

A1- Cold Open – Ben Hogan

BEN HOGAN: These young fellas out there that are starting, they need this sort of thing and we're helping provide it and I think it's the finest thing I've ever heard of. To give these boys a steppingstone to try and play on the major tour.

ANNC: Oh my goodness!

BEN HOGAN: It's starts them out early and it trains them how to compete.

ANNC: Scottie Scheffler will be a two-time winner on the Korn Ferry Tour.

ANNC: 16 career PGA TOUR titles for Scottie Scheffler.

BEN HOGAN: I wish I had the opportunity to do something like this.

A2 - Standup 1 - Open

FOR 35 YEARS, THE KORN FERRY TOUR HAS BEEN MORE THAN JUST A STEPPINGSTONE — IT'S BEEN THE LAUNCHPAD FOR SOME OF THE GREATEST CAREERS IN GOLF. A PROVING GROUND WHERE RAW TALENT IS REFINED, AND DREAMS OF THE PGA TOUR BEGIN TO TAKE SHAPE.

IT ALL STARTED BACK IN FEBRUARY 1990, WHEN THE BEN HOGAN TOUR TEED OFF AT THE BAKERSFIELD OPEN. AFTER A FEW EARLY ATTEMPTS TO BUILD A DEVELOPMENTAL CIRCUIT, THIS ONE STUCK — AND FROM THAT MOMENT, PROFESSIONAL GOLF CHANGED FOREVER.

FINALLY, THERE WAS A CLEAR PATH. A PLACE WHERE ASPIRING PROS COULD LEARN, GROW, AND COMPETE — ALL WHILE CHASING THE ULTIMATE GOAL: A SPOT ON THE PGA TOUR.

A3 - First Tournament Winner

REPORTER: How does it feel to be the first ever Ben Hogan TOUR winner?

MIKE SPRINGER: Nobody else will be a first winner, I think it's great.

MIKE SPRINGER: It's really the first organized tour I played on, it seems like it's going to be run first-class. I like how everything is, they record the scores after all the holes. They got leaderboards. I think it's going to do real well. I think it's going to be pretty successful.

MIKE SPRINGER: I'd like to thank the PGA especially for getting a tour started like this. It's tough going through tour school and it's a great pleasure to be able to play on this tour.

BOB DICKSON: We hope somewhere down the road that more and more players come from the Ben Hogan TOUR onto the regular tour, we think that's going to be a growing trend.

A4 - Early 90's Success

AS MIKE SPRINGER CAPTURED THE FIRST KORN FERRY TOUR TROPHY, AND THE TOUR HAD FOUND ITS FOOTING, SO DID A NEW GENERATION OF STARS. WEEK AFTER WEEK, THEY SHOWED THAT THE FUTURE OF GOLF WAS ALREADY HERE... AND THE KORN FERRY TOUR WASN'T JUST WORKING — IT WAS THRIVING.

2-TIME MAJOR CHAMPION JOHN DALY FINISHED THE 1990 SEASON WITH THREE RUNNERS-UP, AND A WIN AT THE UTAH CHAMPIONSHIP.

JOHN DALY: I'd like to thank the volunteers because I know yesterday was Saturday and it was a BYU football game and y'all were out here watching us play golf.

TOM LEHMAN: The PGA TOUR Card ... I'm not leaving the Hogan Tour without it.

TOM LEHMAN SECURED HIS TOUR CARD WITH THREE WINS IN 1991 AND LATER WON FIVE TIMES ON THE PGA TOUR, HIGHLIGHTED BY THAT 1996 OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP.

TOM LEHMAN: I think I'm capable of winning tournaments. I think if you can win on this tour, you can win on the PGA TOUR ...

“MR. 58”, AND 2024 PRESIDENTS CUP CAPTAIN, JIM FURYK EARNED HIS FIRST PROFESSIONAL WIN IN THE 1993 SEASON... AS DID A “MR. 59”, AND 2001 OPEN CHAMPION, DAVID DUVAL.

DAVID DUVAL: You gain a lot of experience of being under the gun playing in these tournaments for when you do get out on the big TOUR.

JIM FURYK: You always think of what you'd say if this would happen to you and now I can't think of anything. I just can't believe it happened ...

LITTLE DID GOLF FANS KNOW IT, BUT THEY WERE WITNESSING THE EVOLUTION OF LEGENDS IN THE GAME FROM THE ONSET OF THEIR PROFESSIONAL CAREERS.

A5 - 1995 Prominence

THE 1995 KORN FERRY TOUR CLASS WAS A FORCE WITH 27 TOTAL WINS ON THE PGA TOUR, HEADLINED BY JERRY KELLY, DAVID TOMS AND STUART APPLEBY REPRESENTED IN THE TOP FIVE IN THE FINAL STANDINGS.

ANNC: Jerry Kelly, he has a lot. Currently number one on the money list. Set a new earnings record in a single season on the Nike Tour.

JERRY KELLY: I told myself, "I'm not going back Q-School." It was a place that I did not want to go back to. I went and saw Bob Rotella right before that 95 season, and I stuck to my game plan all year long. That's what got me through.

DAVID TOMS: The goal was that year. I mean, I knew what the PGA tour was all about and it's like, I have to get back there.

ANNC: After three subpar seasons as a member of the PGA TOUR. David Toms lost his card and came to the Nike Tour to resurrect his game. Toms made 17 cuts and nine top ten finishes.

JERRY KELLY: It's the absolute grind and working as hard as possible to try and beat everybody out there. You know, still bunch of the same guys. David Toms, you know there's he was fighting me all the way to the last day of the Tour Championship to try and get that number one spot.

DAVID TOMS: I was able to win a couple of times, finish high enough to get my TOUR card fully exempt to play in 96, and then after that, I never really lost it again.

JERRY KELLY: You know, that first check making 30,000 was like, we're rich, we're rich. It's the best.

STEWART CINK'S 1996 SEASON WAS A DEFINING YEAR IN THE DECADE.

ANNC: Your Tour Championship winner for 1996, Stewart Cink headed to the PGA TOUR.

STEWART CINK: I saw the Korn Ferry Tour as like it was a goal of mine just to get there because right after college, I just wanted to have a place to play and start stepping up the ladder, and that's the way you did it.

ANNC: Very good work.

STEWART CINK: I played a few on the Korn Ferry Tour in '95, and I was in awe of how well everybody played. And you know, if you tee off at noon, you know, you start the day nine shots back on Thursday because someone shoots nine every day. And I was just like, how can I ever compete against this? You know, and then I got my feet wet. And then by 1996 when I was out there as a member, I had some good finishes early. I lost the playoff in the first tournament and felt like, hey, you know, now I'm doing what I was in awe of.

STEWART CINK: It was really big to my mental status and the way I saw myself getting into this whole puzzle.

ANNC: You're watching the 23-year-old Stewart Cink record breaking season, for him.

STEWART CINK: To have that kind of peer recognition and the scores reflected, you know, it was just a big way for me to sort of build confidence as I got to the ultimate goal of playing on the PGA tour.

REPORTER: Played great all year with three victories. Set a record of \$250,000 that it's going to take a while to be broken. But in addition to that, the way you've handled yourself this year as a professional, you're ready for the PGA TOUR and we're looking forward to having you on the PGA TOUR, congratulations.

STEWART CINK: And that just really capped off the year. You know I was going to finish first or second on the money list and get my card with no problem. But to win a third tournament there that, that week in front of my friends, family, fans and all that was really special.

ANNC: Stewart Cink, who was the leading money winner last year, makes birdie at the home hole to get a share of sixth. His best finish on the PGA TOUR.

STEWART CINK: I didn't play great my first probably four months I struggled. You know, getting used to the cities and the travel and all that stuff. But the patience is what grew within me.

ANNC: 267, which matches the tournament's 72-hole scoring record; 66 to close.

STEWART CINK: I think what I what I took from the Korn Ferry Tour that helped once I got to the PGA TOUR was knowing that you don't have to go out there and shoot a million under the first day, because I knew that if I just was patient, that I could get that four or five, six-under round and right back into it. And you know, it helped me achieve higher finishes and just more consistent performance and kind of got my feet on the ground out there, solidify my card for the next year. And then it was kind of gravy from there on out.

ANNC: Stewart Cink, a winner for the eighth time and the third time here at the RBC Heritage.

B1 – Standup 2

OVER THE YEARS, THE KORN FERRY TOUR HAS EVOLVED — WITH THAT EVOLUTION CAME NEW CHALLENGES, NEW OPPORTUNITIES, AND A NEW WAY TO EARN A PGA TOUR CARD... ENTER THE THREE-VICTORY PROMOTION.

IT'S SIMPLE IN CONCEPT, BUT TOUGH IN EXECUTION: WIN THREE TIMES IN A SINGLE SEASON, AND YOU CAN HEAD STRAIGHT TO THE PGA TOUR...

B2 – Three Victory Promotion

IN 1997, THE DEBUT YEAR OF THE THREE-VICTORY PROMOTION, CHRIS SMITH BECAME THE FIRST TO CAPITALIZE ON THE OPPORTUNITY.

REPORTER: So you're going to be on the PGA TOUR later this year?

CHRIS SMITH: Yeah, I think I probably will. I will have exempt status next year as a result of winning three tournaments this year and it's kinda neat because I was the first one to do it and they just put it in place this year

TIM FINCHEM: Players who are here are the future of the PGA TOUR and they are handling themselves quite well in perpetuating the values and traditions that got us this far.

B3 – 2001 Campbell, Slocum, & Bates (3 wins)

WHILE 14 PLAYERS WON TWICE IN A SEASON OVER THE NEXT THREE YEARS, NONE WERE ABLE TO REPLICATE SMITH'S FEAT...

UNTIL THE FLOODGATES OPENED IN 2001.

ANNC: It's happened twice in Omaha, Nebraska! Heath Slocum joins Chris Smith. Three wins in one year.

ANNC: Chad Campbell joins Heath Slocum on the PGA TOUR.

CHAD CAMPBELL: That was definitely the ultimate dream when I started playing and you know, definitely happy to achieve that.

PAT BATES: I'm just so thankful to be here and I feel like finally I'm ready to go to the show.

WHILE PAT BATES' THREE-VICTORY SEASON EARNED HIM A RETURN TO THE PGA TOUR FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 1995...

NAT: You made it, Dad you made it!!

ANNC: You did make it dad, in more ways than one.

IT MARKED THE BEGINNING FOR BOTH HEATH SLOCUM AND CHAD CAMPBELL AS THEY EARNED THEIR TOUR CARDS FOR THE FIRST TIME ... EACH WENT ON TO WIN FOUR TIMES AT THE GAMES' HIGHEST LEVEL

ANNC: Chad Campbell, Pat Bates and Heath Slocum, 3 men with 3 wins each.

B4 – Jason Gore 2005

JASON GORE KNOWS THE STRESS OF THE THREE-WIN PROMOTION ALL TOO WELL.

JASON GORE: It adds this element of pressure that you don't need when you're trying to win a golf tournament.

HIS 2005 SEASON WAS A ROLLERCOASTER OF REDEMPTION, DOMINANCE, AND HISTORY-MAKING MOMENTS.

JASON GORE 2005: Golf's a funny game, I mean I'm living proof of that, that things can change in a heartbeat.

ANNC: Jason Gore, back here from the PGA TOUR. He has struggled, he's only made three cuts this year.

JASON GORE: I think it was just a lack of confidence, I think it's such a big deal when you go out there like, "Am I going to play well?" You can't be wishy washy in this game.

AFTER TURNING PRO IN 1997, GORE SPENT THE BETTER PART OF 9 YEARS BOUNCING BETWEEN BOTH TOURS...

ANNC: One of the headliners coming into the week after that great run at the U.S. Open.

THAT 2005 U.S. OPEN WAS THE CATALYST FOR A MINDSET SHIFT.

ANNC: This is a changed man right here and it all stems from that U.S. Open performance where he was right at the lead teeing off on Sunday.

JASON GORE: At that point it was one of those things where I knew I could play with the best players in the world

ANNC: And there it is, Jason Gore wins back-to-back weeks.

JASON GORE: Ironically, Bill Haas, he goes, will you hurry up and win so you can get out of here? And I'm like yeah, I got you now.

THE FRIENDLY MOTIVATION LED GORE TO BECOME THE THIRD PLAYER TO CARD A 59 ON THE CIRCUIT IN HIS VERY NEXT START ... AND IN TURN, A SUDDEN DEATH PLAYOFF FOR ANOTHER CRACK AT THE PGA TOUR.

JASON GORE: You're thinking about it because you know like, this is it.

ANNC: Sayonara, big man, he's headed to the PGA TOUR. Three-straight wins

WITH HIS SIXTH WIN, GORE TIED THE MOST IN A CAREER IN KORN FERRY TOUR HISTORY ...

JASON GORE: I had so much confidence, the hole looked like the size of a peach basket. I was just going to go wake up every morning and find out how many birdies I was going to make that day.

NATS: Chanting Jason Gore

AND JUST SIX WEEKS AFTER HIS IMMEDIATE PROMOTION, GORE FINALLY REACHED HIS PGA TOUR SUMMIT.

ANNC: The magical ride continues in 2005. This for the win ... his first on the PGA TOUR.

JASON GORE: That's one of the great things that Korn Ferry Tour brings. Just such a huge part of my life and I'm grateful for it. It teaches you how to be, not only a professional, but it teaches you how to be a winner.

B5 – Other 2000's Headliners

MORE HEADLINERS WERE SEEN THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRETY OF THE 2000'S - WHO WENT ON TO LONG-TERM SUCCESS IN PROMINENT CAREERS.

ZACH JOHNSON'S 2003 KORN FERRY TOUR SEASON WAS ONE TO REMEMBER... HIS TWO WINS FORESHADOWED AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT ON THE PGA TOUR.

ANNC: Zach Johnson's got it! His first PGA TOUR victory!

ZACH JOHNSON: I hope there's many more to come.

11 MORE PGA TOUR WINS CAME AFTER THAT; HIGHLIGHTED BY A GREEN JACKET AND A CLARET JUG.

AND THE LIST OF MARQUEE NAMES CONTINUED TO GROW THROUGH THE DECADE.

ANNC: Oh Matt Kuchar! With an improbable birdie.

MATT KUCHAR: You've seen so many guys do so well that have graduated off the Korn Ferry Tour.

ANNC: Matt Kuchar wins for the 9th time in his PGA TOUR career.

MATT KUCHAR: I think it's proven to be the best proving ground. The guys that make it there, tend to come out here and be successful on the PGA TOUR.

MORE EVIDENCE CAME FROM JASON DAY IN 2007 – AND BEYOND. A PGA CHAMPIONSHIP IN 20-15 HIGHLIGHTED A CAREER OF LONGEVITY THROUGH TWO MORE DECADES.

ANNC: Jason Day is your champion in Texas!

ANNC: Excellent line and perfect putt!

KEEGAN BRADLEY: When I made the Korn Ferry Tour, to me, I had made it.

ANNC: It's just his rookie season. And that will move him inside the top 25 right now!

KEEGAN BRADLEY: If my career ended there, I could've said I made it.

NAT: Number one.

KEEGAN SOT That was as happy as I've ever been as a golfer.

IN HIS ROOKIE SEASON ON THE KORN FERRY TOUR, KEEGAN BRADLEY SECURED FIVE TOP-5 FINISHES... A TESTAMENT TO HIS DETERMINATION AND CONSISTENCY.

ANNC: This guy can tear up any golf course.

THAT STRONG FOUNDATION PROPELLED HIM TO IMMEDIATE PGA TOUR SUCCESS...

ANNC: Golf's got another young star in Keegan Bradley!

KEEGAN BRADLEY 2011: Oh my, I just don't know what to say. I'm so happy and I can't believe this just happened I really can't.

KEEGAN BRADLEY: I'm 1-0 on the PGA TOUR which is all that I care about right now.

BRADLEY THEN BECAME THE FIRST KORN FERRY TOUR GRADUATE TO WIN A MAJOR CHAMPIONSHIP IN HIS DEBUT SEASON, CEMENTING HIMSELF FROM PROMISING YOUNG TALENT TO GOLF'S ELITE – WHICH WE'VE SEEN THROUGHOUT HIS CAREER – TO HIS CURRENT DAYS.

ANNC: Keegan Bradley does it again!

BRADLEY TURNED THE PAGE ON ONE DECADE WITH A COMPETITIVE SPIRIT THAT SET THE STAGE FOR THE NEXT 10 YEARS ON THE KORN FERRY TOUR...

C3 – Standup 3 – Class of 2014

IN 2014, THAT LEVEL OF COMPETITION WAS AT A FEVER PITCH PRODUCING ARGUABLY THE MOST SUCCESSFUL GRADUATING CLASS THAT WOULD GO ON TO DOMINATE THE PGA TOUR WITH OVER 40 WINS AND COUNTING. LED BY JUSTIN THOMAS, TONY FINAU, AND MAX HOMA — THE CLASS OF 2014 DIDN'T JUST ARRIVE... THEY TOOK OVER.

C4 – Class of 2014 Feature

ADAM HADWIN: I think it's one of the strongest, if not winningest classes in history.

ADAM HADWIN: Probably 10 of us are still playing on TOUR now.

JUSTIN THOMAS: Everybody's paths to get them there are different, but also their paths past that point are very different.

ANNC: The wins for Justin Thomas, they just keep on coming.

THIS NEW STANDARD FOR COMPETITION DID NOT HOLD AGE AS A BOUNDARY...

ANNC: Alex Cejka, 44-years-old, he is finally a winner on the PGA TOUR.

AS THE SUCCESS ALSO CARRIED OVER TO PGA TOUR CHAMPIONS.

ANNC: Steven Alker, your season-long champion and taking the Charles Schwab Cup.

STEVEN ALKER: Korn Ferry Tour, there's always some guys hot that year. You know you got three or four or five of them. You can just see walking down the range the way they played and scores they were shooting, that they were going to be really good.

COLT KNOT: That was my third and final time. I graduated with a good finish at the first playoff event and Indiana, but you knew there were some stars coming and the likes of Finau, JT, Max Homa.

HOMA: We were young and a bunch of us, you know, come out of college that year and have played really well. I met new friends, but I also got to travel around and compete with friends at the same time.

TONY FINAU: I turned pro in 2007, and I didn't get to the Korn Ferry Tour until 2014, so the journey was long and tough, there's no question.

TONY FINAU: I feel overwhelmed, really. I don't think it's really sink in, I got a little bit of goosebumps going, you know, just thinking about how far I've come these last couple years.

TONY FINAU: These guys, we kind of have a bond because of that class.

ADAM HADWIN: I have very fond memories of traveling internationally because we were always together. There's a great sense of like kind of camaraderie around that.

JASON GORE: Tiger kind of brought in this influx of like really, really good athletes. You started to see these kids come up and they were just super athletic and super competitive. That was the time when everything started to change.

C5 – Scottie Scheffler 2019

WHILE THE CLASS OF 2014 LEFT ITS MARK...

THE CURRENT WORLD NUMBER ONE ALSO CONTINUES TO DO SO.

ANNC: Scottie they chant. And the Scheffler victory train just keeps on rolling.

AND SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER'S 2019 SEASON PROVED HE WAS BOUND FOR GREATNESS.

SCOTT SCHEFFLER: I'm more proud of who you are than your golf.

SCOTT SCHEFFLER: I always knew Scottie could be successful if he could get to the PGA TOUR. I didn't know if he could get through the Korn Ferry Tour.

ANNC: What a 2019, it has been for this former Texas Longhorn. The resume, impressive; three-time individual state champion; also won the U.S. Junior.

DAN McCARTHY: What I remember about it is, there are a lot of, a lot of tournaments where he would shoot even par, one under, two under in the first round. And by Sunday, on the back nine, he was always in the mix. He was tenacious.

ANNC: And that officially makes Scottie Scheffler a two-time winner on the Korn Ferry Tour in 2019.

ANNC: Two wins, two seconds, he's basically the best player out there and it shows.

SCOTT SCHEFFLER: Obviously he's capable of playing whatever level they put him out to keep going, and it's, it's almost surreal. It's like, wow. But it's, it's fun.

D1 - Standup 4 – 2020-2025

IN THE MODERN ERA, THE KORN FERRY TOUR HAS CONTINUED TO DELIVER ON ITS PROMISE — IDENTIFYING TALENT, SHARPENING SKILLS, AND PREPARING PLAYERS TO THRIVE ON GOLF'S BIGGEST STAGE.

SINCE THE 2020–21 COVID SUPER SEASON, WE'VE SEEN THE EMERGENCE OF STARS LIKE WILL ZALATORIS, ANDREW NOVAK, BEN GRIFFIN, AND AKSHAY BHATIA — PLAYERS WHO DIDN'T JUST EARN THEIR WAY TO THE PGA TOUR, THEY ARRIVED READY TO MAKE AN IMPACT.

D2 – Super Season Standup

ANNC: And Taylor Moore is a PGA TOUR winner

ANNC: Welcome to the wall of champions

ANNC: Taylor Pendrith is a PGA TOUR

ANNC: And the emotion from Zalatoris!

SINCE THAT CLASS CELEBRATED THE END OF THE 46-EVENT, TWO-YEAR SEASON, THEY HAVE PRODUCED 18 PGA TOUR VICTORIES ...

ANDREW NOVAK: We're here with the man you've all been waiting for. Great season, you know, he left us ... Best looking swing on Tour. Possibly the longest hitter of The 25

CAMERON YOUNG BEGAN THE YEAR PLAYING MONDAY QUALIFIERS AND MINI TOUR EVENTS FOR A CHANCE TO COMPETE...

HE TOOK ADVANTAGE OF THE OPPORTUNITIES, AND BROUGHT HOME BACK-TO-BACK VICTORIES TO SECURE HIS TOUR CARD.

AND VALIDATED HIS GAME WITH 2022 PGA TOUR ROOKIE OF THE YEAR HONORS.

WILL ZALATORIS BEGAN 2020 ON THE KORN FERRY TOUR, AND HIS EARLY SUCCESS EARNED HIM PGA TOUR STARTS, AND APPEARANCES INTO TWO MAJORS.

BUT HIS CROWNING MOMENT CAME IN 2022 WITH A WIN IN MEMPHIS.

ANNC OF FEDEX WIN: And he's got it, Zalatoris, is a PGA TOUR Winner.

D3 – McCarty 2024 Mini

MATT MCCARTY EMBODIED THE PERSEVERENCE IT TAKES TO PLAY ON THE KORN FERRY TOUR.

IN HIS SECOND SEASON, MCCARTY HAD PGA TOUR STATUS IN HIS GRASP, BUT AN UNTIMELY, QUADRUPLE BOGEY IN THE 2023 KORN FERRY TOUR CHAMPIONSHIP TARNISHED THOSE HOPES.

ANNC: Oh boy ... this has gotta go, oh no! No chance.

MATT MCCARTY: It was tough throughout the offseason, but I think it was very motivating. I think everything happens for a reason.

MCCARTY RESET, AND IN 2024, CAPTURED THREE WINS IN A SIX-EVENT STRETCH TO EARN THE SECOND THREE-VICTORY PROMOTION THIS DECADE

ANNC: The 26-year-old headed to the PGA TOUR.

REPORTER: Has it sunk in yet?

MATT MCCARTY: Yeah, no ... it hasn't (laughs).

MC: Here is your 2025 PGA TOUR card buddy.

MATT MCCARTY: I knew I was going to get it, but it's different having it for sure.

AND WITHIN A FEW MONTHS, MCCARTY BECAME JUST THE THIRD PLAYER TO WIN ACROSS BOTH TOURS IN THE SAME YEAR.

ANNC: Meet the newest PGA TOUR winner Matt McCarty.

MATT MCCARTY: To be able to do it this quickly, I don't know how you can expect this, to be honest.

D4 – Sub-60 Kickert

ANNC: Remember when it was a huge deal to break 60?

OTHER NOTABLE SCENES FROM 2024 SAW AN UNHEARD-OF MILESTONE, WHERE THREE DIFFERENT PLAYERS JOINED THE EXCLUSIVE SUB-60 CLUB OF THE KORN FERRY TOUR...

WITH TWO BREAKING THE BARRIER BY LANDSLIDE MARGINS.

ANNC: Frankie Capan shot 58.

RADIO: We just had a 57, Cristobal Del Solar ...

FRANKIE CAPAN: I would say I'd rather have this number.

ALDRICH POTGIETER: I was going to say, this doesn't look as good as those two, but ...

IT WAS 26 YEARS AFTER NOTAH BEGAY III SHOT THE FIRST 59 IN THE CIRCUITS HISTORY...
