WELCOME TO PGA TOUR THE CUT

A3 - TOUR CHAMP FINAL ROUND RECAP

NATS: From Southport, England, Tommy Fleetwood!

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: It's been great, the buzz that has been around me when I've been in contention. To have the support here, like just to have people chanting your name is a very, very special feeling, and I would never take it for granted.

NATS: Have a day, Tommy!

ANNC: At the second for Fleetwood with a great look ... and Fleetwood just buries it!

ANNC: Disaster of a start for Cantlay – bogey and then a double. All of a sudden, he's four back.

ANNC: Scheffler at nine ... it's getting close to must make time if he wants to continue this run. From the fringe ... and he's done it again! Here comes world number one!

ANNC: To seven, Tommy Fleetwood inside of 12 feet looking for his 25th birdie of the week ... yes! The putter's been magic! Back-to-back for 18-under par and up by three.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: I felt like I started the round off really well, really solid, did all the right things. But I felt like I'd lost my swing a little bit, lost my timing, lost my transition, hit a big hook off the 10th.

ANNC: He's going to lose one there and drop back to 17.

ANNC: We go to 14, Scheffler, here he is again, for birdie ... good line, good speed, Scheffler's got it! He's now tied for 2nd; two-shots back!

ANNC: 15, the par 3 ... 5 iron. This is pulled left ... shocking start to the day ... shocking here at 15 ... and now five back after the five.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I felt like I could have been a little sharper the last few days to give myself a better chance. But overall, it was a really good year. I have some stuff that I can try and improve on.

ANNC: Now Tommy Fleetwood, to get it to 19-under ... big swing at 13! He's feelin' it. He seems in control now.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: Changed my rehearsals a little bit, changed my tempo, tried to find my transition a bit. All my focus kind of went into that.

ANNC: Back at 16, Cantlay has just been money on this stretch, 16-18 ... wrong time to make a bogey. Fleetwood so close he can taste it now.

ANNC: At the beginning of the week, even at the beginning of the day, you might have thought this is too good to be true. To be able to get that FedExCup trophy and to call himself a PGA TOUR winner and to do it here, it's the ultimate way to break through.

ANNC: Kind of appropriate, the way these fans have pulled Tommy through all these rough moments, all these close calls ... they want to get a ringside seat to see him finally do it.

ANNC: He just has shown tremendous heart and resilience. He's a great golfer and he does it with class.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: It's easy for anybody to say that they are resilient, that they bounce back, that they have fight. It's different when you actually have to prove it.

ANNC: The agonizing wait is over – Fleetwood! Finally! For Everything! The FedExCup title!

A4 - WINNERS WALK

ROLAPP: All yours buddy, congrats!

FLEETWOOD: Thank you very much. Thank you! What do I do?

NATS: Hold it up for the world to see!

FLEETWOOD: Hey guys!

SKY SPORTS: Congratulations! Oh, Tommy Fleetwood - it's not very often I get emotional. You're a winner! You won the FedEx Cup, how do you feel?

NATS: Do you want to grab the cup and we will get rolling?

FLEETWOOD: Is it just this bit?

NATS: Just that but please.

FLEETWOOD: Guys, thanks so much! You're amazing! You were amazing this week.

FLEETWOOD: I'm great, don't worry. I'll do this all day.

FLEETWOOD: I'm treating this as a person. What a prize, what a gift. I'm going to put it in the bedroom so I can look at it all the time. So if my wife doesn't like it, that's tough. It's going right in the bedroom.

NATS: You doing okay?

FLEETWOOD: I'll do this all day, don't worry, don't worry. I'm just going to facetime my wife, can you tell her to give me five minutes? Maybe not, she's not even answering to me. She's probably asleep.

NATS: Congratulations man, well played. I know you've already seen this but we thought we would give you another shot.

FLEETWOOD: I would love to, I'm a lot calmer than I was a couple of hours ago hitting this putt.

FLEETWOOD: I can't use the claw grip can I? It's just wrong. I've watched a lot of Bobby Jones videos actually. You know, being on this green now, everything feels so simple, right? It just feels normal and my heart was racing at the time and it was such a great scene. And a lot of times, you don't get to come back to that exact spot, in that exact moment so being here in the quiet of the evening is very serene and very special.

FLEETWOOD: Do we have to hole one?

NATS: No.

FLEETWOOD: Okay haha. It's beautiful, thank you so much. I feel like my hands shouldn't be all over it.

NATS: Cheers mate, a big congratulations from all of us here.

FLEETWOOD: Thank you, it's very special. You guys have been amazing.

B1 - TOMMY FLEETWOOD CLOSE CALLS

ANNC: Fleetwood with one last gash here to take the lead in the clubhouse. Tommy Fleetwood! With a great finish to put him in at solo second!

FLEETWOOD: Mexico two years ago, was the first time I'd actually put in a really big result over here, so that was a big one for me as well. They all rack up. They're all things I'm proud of, but you know that win yet to happen.

PRODUCER: Back then did you think a win was around the corner?

FLEETWOOD: I definitely thought it would happen, sooner. I've had those times where I've had chances to win majors and plenty of other events, and it's just not happen.

ANNC: That's a brave line right there. That lot better be enough. Oh. Oh, wow. What a shot! That would get him to 14 under Tommy Fleetwood, not out of it.

ANNC: Earns his 13th top ten in his 47th PGA tour event. And you have to believe that one of the PGA TOUR will be sooner rather than later.

FLEETWOOD: It has taken me much longer than I thought it would, or probably the other people thought it would.

WRITER: Forgive me if you're possibly tired of answering this by now, but what would a PGA TOUR win mean to you, and how different would that be from what you've accomplished in your career to this point?

FLEETWOOD: I've always loved playing all, you know all around the world. I enjoy coming to work on the PGA tour. I love the sound of the golf over here, and I've had my chances before and it's not happened for me.

ANNC: A mega disappointment for Tommy. He played really well this week.

ANNC: With the way he's playing, you get the feeling that it won't be too long.

ANNC: And now there are two men at 12 under par. Tommy Fleetwood is joining Rory McIlroy. Look at that back nine.

ANNC: Coming in on the right side ... beautiful putt ... and he makes it! Tommy Fleetwood! Talk about clutch.

ANNC: Swinging the putter. Comes up with some speed. Now up the right for the eagle ... for the win ... to the cup! Oh oh good. The drought is over!

FLEETWOOD: It wasn't my time. It was Nick's and the whole thing at Canada. Amazing moments to remember and cherish. And that's just the nature of the game. You pack up and leave.

ANNC: Fleetwood coming off of that silver in Paris. It's not often that you actually get something for finishing second, but a silver medal is a nice little congratulations for a very, very solid week.

FLEETWOOD: On top of a lot of stats lines for people that haven't won on the PGA tour. So being number one at something is always nice. I'd love to win on the PGA tour. I think it's an element of your career that everybody wants. And I of course want it.

ANNC: A chance for a nice little bounce back.

ANNC: And we're going to have a first time breakthrough winner by one of the game's best. This could be no worse than in a playoff. Oh my goodness. He played the last three holes in two over. It sets up now for Keegan Bradley.

ANNC: A Keegan comeback not to be believed!

FLEETWOOD: The search goes on I guess when it happens, it will be very, very sweet. I did plenty of things well enough this week to, to win. I didn't do that. It hurts. But the most stupid thing to do, and the worst thing today would be to make a week like this a hindrance to what you do going forward. I obviously play great. I put myself in a great position. I was late in the tournament, 71 holes. I just want to, you know, make sure that I can put myself in this position as soon as possible again and, and try and correct what I did this time.

ANNC: What momentum he will carry into the following holes. If he can knock this one in .. that's the putt you want to have, Bones.

ANNC: And he got another one! Tommy Fleetwood alone at the top.

ANNC: I think this is for six one putts in a row ... oh my gosh. And a terrible putt came right out of it. Unbelievable.

PRODUCER: Your optimism, that's something that fans really continue to admire. Truly. How does it continue to drive you?

FLEETWOOD: Well, as long as they, stay with me and stay on my side, then we can all look for the positives. I'm lucky with the support that I get, and I so appreciative of it and kind of, you know, on this journey together. So all these experiences, you know, in these close calls, I have to find the strength to make it all a positive experience. And hopefully next time, you know, go again, put myself in a position again and we just go again.

ANNC: You got to give him credit just for the effort to put himself in position every single week, no question about it. And he just looks more comfortable today. Tommy Fleetwood saying, I know I've been here before. I'm not going to give this away.

ANNC: Big swing at 13! He's more comfortable, Terry. He knows exactly where he stands. He knows exactly what he has to do.

ANNC: Maybe now he can exhale. And that's a wrap, Dan.

FLEETWOOD: I'm not going to be picky about which one I choose to have as the first win. I think it would be pretty funny if I won this week and then at the Fedex Cup as well. I think that would be funny.

ANNC: The agonizing wait is over. Fleetwood, finally! For everything! The Fedex Cup title!

FLEETWOOD: you just keep lining down. You I think, and that's that you have had a great attitude throughout it all. And I don't know when you've lost it so many times. Three shot lead doesn't feel like that many.

FLEETWOOD: I've had to have mental strength in a different way. I've had to be resilient in terms of put myself back up there, get myself back in that position. No matter how many times it doesn't go my way, no matter how many doubts might creep in. I think the right things say the right things to yourself. And I am really pleased that I can be proof that if you do all the right things and you just keep going, that it can happen.

C1 - RORY AND SCOTTIE FEATURE

ANNC: Number one. Number two paired together Scottie Scheffler and Rory McIlroy.

DESPITE 8 VICTORIES BETWEEN THEM THIS SEASON, THE TOP TWO PLAYERS IN THE WORLD HAD TWO VERY CONTRASTING STARTS TO THE YEAR.

SCOTTIE: It's been a battle. I started off the year with injury, didn't start off the way I intended to.

RORY: The foundation for my incredible start this year. The more that I can trust myself and play free, you know, that's when I play my best golf

YET BOTH SEASONS WERE DEFINED SIMPLY BY PUTTING IN THE WORK.

SCOTTIE: We just continue to work on the right stuff, and a lot of it was shaking off the rust.

RORY: If you do the little things right day in and day out, that adds up to something bigger in the long term.

TOMMY: Rory obviously had in his mind what he thought 2025 should look like, what he needed to do. How he needed to go about it.

RORY: You have to go back to September or October of 2024. I decided to do some work on my golf swing. I locked myself indoors for four weeks, didn't let myself see the ball flight so I could just purely work on some mechanics that really help. And then I came out and won my first start on the PGA Tour at Pebble, and from there I just, you know, obviously rode that momentum all the way through the start of the year.

ANNC: His game has been on point. Maybe the best he's ever played so far in 2025 season. Three huge wins. He looks so comfortable and confident.

TOMMY: He's always just shown an amazing ability to reset, to always be thinking of what's next, how he can get better, how we can achieve different things. And I think in 2025 he did a great job of that.

WHILE RORY RACKED UP THREE VICTORIES AND COMPLETED THE CAREER GRAND SLAM BY MID-APRIL, SCOTTIE DIDN'T GET HIS FIRST WIN UNTIL MAY. HE'D GO ON TO WIN FIVE OF HIS NEXT TEN STARTS.

SCOTTIE: I knew it was going to be a challenging start to the year, and physically getting my body back to where it needed to be just took some time to shake. Maybe a few bad habits that I had. My swing from the injury. There was an aspect to me not

being able to practice for 5 or 6 weeks. I couldn't train my upper body, only training the lower body. The team and everybody did a really good job of helping me stay patient and not overreacting to things. And eventually that patience paid off.

ANNC: The inevitable has arrived again for the world's best fifth win in the last ten starts.

SCOTTIE: Just kind of a slow build up and I'm just proud of the fight we had all year.

GRIFFIN: Biggest thing about Scottie is if you build a lead on him, you can beat him, but if he's in the lead, he's not going to back down and you've got to really do something special to overtake him. If he gets out of position, he gets it back in position and makes the par putts almost every time. When he's hitting it well, he's making a ton of birdies and he's separating himself. We see it every week on tour.

ANNC: Look at Scheffler. Can you believe what you just saw. Incredible stuff from the world number one.

C2 - PLAYERS ASK THE NEXT PLAYER A QUESTION

CELIA: How's your day going?

RORY: It's going well how is yours

CELIA: We're having players leave a question for the player coming next.

RORY: Okay.

CELIA: What's a question for Ludvig.

RORY: Oh, how does he feel about being the most handsome player on the PGA tour?

LUDVIG: As in me?

MCNEALY: I want to know his, hair care routine.

FLEETWOOD: I don't have one. Just, use whatever hotel shampoo is, shampoo and conditioner, and I go from there really. Rory's next? Oh, what should I ask him? What should I ask Rory? Actually, I would like to ask Rory if he has a favorite partner he's ever played with in the Ryder Cup.

RORY: Hahahahaha. Well, seeing Tommy and I are unbeaten playing together in the Ryder Cup, I am going to say Tommy Fleetwood.

PRODUCER: Rory wanted you to tell him what it's like to be the most handsome man on tour.

LUDVIG: Well, I'm not sure what to say to that. I'll take it as a compliment. I'm very flattered. Rory himself is a good looking man, so, I'm quite flattered by that. I'm not sure how to answer it.

PRODUCER: So, what is one question you would like to ask Sepp Straka?

HOVLAND: I want to know his hair routine. Like what he does to, to keep it as shiny.

STRAKA: About twice a week, I've got a little shaver that I run over my head and that's just about it.

PRODUCER: If you could ask Harris one question, what would you ask him?

NOVAK: Why did you not make a single bogey on the back nine at Farmers? Like you couldn't even give me, like, a chance? Like, come on.

ANNC: Harris English conquers Torrey Pines.

PRODUCER: You figure out your question for Sam Burns yet?

MORIKAWA: Why haven't you grown your hair longer again?

BURNS: I'm losing it.

MORIKAWA: No, you answer that later! Kids.

BURNS: When Collin has a child, he'll understand. Your hair starts falling out.

D1 - KEVIN PRISE AND ALEX O'LAUGHLIN TALK FALL 2025

THE FEDEXCUP FALL BEGINS IN JUST 2 WEEKS WITH 2026 PGA TOUR STATUS ON THE LINE. ALEX O'LAUGHLIN SAT DOWN WITH KEVIN PRISE TO PREVIEW THE TOP STORY LINES TO KEEP YOUR EYES ON.

O'LAUGHLIN: Hey, Kevin, thanks so much for joining us. Knowing that we only have 100 players that'll keep full status next season, who are the veterans that we're all familiar with that are really going to have to have a good fall and produce good results?

PRISE: It's interesting because there's really two buckets of veterans. You have the guys who are like still in the prime of their career who do not want anything to do with having to go back to the Korn Ferry Tour. Guys like Sam Ryder, who's been on tour for

eight years and he's enters the fall that 108th. So he's going to need to do some work. He's had seven top 25, but no top tens. So really it kind of shows. If you don't have those really high finishes, you're not going to be able to keep your card, especially in the system with going down from 125 to 100 cards. And then you look at a guy like Adam Hadwin, who's been on tour for 11 years. He's kind of mired in a 136th in the standings. And for a guy like him to really be in jeopardy of falling back to the Korn Ferry Tour is pretty wild.

O'LAUGHLIN: Now, when you look at the rookies, it's kind of the flip side from the veterans. Who do you think has shown the skills, flashes of greatness that you think will have what it takes to get it done in the fall?

PRISE: It's so hard to make the Fedex Cup playoffs as a rookie. Aldrich Potgieter was the only rookie to play his way in, so I have my eye on a couple of guys like Isaiah Salinda, who finished third at the Mexico Open earlier this year, contended. And he's really a fun personality out there, doesn't take himself too seriously. Obviously takes his game seriously, but he's produced enough of a solid campaign this year to show he belongs. But you got to prove it.

O'LAUGHLIN: Who's someone that you're personally rooting for, that you want to see keep status for another season?

PRISE: I love that question and I appreciate it. And my mind goes to Justin Lower. Can't help but root for him. He's 119th on the Fedex Cup and he's going to need a big fall. But he's had the game. He's shown some flashes throughout the last few years where he can totally get it done. And Lower has just been through so much in his life. His dad and his brother were tragically killed in a car accident. He definitely carries them with him, gets emotional in interviews often, and you know, if he's around the bubble again come the final couple events of the fall, he will wear it, he feels it. So I expect to see him around the bubble come November and I will be rooting for Justin Lower.

PRISE: Well, very excited to see all your coverage coming up. But thanks so much for joining us, Kevin. Always appreciate your insight.
