A1 – TOURBOUND TEASE

ANNC: There's always something to play for.

ANNC: You're trying to get inside the top 20.

ANNC: Still kind of looking for the TOURBOUND label.

NEAL SHIPLEY: Being TOURBOUND has been a goal of mine since I was a little kid.

HASHTAG TOURBOUND ... HAS TAKEN ON A LIFE OF ITS OWN ...

PONTUS NYHOLM: TOURBOUND to me is a lifelong dream.

IT'S A TAG GIVEN TO A KORN FERRY TOUR PLAYER ONCE THEY'VE *STAMPED* THEIR NAME ON A PGA TOUR CARD ...

JOHNNY KEEFER: Saying that I'm on the PGA TOUR, it's always been a dream of mine.

AS WELL AS A RALLY CRY THROUGHOUT A TAXING SEASON ...

DAVIS CHATFIELD: It'd be incredible. Probably cry a lot.

BUT THIS YEAR - ONLY 20 PGA TOUR CARDS HAVE BEEN CRAFTED ...

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Cutting 10 cards is tough.

PONTUS NYHOLM: It's obviously more difficult. You got to play better.

THE HEAT ... IS ON ...

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: Everybody's nervous.

IT'S TIME TO GRIND ...

MITCHELL MEISSNER: The difference between 20 and 21 is not a lot.

EMILIO GONZALEZ: You got to keep the gas pedal down all day, every day.

THOSE WHO HAVE MASTERED THEIR CRAFT ... ONLY NEED TO APPLY THE FINISHING TOUCHES ... TO THEIR SEASON ...

NEAL SHIPLEY: It's exciting to be really close to that goal now.

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: There's no holding back.

A2 – SHOW TITLES

KORN FERRY PRESENTS INBOUND.

A3 – TOURBOUND SETUP

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Ever since I was a little kid, I've wanted to play on the PGA TOUR.

JUSTIN SUH: Means you're moving up.

EMILIO GONZALEZ: Brand new opportunity and excitement and just a new environment.

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: It's what we all work for out here on the Korn Ferry.

MITCHELL MEISSNER: I found myself thinking about, okay, what is the threshold to be TOURBOUND? In years past, everyone kind of knew it was right around 850 points with 30 guys. And now that it's 20, it's kind of, there's an unknown.

WITH JUST 20 CARDS AVAILABLE, THE STAKES – AND THE UNCERTAINTY – ARE HIGH ... BUT ONE THEME ALWAYS RINGS TRUE ...

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Whether it's 20, whether it's 30, you gotta still play a lot of really good golf.

EMILIO GONZALEZ: We all have the same goal. Everyone has a different formula for it.

NEED AN ALGORITHM? NEAL SHIPLEY KNOWS NUMBERS ...

NEAL SHIPLEY: 1,100 points is kind of the number where you're on the bubble. If you get to 1,200, you're pretty much golden. Historically that's kind of been the number.

IN ADDITION TO HIS MATHEMATICALLY-ROOTED MIND, SHIPLEY'S GAME IS SUITED FOR GOLF'S BIGGEST STAGES ... WHICH HE PROVED IN 2024 WHEN HE JOINED VIKTOR HOVLAND AS THE SECOND PLAYER IN THE LAST 25 YEARS TO EARN LOW-AMATEUR HONORS AT BOTH THE MASTERS AND THE U.S. OPEN IN THE SAME SEASON.

A4 – NEAL SHIPLEY – MATHEMATICIAN

ANNC: Nice to see Shipley make the most of his opportunities so far. He comes out, turns pro and he's kept the pedal down, kept the momentum going. It's great to see, he's a heck of a player.

THE PITTSBURGH NATIVE BUILT ON THAT MOMENTUM, AND EARNED CONDITIONAL KORN FERRY TOUR STATUS VIA THE FEDEXCUP FALL.

NEAL SHIPLEY: I've acclimated really well to the Korn Ferry Tour. I mean, I played PGA TOUR events last year. That experience, I think's paid dividends here.

IN APRIL, SHIPLEY CAPTURED HIS FIRST PROFESSIONAL VICTORY AT THE LECOM SUNCOAST CLASSIC IN A FIVE-HOLE PLAYOFF.

ANNC: Neal Shipley, a fan favorite and now, in just his 8th start on the Korn Ferry Tour, a winner.

NEAL SHIPLEY: Since winning, I've been in the top 20 in the points list all season. I'm just trying to keep my name there and hopefully get that card locked up as soon as possible. I'm approaching every week just with the goal to come out here and win.

IN JULY, SHIPLEY DID JUST THAT, AND OVERCAME A SEVEN-STROKE DEFECIT ENTERING THE FINAL DAY TO CAPTURE THE ASCENDANT PRESENTED BY BLUE.

NEAL SHIPLEY: I'm definitely more of a feel player. I don't get too technical with my swing. I'm not out here calculating barometric pressure. If I wanted to I could, but honestly, I feel like the juice isn't really worth the squeeze.

WITH A BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN QUANTITATIVE FINANCE AND A MASTER'S IN DATA ANALYTICS, THE OHIO STATE PRODUCT, BY WAY OF JAMES MADISON, BRINGS A DEEP APPRECIATION FOR THE NUMBERS BEHIND THE GAME.

NEAL SHIPLEY: It helps out when you talk to some of the statistics guys that help guys out on the PGA TOUR, I'm able to understand what they're talking about a bit more, and maybe how they code things or how they model their stuff. It's just as a player receiving that data, understanding how they create it, and how they get to that end product.

I'll come out here and do a full range session on Trackman and what I'll do is I'll get numbers for each club. At elevation I'll do full, three-quarter high, three-quarter low and like the nukes where you just hit it as hard as you can. And then with the irons and woods, a couple different notes. But the reason I do the different three-quarter shots is so, like, if you hit something low out here, the ball tends to fall out of the air a little quicker. You see a huge difference when you get above maybe like an 8 or 9 iron.

So, we just want to know those numbers. Say we're into the wind and we're trying to flight something in there like, okay, like this is going to get hurt and this usually only flies this number. That's a challenging thing when you're flighting shots at elevation, those are the numbers you really need to kind of have dialed in.

GREG DYNE: It's also a lot of fun, you know? I mean, seven iron goes 220 yards out here.

NEAL SHIPLEY: Yeah, and then, then we get the game of how far can we hit driver. Like that's, that's, that was a fun one earlier this week.

PRODUCER: What's your answer?

NEAL SHIPLEY: Did we hit 350 in the air?

GREG DYNE: We did.

NEAL SHIPLEY: Yeah, so...

GREG DYNE: So, I think our goal this week, if we get one down wind and it gets a little firm, we want to try to crack that 400.

WITH ASPIRATIONS AS HIGH AS THE COLORADO ROCKIES ... AND TWO WINS UNDER HIS BELT SO FAR THIS SEASON ... SHIPLEY NOW EYES A THIRD VICTORY, WHICH WOULD EARN HIM AN IMMEDIATE PROMOTION TO THE PGA TOUR.

NEAL SHIPLEY: I'm really focused on taking care of business here on the Korn Ferry Tour, but I know a lot of those guys up there on the big TOUR and I want to start seeing them every week, that's for sure. I know that I belong out there. It's just a matter of getting out there.

A5 - BUMP

STILL TO COME ...

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: They get to see my feet.

JOHNNY KEEFER: Having fun out there for me has always been kind of my style on and off the golf course.

B1 – **MITCHELL MEISSNER MINI**

ANNC: Mitchell Meissner on the Korn Ferry Tour's a right-handed player who's been through it with his putter; he actually putts left-handed.

MITCHELL MEISSNER: In college, I really was feeling pretty nervous over the putter and my first time putting lefty was over Thanksgiving break my senior year. I felt great over the ball, and I was like, this is fun. I had a really pretty solid spring semester, won twice, won the Texas Am and then decided to turn pro and to pursue my dreams and haven't necessarily looked back since.

IN HIS THIRD SEASON ON THE KORN FERRY TOUR, 29-YEAR-OLD MITCHELL MEISSNER HAS SEEN STEADY PROGRESS EACH SEASON, WITH A CAREER BEST SEVEN TOP-10 FINISHES THIS YEAR ...

MITCHELL MEISSNER: My first year out I expected success – I had so much success on Latin in 2022 – and when that didn't come early on, I got frustrated. This year I kind of went in the year trying to have a little bit more grace for myself. You know, just kind of have more fun out there and made the cut in the first Bahamas event, which was a huge just like stepping stone for me to have a little bit more confidence and then just kind of got the ball rolling for the year.

ONE UNIQUE ASPECT TO MEISSNER'S STORY...

ANNC: There's Mac Meissner on the PGA TOUR this season for the second-straight year, but his older brother, Mitchell Meissner, is in position to get his PGA TOUR card.

MITCHELL MEISSNER: We are probably each other's biggest cheerleaders, but there is a competitive atmosphere between us. Being the older brother, it did motivate me and, you know, has kind of helped me start working on the right things.

I've been a lot better at being grounded, in the present and just like, focusing on what I can do and I think that TOURBOUND will really almost motivate me more just to continue to get better. Hopefully I get that tag sooner rather than later. Trying to join him out there would be a dream come true.

B2 – 3RD YEAR VETERANS

MEISSNER ISN'T THE ONLY KORN FERRY TOUR VETERAN LOOKING TO ADVANCE TO THE NEXT LEVEL FOR THE FIRST TIME ...

EMILIO GONZALEZ: I think I've put myself up on top of leaderboards enough to be better and more comfortable with the discomfort. And starting to believe in myself more with my process; started to be a little more relaxed.

MEXICO'S EMILIO GONZALEZ IS ON THE CUSP OF BEING TOURBOUND, THANKS TO A CAREER-BEST SIX TOP 10s THIS SEASON ...

EMILIO GONZALEZ: There's been so many good players come out of Mexico. Adding my name to that list would just be something super special and something that I truly believe I could accomplish.

FELLOW THIRD-YEAR KORN FERRY TOUR VETERAN, DAVIS CHATFIELD, IS ENJOYING A CAREER YEAR AS WELL ... WITH TWO RUNNER-UP FINISHES IN CHILE AND NORTH CAROLINA ...

DAVIS CHATFIELD: Experience has played a huge part in the last couple of years, just me progressing in my golf game. Every week I learn something new about myself or about my game. Being TOURBOUND would be awesome. I feel like I'm on the edge of it, but I still got a long way to go.

PONTUS NYHOLM KNOWS THE GRIND AS WELL AS ANYONE ... CURRENTLY IN HIS FOURTH-STRAIGHT SEASON ON THE KORN FERRY TOUR, THE SWEDISH STAR HAS NEVER BEEN *THIS* WELL-POSITIONED, *THIS* LATE IN THE SEASON ... BUT 20-25 HAS BEEN A BREAKTHROUGH YEAR THAT HAS PLACED HIM ON THE DOORSTEP OF HIS DREAMS.

<u>B3 – PONTUS NYHOLM – HIGHS & LOWS</u>

PONTUS NYHOLM: I don't think anyone's really on the Korn Ferry just to play on the Korn Ferry their whole career. Everyone's trying to get to the PGA TOUR.

ANNC: Pontus Nyholm played college golf at Campbell University; won four times.

ANNC: Spent a lot of time early on with the Swedish National team. He's got the full game, just needs to put it together.

PONTUS NYHOLM: It's so easy to get caught up in lists and rankings and points and like, where you're on the list. And if you're in the top 20.

My game's changed so much and just the way that I think about golf from four years ago when I first got out here. Every time I had a bad round I was like, 'ok, I'm swinging it bad, that's why I'm playing bad.' So, I went to the range and I hit balls for five hours afterwards.

ANNC: And that will be extremely disappointing.

PONTUS NYHOLM: I've been really close a lot of times and just haven't really pulled it off. Had a lot of 36, 54-hole leads ...

ANNC: Pontus will drop for tie for fifth now.

ANNC: You don't know if you're going to get this opportunity again, so it's extra pressure you put on yourself to make the most of this chance because it might be your only one.

PONTUS NYHOLM: I've always known that my game is good enough. And I know if I play good, I'm going to have a nice finish on Sunday. But it still doesn't make it necessarily any easier.

JOSH HETHERINGTON: He's been in the lead a couple times and sort of struggles when you're trying to win for the first time, having a lead, you're obviously thinking about it a lot.

PONTUS NYHOLM: And that's sort of what I've been working on all year, just trying to block out results and be more process driven and not trying to force anything.

ANNC: When you look at his season, it's been very consistent. The fact he's getting more comfortable out here, it's a testament to his mental game.

INSIDE THE TOP FIVE ENTERING THE FINAL ROUND FOR THE SIXTH TIME IN HIS CAREER ... YEARS OF SCAR TISSUE AND A NEWFOUND OUTLOOK FINALLY PAID OFF ON A SUNDAY, IN MAY, IN KNOXVILLE.

JOSH HETHERINGTON: When you're in contention like that, it's sort of ... you're getting really focused on sort of doing one thing at a time. I told him, let's not look at leaderboards today and he actually did something that I told him for once.

ANNC: Nyholm for the win ...

PONTUS NYHOLM: Missing that putt in regulation, obviously gut wrenching. I was five back going into the day, I would've obviously taken a playoff this morning.

ANNC: How about that putt!? And the reaction as good as the putt! Nyholm, the 27-year-old Swede picks up his first victory. He's having a heck of a season on the Korn Ferry Tour.

PONTUS NYHOLM: It was a process of three or four years of, of work, you know, coming to fruition. It's what I've been trying to do for a long time out here.

JOSH HETHERINGTON: It's good for him to sort of, get the monkey off his back. If I put myself in his shoes, I'd be thinking about a TOUR card as well.

I sort of keep reminding him, give yourself a pat on the back for the win, and to put you in the position where you are to have a chance at going to the TOUR.

ANNC: He is right there in the top 20 in terms of points. If he can get himself to the PGA TOUR, his game translates very, very well to be able to compete out there and maybe do some good things.

PONTUS NYHOLM: From the moment you start playing golf, you dream of playing on the PGA TOUR. So just stick to my process; try and stay in the moment as much as I can and then, we'll see where we end up at the end.

C2 – JOHNNY KEEFER – CHARISMATIC COMPETITOR

ANNC: 24-year-old, Johnny Keefer, out of Baylor. He was so impressive last season on PGA TOUR Americas. Playing very, very well this season on the Korn Ferry Tour.

ANNC: A guy that, as an amateur, wasn't meant to be this prodigy.

ANNC: Ton of charisma; a lot of power from the tee. He's fun to watch. He's always smiling. And he's just one of the personalities that you need to see in golf.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Hey guys, I'm Johnny Keefer, and welcome to my house.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Here's my shrine ... nah, I mean, it's just stuff that we've collected over the years.

JUDY KEEFER: Johnny, growing up was very athletic. You put him on a surfboard, he'll get up and start surfing.

JOHNNY KEEFER: My first sport was lacrosse. I started lacrosse in Maryland when I was four years old. And then as I kind of went on, my dad was pushing me towards golf. He figured out that bribing me with new lacrosse equipment to get into golf was the best way to get me in.

JOHNNY KEEFER PUT HIS BARTERED LACROSSE GEAR TO GOOD USE AND PLAYED COMPETITIVELY THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL ... BUT ULTIMATELY SAW A BRIGHTER FUTURE IN GOLF ... ALTHOUGH HIS FIRST LOVE DID PROVIDE ITS BENEFITS ...

JOHNNY KEEFER: The twisting and turning that you have to do in lacrosse helped with a little bit of distance, or at least the motion.

IN 2014, THE KEEFER FAMILY MOVED TO TEXAS ... AND ESTABLISHED ROOTS AT TPC SAN ANTONIO, WHERE JOHNNY HONED HIS GOLF GAME ...

MATT FLORY NATS: Congrats on all the success.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Thanks. Yeah, it's been fun.

MATT FLORY NATS: It's exciting to see you.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Yeah, it's good to be back.

MATT FLORY: I got a call from Johnny's dad in August of 2014, and he said, 'hey, we're moving to TPC San Antonio. We're not going to find a home and then a home club. We're going to find a home club and then a home. And I need a place where, where Johnny can own his game and get ready.' He had TOUR aspirations from that day. So, we welcomed him to the club and from that moment on, I think we saw Johnny Keefer here every day.

JOHNNY KEEFER: That's kind of where it took off. There's one summer where I went out there at 7 a.m. every day and then stayed till 7 p.m. Playing all day and started to really improve quick.

KEEFER'S HARD WORK HAS PAID OFF RAPIDLY ... IN MAY 2024, HE NABBED THE 25TH AND FINAL SPOT IN THE PGA TOUR U RANKINGS, WHICH EARNED HIM STATUS ON PGA TOUR AMERICAS ... WHERE HE AMASSED ONE WIN AND FOUR RUNNER-UP FINISHES IN 10 STARTS, ULTIMATELY FINISHING ATOP THE POINTS LIST AND EARNING KORN FERRY TOUR MEMBERSHIP ...

JOHNNY KEEFER: I hit the ground running. I played really, really well up in Canada. And then on Korn Ferry, I probably came in with a little bit of a bigger head than I needed to be. I missed my first cut. And then I got in a really good rhythm, got my head on straight and just tried to have as much fun as possible.

BRYAN GATHRIGHT NATS: Beauty there. Really nice.

BRYAN GATHRIGHT: His dad told me that he instilled upon Johnny when he was very, very young, that golf is going to be fun. And, to his dad's credit and to Johnny's credit, they really embraced that.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Oh my goodness (laughter).

JOHNNY KEEFER: I'm probably in my best state of mind when I'm having fun and I'm very relaxed. It's really easy to take ourselves too seriously because it's such an individual sport.

JUDY KEEFER: He's a funny kid. He just ... comes up with stuff that makes people laugh.

HITOMI CHILCUTT: My first impression of him was goofy. Very loud. Definitely a class clown. I think he's matured a little bit more, but still keeps the goofy side.

JOHNNY KEEFER: Having fun out there for me has always been kind of my style. I think on and off the golf course, I try and make people's days a little bit better, you know, crack a few jokes.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Get to see my feet.

BRYAN GATHRIGHT: Don't ever, though, mistake the, the fun side of Johnny Keefer. There's an assassin mentality in there from the other side.

JOHNNY KEEFER: When I'm competing, I can flip it on and off a little bit. I know when I have to be serious, I can be serious.

BRYAN GATHRIGHT: He's got a great mental game. He loves to chase. If somebody's ahead of him, he's going after them. He's one of those guys that, when he feels like there's a need to step it up, he's just got another gear.

NATS: Atta boy. Good putt, Johnny.

HITOMI CHILCUTT: John does a really good job of keeping cool and kind of refocusing and turning that negativity into something positive.

NATS: Great four.

JOHNNY KEEFER: It's definitely a strength to be able to go out on the golf course and reset almost any time I hit a bad shot.

KEEFER'S TENACITY WAS ON FULL DISPLAY AT THE VERITEX BANK CHAMPIONSHIP ... WHERE HE TURNED A 36-HOLE LEAD INTO HIS FIRST KORN FERRY TOUR WIN ...

HITOMI CHILCUTT: Watching him grow into his professional career has been really cool. When he gets that PGA TOUR card, it's going to be so fulfilling and so cool to see.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Let's go!

THREE MONTHS LATER, JOHNNY ADDED HIS SECOND VICTORY THIS SEASON ... AND SECURED HIS TOURBOUND STATUS ...

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Oh, that's sick! Oh, that is so cool!

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: Oh! Aw, thank you guys.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: It says TOURBOUND.

NATS: Yay!

JOHNNY KEEFER: Come on.

JUDY KEEFER: He's just excelled. And it's crazy how quickly he got where he is.

JOHNNY KEEFER: Hey, look at this.

JOHN KEEFER: Oh my God. They gave it to you.

JOHNNY KEEFER: That's so sweet, huh?

JUDY KEEFER: Yay!

JOHN KEEFER: That's so cool. We're so proud of you.

JUDY KEEFER: Proud of you!

JOHNNY KEEFER: Thank you.

JUDY KEEFER: We wish we were there!

JOHNNY KEEFER: Yeah. Love you guys.

JOHNNY KEEFER NATS: It's been a while since I got a new lacrosse stick.

HITOMI CHILCUTT NATS: Yeah.

JOHNNY KEEFER: Competing against the best in the world is kind of what we all grew up and dream about. And, the dream is definitely coming into fruition, but being where my feet are is really important. Obviously, there are a lot of things that I'm really excited for. I think at the same time, I've got work to do.

D1 –PAST PGA TOUR MEMBERS IN POSITION TO RETURN

ANNC: Hank Lebioda, he's trying to get back to the PGA TOUR.

WHILE THE KORN FERRY TOUR IS OFTEN VIEWED AS A SPRINGBOARD FOR YOUNG TALENT ...

ANNC: A champion in the Bahamas!

IT CAN ALSO BE A PLATFORM – OR A "RE-PROVING" GROUND – FOR PAST PGA TOUR MEMBERS SEEKING A RETURN TO GOLF'S BIGGEST STAGE ...

JOSH TEATER: We talk about the game getting younger, and it is, but I have a lot of experience that I can draw on.

ANNC: Justin Suh, a winner on the Korn Ferry Tour in Argentina; that hopefully will get him back to the PGA TOUR.

JUSTIN SUH: You never know when you're going to play well, you never know when you're going to play bad. You have to adjust quick or, you know, it's, it's going to eat you.

D2 – AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN – RETURNING TO THE PGA TOUR

ANNC: Austin Smotherman lost his card after having full PGA TOUR membership, so he's been playing on the Korn Ferry Tour.

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: The unknowns of the golf life. I think a Korn Ferry season in the middle of a couple of years on the PGA TOUR is okay. We can handle those kinds of adversities.

IN 2021, AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN EARNED THE FINAL TOUR CARD ...

ANNC: Smotherman, finished 25th in the regular season a couple of years ago in Omaha. He was on that bubble bouncing around.

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN NATS: Is it enough? It's enough? Oh my God, dude!

FOUR YEARS LATER, HE HAS SHINED IN HIS SECOND STINT ON THE KORN FERRY TOUR.

ANNC: How 'bout it? How 'bout it! Austin Smotherman, a winenr again on the Korn Ferry Tour! First time in four years.

WITH TWO WINS AND SEVEN TOP-10s, SMOTHERMAN'S JOURNEY COMES FULL CIRCLE – THIS TIME AS THE <u>FIRST</u> PLAYER TO BE NAMED TOURBOUND.

BILL ACQUISTAPACE: Hey, how are you doing, mister?

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: What are you doing?

BILL ACQUISTAPACE: I don't know! They drug me into this.

TODD LEWIS: By the way, that's Austin's grandfather, go ahead, sir, did you have some news for us?

BILL ACQUISTAPACE: You're going to have to go back to the TOUR!

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: Is that right?

BILL ACQUISTAPACE: You're going to get another card and we could use a little card.

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: I love it, I love it.

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN NATS: How 'bout that?

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: It was cool to hear from him. It's chills and it's, it's a lifelong memory I'll never forget. He's watched me play golf since I was three years old.

I want to be back on TOUR and TOURBOUND for me and my family. Getting back to the PGA TOUR, that was one of our biggest goals. We had the birth of our second daughter last June. I want my girls out there with me. I want my family with me. It's the best players in the world playing together every single week. It's what we all work for out here on the Korn Ferry.

WITH HIS 2026 PGA TOUR CARD IN HAND, SMOTHERMAN NOW LOOKS TO EXPEDITE HIS RETURN WITH THE RARE, THREE-VICTORY PROMOTION.

AUSTIN SMOTHERMAN: If I'm out here and, you know, hopefully take care of business one more time, I would be honored to have my name on that list of all those guys with the battlefield promotion. Just go enjoy every shot we hit and see where they fall and keep smiling along the way.
