PAST CHAMPION OF THE GENESIS SCOTTISH OPEN, RICKIE FOWLER PROVED HOW HIS GAME CAN TRANSLATE TO LINKS GOLF. MARK IMMELMAN BREAKS DOWN FOWLER'S EVOLUTION WITH THE DRIVER.

<u>C3 – SWING THEORY: RICKIE FOWLER</u>

MARK IMMELMAN: Rickie Fowler. One of the most popular golfers in the game. A little while back, Rickie tightened up his bootstraps, putting the time and the effort and under the watchful eye of swing whisperer Butch Harmon. He turned the tide and elevated himself back into the spotlight on the PGA tour.

Slightly built but sneaky long, Ricky's golf swing was in tremendous working order right now. He's done a whole lot of work to get the swing back on line, and the focus has been the start and the top of the swing to get him in a place to deliver that club more consistently through the ball.

At address at five foot nine, not that tall, so you won't see much flexion in the knees. But common of all golfers, you'll always see some bending from the hips.

He allows the arms to hang down naturally beneath the shoulders, and that sets up a channel where he can move the hands back. Rickie Fowler, old style, used to move out to the right a whole lot more, but now he keeps the hands in and the club face out and that helps him line up his back swing. So, as he starts you'll see the clubhead hover first few feet of the swing hands work in, clubface stays out right over the top of the hands. Right there. That's so much better. And right here, with the left arm parallel with the ground. And as much as what his hands are a little deep. He's got the shaft plane in a way better spot than what he used to.

From there, the back swing is set up. He continues to rotate, the arm, swing up some more, and right over there is probably the best I've ever seen Rickie be. Left arm across the chest. Clubface matching. Used to have the club way laid off. The arms were way lower and way deeper. And right now, with that extra elevation, I feel like he can get the club back down in front of him so much easier.

But now is where the magic happens. Watch the torque. Low body unwinds. Chest follows. Now watch this picture right there. Hands are in front of the body. The shaft is not so laid off. It's more in front of him. And that allows him not just to turn and burn. Eyes behind the ball. Body opening up. Now watch the situation right there. He's extending the arms. Hasn't given up the wrist alignment just yet. But the key here, with that club face low and inside the ball, it facilitates the swing going in that direction. And if you want to draw it, watch this. The clubhead now slings through the golf ball along the line of the arrow. Extends out and up and over the shoulder.

Inside out draw. If you want to do it copy this, Rickie Fowler is your man.

ANNC: Gosh that swing looks so much better now that lead on much more upright.

ANNC: It's a pretty thing, isn't it?

ANNC: He's automatic with that club right now, isn't he?

ANNC: He couldn't have walked it out there any better.

ANNC: Beautiful shot there from Rickie. He knows what he needs to do here.

RICKIE FOWLER: How are we doing?

All right. Play a little match. Yeah. All right, let's do it. You want to take these boys down? You. Me? Yeah. All right.

Okay, let's go do this. We'll do, two on two. We get scramble. So we'll have a little fun with it. Not too tough. And then we'll see. Maybe on the greens. We'll stay out of the way. You guys have to battle it out. Putting. All right. Sounds good.

RICKY ROMANO: Yeah, that sounds good.

RICKY FOWLER: I got a caddie. You're going to get a caddie. Here we go.

AJ: All right let's see if we can get some here.

RICKIE FOWLER: Good shot. How long you been playing golf?

JONATHAN: Since I was three.

RICKIE FOWLER: Since you were three, nice.

JONATHAN: My dad and sister taught me but my dad taught her.

RICKIE FOWLER: My grandpa was the one that took me to the driving range for the first time. And I fell in love with it, so that's all I wanted to do.

JONATHAN: Try like get it up there.

RICKIE FOWLER: Try and get it to the hole.

JONATHAN: Yeah.

RICKIE FOWLER: Get it all the way there. Too much. We're on the green, so we got that going. Got a bad club from my caddy over there.

Skip Over. Get out of there. Just hung up.

RICKY ROMANO: AJ, is there a little help up there, do you think?

AJ: Yeah.

RICKY ROMANO: There's just a little helping wind off the left a little.

AJ: Yeah.

RICKIE FOWLER: This is chance. A big shining moment here on 18. Rocket Classic. Oh, he hung it. I think you made him nervous.

Yeah, I think we might be able to just make this one. We'll make three, and just beat these guys. There's your secret weapon.

JONATHAN: How would you read this green?

RICKIE FOWLER: I like starting with.

JONATHAN: It's downhill.

RICKIE FOWLER: Yeah. And then I start looking at like, okay, where where do I see the ball coming into the hole? I like the aggressiveness though. All right. Good roll. We'll go make that one.

RICKY ROMANO: Seem like the left edge of the shadow on the flag. Oh, yeah. Yeah. It's right where you want to start it. Okay. A little uphill.

RICKIE FOWLER: Oh, we dodged one there.

RICKY ROMANO: We make it. We win. This is a big putt. Okay, just trust that line. That line's good. And then it's just. Just like a flat putt. Little to the right.

RICKIE FOWLER: Half. Tie.

RICKY ROMANO: Good job. Way to go. Nice to meet you.

RICKIE FOWLER: You guys coming up on the tournament?

AJ: Yeah. I'll be watching.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: Alright.

AUSTIN KAISER: Look at this thing

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: Alright we good?

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: We have been to the Travelers. I want to say this is our

AUSTIN KAISER: This is our eighth time is right.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: Yeah, that sounds right. We've been working together for ten years now. 11 years? Ten years? We're this year, decade.

AUSTIN KAISER: 10-year anniversary.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: And then golf club wise we have a few wood options, whether it's a three wood, a forward hybrid. And there's a couple different lob wedge grinds, you know, depending on the surface that week if it's rained, if it's been really dry that kind of affects the whole bag actually. He has nightmares about having, like, 15 clubs in the bag.

AUSTIN KAISER: Once a month. I have a nightmare where I'm just pulling clubs out and they're never ending. And it's just literally my nightmare.

AUSTIN KAISER: This is our, yardage book for TPC River Highlands here in Hartford, Connecticut. I've accumulated, you know, 8 or 9 years of notes in here if I lose this, I'm in trouble.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: I think you'd be all right. Yeah. But you just have to redo a lot of work.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: We like to sort of, go over what what we did last year. You know, what what we've done really well. And, depending on the wind certain pin locations are more or less, accessible.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: Austin will take his notes in terms of lines, targets, lands, things of that nature. Obviously, it's my job to try and hit those. That's the hard part.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: I feel like we always have a discussion on this hole,

AUSTIN KAISER: We call him the summer soldier. It's it's only a matter of time.

XANDER SCHAUFFLE: I play my best golf over summer and we're kind of entering that stretch. So I only have a few events to to do something crazy and I'm just looking forward to, competing for the rest of the season. I still have a lot of golf in front of me. To sort of make my mark this year.
