largest 18 hole lead at the Memorial Tournament all-time.

In **1991** Kenny Perry became the second first time winner of the Memorial Tournament. En route to victory Perry made an Ace on the par 3 16th hole, becoming the first winner of this event make a hole in one on the way to win.

In **1994** Tom Lehman won by setting the tournament low 268 (-20) with only 3 bogeys or worse, tied for the fewest of any winner at the Memorial Tournament since 1983. Lehman was 9-under par on par 4's for the week, setting the lowest par 4 performance by a winner at this event since 1983.

In **1996** John Hutson shot a 61 in the second round, setting the low round score at the Memorial Tournament that remains un-beaten until this day. Hutson had 11 birdies or better, setting the most in a round at this event that would be tied by Adam Scott in the second round in 2007.

In **1999** Tiger Woods captured his ninth PGA TOUR career win at the age of 23 years old, the second youngest winner at the Memorial Tournament all-time.

2000-2010 Key Facts

In **2000** Tiger Woods earned his second consecutive win at the Memorial Tournament, becoming the first player to win the event in back to back years. This would become the first event that Tiger Woods successfully defended his title in his PGA TOUR career. En route to victory Woods lead by 6 strokes thru 54-holes, setting the largest 54-hole lead/co-lead at the Memorial Tournament that would not be matched until Jon Rahm in 2021.

In **2001** Woods became the first player to win the Memorial Tournament three times and is the only player to win it 3 consecutive years, unless Scottie Scheffler successfully wins in 2026. En route to victory Woods made three eagles, two in the opening round, tied for the most of any winner at this event. Woods shot a 66 in the final round winning by a total of 7 strokes, the largest winning margin at the Memorial Tournament.

In **2002** Jim Furyk entered the final round 5-strokes back. He went on to shoot 65 with 7 birdies or better, tying the largest 54-hole comeback at the Memorial Tournament all-time.

In **2008** Kenny Perry earned his 10th PGA TOUR career win at the Memorial Tournament at 47 years, 9 months and 22 days, becoming the oldest winner at the Memorial Tournament in history.

50th Anniversary of the Memorial Tournament According to ShotLink

In **2010** in the opening round Freddie Jacobson and Rory Sabbatini both went on to hit all 18 greens, becoming the first and only players to hit all 18 greens in a round at the Memorial Tournament in the ShotLink Era. Both players are tied for the longest consecutive greens hit streak at this event in the ShotLink Era.

2011-Current Key Facts

In **2014** Hideki Matsuyama earned his first PGA TOUR career win at the Memorial Tournament, becoming the fifth first time winner at this event and the first and only player from Japan to win. Matsuyama was 22 years, 3 months and 7 days when he won, the youngest winner at the Memorial Tournament all-time.

In **2019** in the Final Round, Patrick Cantlay entered the day four strokes back but that did not cause him any trouble after being 5-under thru 9 holes and would go on to finish the day shooting 64 and 8 total birdies. Marking the lowest final round by a winner at the Memorial Tournament and tied for the most birdies or better by a winner in the final round.

In **2023** in the second round on the second hole Austin Eckroat made an 80'8" putt for birdie, marking the longest putt made at the Memorial Tournament in the ShotLink Era. Ryan Fox would go on to make a 80'5" putt on the sixth hole in the final round in **2025**, the only two putts made over 80 feet at the Memorial Tournament in the ShotLink Era.

In **2024** Scottie Scheffler claimed his 11th PGA TOUR Career win. En route to victory Scheffler gained +12.96 strokes approaching the green, the most of any winner at the Memorial Tournament in the ShotLink Era.

In **2025**, Scottie Scheffler earned his second consecutive win at the Memorial Tournament joining Tiger Woods as the only players to win the Memorial Tournament in back to back seasons. Scheffler played holes 16-18 for the week three-under, five shots better than the field average and tied for the lowest that week on this stretch.

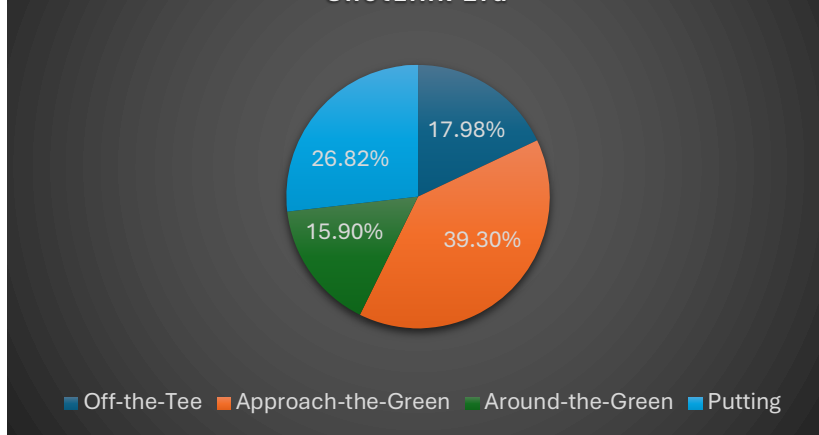
