ROBERT MACINTYRE: People don't understand how much of a circus it was around that week with having to get visas to get back in the US for me, and the weather on the Monday. Play nine holes. Everything that was happening, it was just to be able to switch off from all of that and just go, "We're here, We're now playing golf."

ANNC: Here's Macintyre. Oh that's nice!

ROBERT MACINTYRE: You gotta stay focused and I think I've done a good job of that.

ANNC: Come on now! Bobby Macintyre!

ANNC: Mac attacks right back with a birdie of his own.

ROBERT MACINTYRE: I stood on 18. It was between clubs on the tee shot. And I was like, what do you think? And he – he likes the way I hit my rescue, so he's like just smash the rescue. Perfect. JACK NICKLAUS: He played good, solid, smart golf. That's what the best player in the world does. He comes out and does things the right way.

ANNC: Just so impressive. On such a hard golf course – just one bogey the whole weekend.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: It was a great week. It's always special being able to come here and play Mr. Nicklaus' tournament. The golf course was a great test this week. It was a good challenge and it's definitely fun to be sitting here.

ANNC: Just remains unphased. Every time there's a moment of adversity, you'd never know it.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: When you're looking at a 72-hole tournament, if I'm thinking properly and hitting the correct shots, I should have a decent chance there on Sunday. And so, when it comes to playing a tournament, I try to and bring the same level of intensity to Thursday as you do Sunday. And so, when you come out here late on Sunday nothing really changes for me because I try to bring that intensity to the first tee on Thursday.

JACK NICKLAUS: We're so proud to have Scottie not only as our champion last year but again this year. We're happy for him, too. Obviously, very happy for him.

WITH HIS WIN, SCOTTIE BECOMES JUST THE 2ND PLAYER TO WIN BACK-TO-BACK CHAMPIONSHIPS AT THE MEMORIAL- JOINING FIVE-TIME WINNER TIGER WOODS. AFTER GOING WINLESS IN HIS FIRST EIGHT EVENTS THIS SEASON, THE TEXAN HAS CAPTURED THREE VICTORIES AND A TIE FOR 4TH IN HIS LAST FOUR EVENTS.

SCHEFFLER EXTENDS HIS LEAD TO OVER 800 FEDEXCUP POINTS AND WILL BE BACK IN ACTION AT THE U.S. OPEN.

TODD LEWIS: Scottie Scheffler, only the second player to go back-to-back at the Memorial. Who was the other guy?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Tiger.

TODD LEWIS: Oh yeah.

JACK NICKLAUS: Come on up here, Scottie! Congratulations!

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Thank you. Thank you very much.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Mrs. Nicklaus, thanks for keeping him in line all these years. I'm sure it had its challenges.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Hey Mer!

MEREDITH SCHEFFLER: Do you remember them from last year?

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: You know, fortunately, he doesn't have a clue what's going on right now. Whenever he sees this trophy he's probably going to try to eat it just he like he tries to eat everything else. So, ha!

ANNC: Here's a career summary of Tommy Fleetwood. Still looking for that first PGA TOUR win. It's mind boggling. He came, of course, the closest two seasons ago at the RBC Canadian Open. Lost in the 4th playoff hole to a 72-foot eagle.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: I enjoyed it. I enjoyed sort of playing against a nation, if you like.

NATS: Let's go Taylor! Let's go Taylor!

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: I was very comfortable being the villain. I would have very happily ruined everyone's day. It was kind of a Ryder Cup atmosphere going against the crowd and Nick and that. So yeah, that was the part where I was playing the villain.

ANNC: Good pace. Are you serious? Oh, my goodness! That is not to be believed.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: This season I have played very, very well. The consistency in my golf has been really encouraging. There's been a lot of runner ups, but I think ... to look at them in a negative way, you always want more. There's everybody that always wants more except for the one guy whose won every week. If you let sort of those things become a burden or a negative impact on all the good stuff you're doing, then it's the wrong way to look at it.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD CURRENTLY HAS THREE TOP-5 FINISHES THIS SEASON, WITH TWO OF THOSE COMING IN RECENT WEEKS AT THE TRUIST CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE CHARLES SCHWAB CHALLENGE. FLEETWOOD HAS 27 TOP-5s ON THE PGA TOUR, WHICH LEADS ALL ACTIVE PLAYERS WITHOUT A WIN ... BY ELEVEN!

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: As an overall golfer, I'm definitely much improved since 2017.

ANNC: Fleetwood to take the lead in the clubhouse. Tommy Fleetwood with a great finish!

ANNC: Another terrific round of golf by the Englishman. A 66 without a bogey on the card.

ANNC: French Open Champion

ANNC: The Race to Dubai Champion – Tommy Fleetwood.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: Wins on the PGA TOUR haven't come yet. But I think everyone has their own journey and their own story and I'll keep working towards multiple wins out here and majors and all of the good stuff.

C3 – TOUR CHAMPIONSHIP CHANGES

FLEETWOOD IS CURRENTLY 13TH IN THE FEDEXCUP STANDINGS...WELL ON HIS WAY TO HIS FIFTH TOUR CHAMPIONSHIP APPEARANCE. SHOULD HE

REACH ATLANTA THIS YEAR, HE WILL START THE WEEK ON AN EVEN PLAYING FIELD. LAST WEEK, THE PGA TOUR ANNOUNCED THE "STARTING STROKES" FORMAT USED SINCE 2019 WILL NO LONGER BE IN EFFECT. ALL PLAYERS WILL START AT EVEN-PAR, LIKE ANY OTHER EVENT ON TOUR, AND THE WINNER OF THE 72-HOLE STROKE PLAY EVENT WILL WIN BOTH THE TOUR CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE FEDEXCUP.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Having a 72-hole tournament on a great golf course, I think is a great way to challenge players to finish off the season the right way. And, I always dreamed growing up of being able to win the TOUR Championship and win the FedExCup, and to have that as our season-ending tournament on a great golf course, um, against the best 30 players from that year I think is a really cool tournament to have the opportunity to win.

COLLIN MORIKAWA: I think guys will have a different mentality. You know, some guys went for broke if they started at even before with the starting strokes, but I think now, everyone has that belief, no matter if they're playing well or playing poorly, to say, "Hey. I've made it. I've given myself a chance." And that's all you can ask for. You know, it's it's playoff sports and and all you ask for playoffs is to give yourself a chance – an opportunity. This is that opportunity to win it."

RICKIE FOWLER: I think it's great with the TOUR Championship, all thirty guys going there and ... playing it out. You can't fake it. You have to play very good golf over a long period of time. I know it's been in past could be confusing with the staggered start. Now it's kind of clean slate. Everyone's starting at zero. Thirty guys that have earned their way there. Hey, you're going to play for the TOUR Championship. Winner take all.

PGA TOUR UNIVERSITY'S "CLASS OF 2025 VALEDICTORIAN" DAVID FORD WILL MAKE HIS PROFESSIONAL DEBUT AT T-P-C TORONTO AT OSPREY VALLEY THIS WEEK. THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA PRODUCT STOPPED BY THE PGA TOUR'S GLOBAL HOME FOR A SURPRISE CARD CEREMONY THIS WEEK.

DAVID FORD: Thank you all for being here and supporting, um, I'm just super thankful to be a member. (APPLAUSE)

D2 – LUKE CLANTON FEATURE

LUKE CLANTON ALSO MAKES HIS FIRST PROFESSIONAL START ON THE PGA TOUR AFTER SECURING ENOUGH POINTS THROUGH THE PGATOURU'S ACCELERATED PROGRAM.

RHONDA: Watching that putt go in and seeing the emotion on his face, you know, you work so long, like, it's not like he's been trying to get this since last June. He's been trying to get this since he was seven years old.

RHONDA: He got the points within, I think it was 260 days it took him. And he did it all by play.

RORY MCILROY LEADS THE LIST OF FAVORITES IN CANADA THIS WEEK. IT'S THE FIFTH STRAIGHT APPEARANCE AT THIS EVENT FOR THE NORTHERN IRISHMAN, WHERE HE HAS TWO VICTORIES AND HAS NEVER FINISHED WORSE THAN T-9.

ANNC: Canadian Corey Conners...Gotta control the spin here...Would you call that control? I would! That's A-plus

NEXT UP – COREY CONNERS LEADS THE WAY FOR THE CANADIAN CONTINGENT HOPING TO TAKE HOME THEIR NATIONAL OPEN. THE TWO-TIME PGA TOUR CHAMPION HAILS FROM LISTOWEL, JUST 100 KILOMETERS WEST OF THIS WEEK'S VENUE.

ANNC: And it's another playoff victory for Nick Taylor! / His last three wins on the PGA TOUR have come in extra holes.

FINALLY – AFTER TAKING THE TITLE AT THE SONY OPEN IN HAWAII IN JANUARY, THE MAN WHO ANSWERED CANADIAN GOLF FANS' PRAYERS WITH HIS HISTORIC WIN TWO YEARS AGO WOULD LOVE TO CAPTURE HIS SECOND OF THE 2025 SEASON IN HIS HOME AND NATIVE LAND. PLAYERS IN THE FIELD THIS WEEK WILL LOOK TO MAKE THEIR OWN MEMORABLE MOMENT LIKE THIS ONE 25 YEARS AGO.
