ANNC: If you want to be the best, you've got to beat the best.

A3- Rory McIlroy Intro

RORY MCILROY WILL MAKE HIS PGA TOUR SEASON DEBUT, AND HE DOES IT AS THE DEFENDING CHAMPION AT PEBBLE BEACH... HE'S LOOKING TO BECOME THE 7TH GOLFER TO REPEAT AT THIS TOURNAMENT AS HE CONTINUES TO SEEK HIS 30TH CAREER WIN ON THE PGA TOUR...

HIS WIN HERE IN 2025 WAS JUST THE BEGINNING OF WHAT WOULD END UP BEING A HISTORIC SEASON FOR THE IRISHMAN ... BUT FIRST WAS A REBUILDING OF HIS SWING.

A4- Rory McIlroy 2025 Feature

ANNC: He said he didn't like the shape of his swing last year and he felt like it broke down on him under the severest pressure.

RORY McILROY: I locked myself indoors for four weeks. Didn't let myself see the ball flight so I could just purely work on some mechanics.

ANNC: Made some changes and those changes are paying off here this week.

RORY McILROY: I came out and, you know, won my first start on the PGA TOUR at Pebble.

ANNC: Rory is the champion of the 2025 AT&T Pebble Beach Pro Am.

RORY McILROY: From there, I just rode that momentum all the way through the start of the year.

ANNC: Rory McIlroy and J.J. Spaun heading over to the 16th tee at TPC Sawgrass for the first playoff in 10 years to decide THE PLAYERS Championship.

RORY McILROY: It was very windy that morning. It was in off the left. Just the worst wind you can have as a right hander.

ANNC: The weather is a story for this three-hole aggregate playoff. The winds gusting to over 30 miles an hour.

RORY McILROY: Standing over that tee shot on 16 this morning is the most nervous I've been in a long time.

RORY McILROY: I knew 16 being down wind, it would be to my advantage. You know, I'm a little longer than J.J. and I'd be able to take advantage on the par five.

ANNC: Great drive and a statement made by Rory right there.

ANNC: Yes! It's going to be an advantage here for McIlroy, who gets to one-under.

RORY McILROY: To be able to at least give myself a cushion after the first hole on 16 going into 17 and 18, I thought was big.

ANNC: This is going to be very difficult. They're going to have to take a lot more club, try and keep it down, the risk is flying it over the back of the green and then the spin control when it lands.

RORY McILROY: For me, the whole key to that playoff was the tee shot on 17.

ANNC: Outstanding shot.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: He definitely rode the wave of playing great through that first part of the year.

ANNC: McIlroy's got another PLAYERS title! Setting the table here for what could be a very special year.

RORY McILROY: I'd seen it somewhere that Jack, Tiger and Scottie were the only three with multiple PLAYERS and multiple majors. And, you know, it's a nice club to be a part of.

TOMMY FLEETWOOD: He made a bunch of decisions in terms of how he worked on his game. All of that obviously leading towards the Masters.

McILROY'S REFINED GAME APPEARED TO BE PAYING OFF UP UNTIL THE 72ND HOLE OF THE MASTERS TOURNAMENT ...

RORY McILROY: I had a five-foot putt to win the tournament and missed it.

NOW, ANOTHER PLAYOFF – THIS TIME WITH JUSTIN ROSE – STOOD BETWEEN McILROY AND HISTORY ...

JUSTIN ROSE: Thinking about losing that one again, it would have been a pretty hard one for him to take. I hit it in the fairway and then hit a great second shot. He very much knew he had to respond.

RORY McILROY: When Justin had his second shot in, I couldn't tell how close it was, but it looked like it was very close. So, I felt like I had no option but to be aggressive with my second shot and take it right at the flag.

JUSTIN ROSE: You're sitting there watching someone have their moment. You can almost taste what it would feel like to be achieving it yourself.

RORY McILROY: It's not every day you get to fulfill one of your lifelong goals and dreams and I've just really tried to enjoy everything that comes along with that.

JUSTIN ROSE: I understood how much it meant to him, how long he's been chasing that dream, and obviously what it meant also for the game of golf.

RORY McILROY: The big thing for me is just how the whole journey sort of resonated with people and the people that have reached out to me.

RORY McILROY: I've had a lot of fun this year. After the year I've had, if I can't have fun this year, I'm never going to be able to have fun.

B1- Justin Rose Intro

ALSO IN THE FIELD THIS WEEK AT PEBBLE BEACH IS 2023 CHAMPION, JUSTIN ROSE, WHO ALSO FOUND RENEWED SUCCESS LAST YEAR.

B2- Justin Rose 2025 Feature

ANNC: There is another element that I'm not sure has been talked a lot about, which is Justin Rose is 45 and on the European Ryder Cup team.

JUSTIN ROSE: I've been selling myself the story that my game is in good shape and that when I have access to it, yeah, I've been able to play with the best players in the world and compete.

ANNC: Yep! Fist pump of determination by Rose ... and Justin Rose is a playoff winner again! His 12th PGA TOUR win. It's the second most of any European in the modern era.

REPORTER: 45 years of age, what did you learn about what's inside of you at this age in your career?

JUSTIN ROSE: Yeah, I've always known I've had that. Like, I get nervous with the best of them. You know, like, I feel nervous at times, but I know that when it matters, I still got it.

SHANE LOWRY: Honestly, for me, watching him do that, I'm getting towards my 40s and it's definitely something that I kind of aspire to be when I get to his age.

JUSTIN ROSE: I feel like I'm moving well, the body's feeling good, I'm training well. I can't let the age become too much of the story.

AGE HARDLY DEFINED HIS SEASON... AS ROSE'S STRONG PLAY IN 2025 EARNED HIM AN AUTOMATIC SPOT ON TEAM EUROPE FOR HIS SEVENTH RYDER CUP APPEARANCE.

JUSTIN ROSE: I still feel like I have that desire to play well and I still think I have the ability to play well. So, as long as I have that, I feel like I owe it to my kid-like self who was dreaming about doing what I'm doing now at the age of 12 to give it everything. As a player, you wanna play to win; that's kinda why I'm out here. That's why I'm still continuing to strive to be out here and strive to work hard is that I still believe I can get the job done. There's such a big difference between winning and coming in second. Closing the door is everything.

ROSE CLOSED THE DOOR IN JUST HIS SECOND START OF THE 2026 SEASON AND HOPES TO CONTINUE THAT MOMENTUM.

ANNC: Justin Rose, runaway victory! // The winner of the 2026 Farmers Insurance Open! // Lucky number 13!

ROSE SOT: I've achieved a lot in the game, but I've achieved a lot of it just once. So I'll take multiple of anything that I've achieved for sure would be great.

ALSO A WINNER EARLIER THIS SEASON, CHRIS GOTTERUP SHINED IN PHOENIX. HE EARNED HIS SECOND WIN OF 2026 IN JUST THREE STARTS AT THE WM PHOENIX OPEN, DEFEATING HIDEKI MATSUYAMA IN A PLAYOFF

B4 - WM Winner

ANNC: This to win it ... He has game! Game, set match ... This tournament always delivers ... He is a budding star. No doubt about it.

AMANDA BALIONIS: When the moment is biggest, when your back is against the wall, that's when you show up, where does that come from?

CHRIS GOTTERUP: A lot of hard work. You make me cry every time. There's just so many people who believe in me, and to be able to share it with them. I don't know if I'll be able to get through it. It's just so much fun.

C2- Intro VO Scottie Feature

VICTORIOUS ALREADY THIS SEASON, SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER MAKES HIS FIRST SIGNATURE EVENT START AT PEBBLE BEACH. A PAIR OF TOP-TENS IN HIS ONLY 2 STARTS COMBINED WITH HIS RECENT DOMINANCE SUGGEST A WIN COULD BE ON ITS WAY THIS WEEK... SCHEFFLER HAS WON 5 OF THE PREVIOUS 16 SIGNATURE EVENTS IN TOUR HISTORY.

AND WHILE HE ENDED LAST SEASON AS THE 2025 PLAYER OF THE YEAR, HE STARTED IT WITH A SETBACK.

C3 - Scottie Scheffler 2025 Feature

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Trying to follow up a year like last year is always difficult.

ANNC: One of the all-time seasons for Scottie Scheffler! Takes it all!

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I started off the year with injury. I lost a lot of the progress that I made in the offseason.

ANNC: There was so much momentum at the end of last year. It was stalled with the wine glass breaking off in his hand.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I had to take basically five weeks off from golf activities. And so, you know, you lose a lot physically; I lose a lot with my swing.

ANNC: Scottie didn't win early on and people were saying, 'what's wrong with Scottie?'

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: So, it was kind of a slow build up and I'm just proud of the fight we had all year.

FOUR MONTHS INTO THE SEASON, SCHEFFLER HAD YET TO LIFT A TROPHY, BUT HIS CONSISTENCY NEVER WAVERED ... FIVE TOP-10 FINISHES, INCLUDING THREE TOP-FIVES, SET THE STAGE FOR A BREAKOUT MONTH OF MAY ...

ANNC: Full circle for Scheffler! Scottie wins for the first time this year and it comes in the event he attended as a kid.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: It was a lot of fun for me to be able to play in front of the home crowd and it was a really special week.

ANNC: Quail Hollow awaiting the second major of the year, the PGA Championship. World number one, Scottie Scheffler, he's one of the favorites.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Physically going into that week, I wasn't feeling my best, but I was doing enough to where I could get it around that golf course and I was holing a lot of putts.

ANNC: Scottie Scheffler with two wins this year, CJ Cup Byron Nelson and the PGA Championship.

ANNC: Is Scottie Scheffler going to wake up and go on a little winning spree? You'd think it's gonna be about that time.

NEXT UP WAS JACK'S PLACE, WHERE SCHEFFLER LOOKED TO DEFEND HIS MEMORIAL TOURNAMENT TITLE AND BECOME ONLY THE SECOND PLAYER TO WIN BACK-TO-BACK AT MUIRFIELD VILLAGE SINCE TIGER WOODS IN 2000 AND 2001 ...

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I was able to finish really well on Saturday to kind of take the lead.

BEN GRIFFIN: He's not going to back down and you've got to really do something special to overtake him.

ANNC: That was really, really good stuff there.

BEN GRIFFIN: The Memorial, I felt like I was probably hitting it better than Scottie. I just wasn't making enough putts that final round. And he was making the par putts that are important.

ANNC: The man is a machine! Scottie Scheffler, the repeat champion at Jack's event.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: I felt like I was improving as the year went on. And then going into Portrush, I felt like I just brought a lot of intensity to each shot that week.

ANNC: Scottie Scheffler, your Champion Golfer of the Year, a four-shot victory.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: We just did a really good job of getting around that golf course and hitting the right shots.

FRESH OFF CONQUERING HIS SECOND MAJOR OF THE SEASON, SCHEFFLER CARRIED THAT MOMENTUM INTO THE FEDEXCUP PLAYOFFS – WHERE HE ERASED A FOUR-SHOT DEFICIT TO CLAIM HIS FIFTH VICTORY OF THE SEASON IN BALTIMORE.

ANNC: World number one has sole possession of the lead! You knew that run was coming.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: It's game on now. It's time to go get it.

ANNC: Can you believe what you just saw?!

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: When that chip goes in, you know it's a pretty cool shot, but the job's not nearly finished.

ANNC: The inevitable has arrived again for the world's best.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: Great battle all the way through. Did a good job of staying patient and executing when we needed to.

THE CHASE FOR SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER'S SECOND FEDEXCUP STARTED AT THE FIRST EVENT OF THE YEAR IN THE DESERT, PICKING UP A WIN.

ANNC: Scottie Scheffler has done it again. He is now a 20-time winner on the PGA TOUR.

TWO WEEKS AFTER THE WIN, A MOTIVATED SCHEFFLER HEADED BACK TO THE PLACE OF HIS MAIDEN VICTORY, WHERE HE HAD A MEMORABLE MOMENT OF PERSPECTIVE AHEAD OF HIS STRONG FINISH.

C4 - Make A Wish - Carson Meets Scottie

SCOTTIE SCHEFFER: Hey Carson!

CARSON: Carson.

SCOTTIE SCHEFFLER: How you doing, buddy? Good to meet you, what's going on?

CARSON: That's really good.

TRAVIS KELCE: You even got the get up and everything, man. You're swagged out.

CARSON: Yeah!

HEATHER: Carson was diagnosed with cystic fibrosis at 2 weeks old. When he was born, we had no idea it's genetic and we didn't know it ran in the family.

JARROD: The story today looks a lot different than what it used to because of all the research and fundraising from a lot of families that have seen some really down times with their kids going through it and fortunately for our family, we've benefitted from all of their efforts.

CARSON: What's your best card of yourself?

TRAVIS KELCE: Of myself? I got a hideous looking card, it's like a blue card where I got a, it's my rookie card, man. It's the worst picture I've ever taken in my life.

CARSON: What's your best card in your collection?

TRAVIS KELCE: I have one that has the game worn jerseys, like one of those, you know what I mean?

CARSON: Oh, yeah.

TRAVIS KELCE: The really thick card they put a piece of the jersey in there, where you from, bro?

CARSON: Indiana.

TRAVIS KELCE: Indiana, you're a mid-west kid, too? Me too, man.

SCOTTIE: Carson, this is my caddie, Ted.

TED: Carson, how you doing, man? Nice to meet you, buddy.

CARSON: Nice to meet you.

SCOTTIE: What are our hobbies? What are we doing?

CARSON: A lot of the sports. Basketball, golf, baseball, soccer, yeah.

CARSON: Good shot, Scottie.

SCOTTIE: Thank you!

CARSON: What's your favorite club in your bag?

SCOTTIE: Whichever one decides it wants to behave on that day.

CARSON: OK, yeah.

SCOTTIE: I really like chipping. Like a lob wedge? You can do a lot of different stuff with your lob wedge.

SCOTTIE: Carson's putting for me, I got this hole off.

CARSON: oh.

SCOTTIE: What are you seeing?

CARSON: It's like breaking a little left.

SCOTTIE: It is breaking a little left.

FAN: Get in the hole!

CARSON: I underestimated that. Little tap in.

JARROD: To see Carson live out his life, like today, for Heather and I, it's a dream come true.

HEATHER: Yeah, it was devastating at first, but we've met some real amazing people along the way who have helped Carson and our family and we're very grateful for all of them.

D1- Wyndham Clark Just a Drill

WYNDHAM CLARK: Hi, I'm Wyndham Clark. This is just a drill. I'm going to show you a few things I do to keep my swing in check. This is how I start every practice session. People always ask and wonder why is when I'm teeing up a wedge or teeing up a seven iron? The reason I do this is you have to learn your tendencies in your golf swing. And one of my biggest flaws is I get really steep, narrow, and I crash down on it. Well, if you do that with the ball teed up, you hit it really high in the face and you hit it bad. So my caddie, John and I, we always start this way and I try to be really shallow and pick the ball off the tee.

WYNDHAM CLARK: So just like that and what's great is that keeps me level, keeps me from changing my levels. I come in very shallow and I'll do that probably, I don't know about 20 golf balls. I'll start with a wedge. I'll do like a mid iron along iron, and then I move to my seven ball drill.

WYNDHAM CLARK: This first ball would be aimed right at the target that I'm going at. So I'm going at that red flag. Then I draw a straight line back with my alignment stick. And then I set up six balls. I set up three right of it and three left of it. So I have this ball on a straight line to this golf ball that's lined up with that red flag.

WYNDHAM CLARK: On the left side everything is all fades. This is one ball left. This is two balls left. That is three balls left. Then on the right side would be all draws. That's one right, two right, three right. And so if I hit it right over this first ball, that's a dead straight shot. If I hit it on the left ball, that is a small cut.

WYNDHAM CLARK: The right ball would be a small draw. And then as you go out, you get bigger draws and fades. So if I'm hitting a fade here, I aim my face right at the ball that's just left of the center ball. So one left, then I set my body, and then all I'm focused on is now keeping the face there, and then I swing towards this second ball. So now I'm creating a left path with an open face, which creates a fade.

WYNDHAM CLARK: And that was perfect there. So that, you know, that's about a five yard fade. Now we'll go to the straight ball. So I aim right over that straight ball. And here I try to feel like I just release it right down that straight ball.

WYNDHAM CLARK: Yeah that was pretty good there. And then now we go to the draw. So it's the exact same thing as the cut just on the right side of the golf ball. So I'm going to set the face up to the first ball, one right, and then I swing towards two right, which creates a right path with the shut face which creates a nice, tight draw.

WYNDHAM CLARK: So that one, it drew, but I'd say it started too far right. So that was almost two balls. And so when my caddie John's behind me, he'd say, hey, it started on the second ball, not the first ball. So then we just know, okay, start line and we start dialing it in and hopes that by the end of the session, we're starting every ball exactly where we want and it has the shape we want.

WYNDHAM CLARK: This is something I do with an old yardage book. And this just kind of complements what I'm doing on my seven ball drill, which is I set up my face and try to get it very square. So if I'm hitting the straight ball, I get it perfectly flush, and then I step in and hit the straight ball.

WYNDHAM CLARK: Then if I'm trying to hit the small little cut, I barely open it from square. And then I set up to hit my cut. And then conversely, a draw barely shut. And so I'm constantly checking my face.

2024 AT&T PEBBLE BEACH PRO-AM CHAMPION WYNDHAM CLARK WILL LOOK TO PUT THOSE DRILLS TO THE TEST THIS WEEK.

D3 - Champions Hole - 14 Pebble

EACH WEEK ON THE PGA TOUR, GOLFERS LOOK TO SEPARATE FROM THE PACK AND EMERGE VICTORIOUS, AND ONE HOLE CAN MAKE THE DIFFERENCE. THE TOUR IS AT PEBBLE BEACH THIS WEEK, AND USING HISTORICAL DATA AND COURSE INSIGHTS, WE'VE IDENTIFIED THE CHAMPION'S HOLE. THE PAR FIVE 14TH IS THE LONGEST HOLE AT PEBBLE BEACH GOLF LINKS, AND ALSO GOES THE FURTHEST IN TERMS OF DETERMINING THE WINNER.

SINCE 2003, THE WINNERS HERE HAVE A SCORING AVERAGE OF 4.62 ON NUMBER 14, WITH A BIRDIE OR BETTER PERCENTAGE OF 40.4, THE EVENTUAL CHAMPS ARE NEARLY TWICE AS LIKELY TO BE UNDER PAR. THE LAST TIME THIS EVENT WENT 72 HOLES AND WAS DECIDED BY ONE STROKE WAS A DECADE AGO. THE 54 HOLE LEADER'S SUNDAY COLLAPSE WAS SEALED WITH A BOGEY ON 14. ON THE SAME HOLE, VAUGHN TAYLOR'S COMEBACK WIN WAS KICKSTARTED WITH A BIRDIE.

ANNC: And that might be huge, a four at 14. A rare one.

IT WAS A ONE SHOT VICTORY DEFINED BY A TWO SHOT SWING. WE SAID WINNERS RECORD BIRDIE OR BETTER MORE THAN 40% OF THE TIME. SOMETIMES BETTER IS WHAT THEY GIVE US. IN 2011, IT WAS D.A. POINTS.

ANNC: Aha, How about this? Absolutely spectacular three there for D.A. Points. His partner, there, Bill Murray.

THAT WAS A CINDERELLA STORY. LAST YEAR, IT WAS RORY'S TURN.

ANNC: It's looking good. It's an eagle for McIlroy.

MCILROY AND POINTS ARE THE ONLY WINNERS IN THE LAST 40 YEARS TO EAGLE 14 IN THE FINAL ROUND. AND PERHAPS NOT SO COINCIDENTALLY, THEY EACH WON BY TWO STROKES. OVERALL, 39 OF THE LAST 42 WINNERS HAVE PLAYED NUMBER 14 AT PAR OR BETTER FOR THE WEEK. AND THAT'S WHAT MAKES IT THE CHAMPIONS HOLE.
